QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected






### **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

10 172 000

The total number of persons employed decreased from *10 174 000* in Q1:2019



There was a quarterly decrease of **2 000** jobs (or 0,0%) in the Q2:2019 compared with Q1:2019.



Jobs increased by **141 000** (or 1,4%) in the reference quarter compared with the same quarter of 2018 (Q2:2018).








### **Q2:2019 EMPLOYMENT COMPOSITION**

### **PART TIME**

1,069M

Part-time employees are those permanent, temporary or casual employees who work less than 40 hours per week.



**FULL TIME** 

9,103M

Full-time employees are those permanent, temporary and casual employees who normally work 40 hours or more per week.







### **QUARTER-ON-QUARTER EMPLOYMENT CHANGE**

Manufacturing, business services, construction and electricity **lost** a combined total of **49 000** jobs. Community services and mining industries reported the **increase** of **44 000** and **3 000** jobs respectively.

Full-time jobs decreased by 26 000 while part-time jobs increased by 24 000.

### YEAR-ON-YEAR EMPLOYMENT CHANGE

Community services, Trade and Business services industries recorded the highest increases in employment year-on-year.

Construction, electricity and manufacturing industries **lost** a combined total of **35 000** jobs in Q2:2019 compared with Q2:2018.

Both full-time and part-time jobs increased by 90 000 and 51 000 year-on-year respectively.








### MINING AND QUARRYING INDUSTRY

The mining industry gained **3 000** jobs in second quarter of 2019. There was an annual decrease of **1 000** jobs from **459 000** in Q2:2018 to **458 000** in Q2:2019.











### MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY

The Manufacturing industry lost **15 000** jobs in the 2nd quarter of 2019. Year-on-year the industry lost **1 000** jobs in Q2:2019 compared with same quarter of 2018.

### TRADE INDUSTRY

The Trade industry *lost 10 000 jobs* in the 2nd quarter of 2019. Year-on-year the industry gained **58 000** jobs in Q2:2019 compared with same quarter of 2018.






### **COMMUNITY SERVICES INDUSTRY**

The community services industry reported an increase of 44 000 jobs in the second quarter.

Year-on-year the industry gained **74 000** jobs compared with same quarter of the previous year (Q2:2018).







### **Q2:2019 EMPLOYMENT TIME SERIES**

The number of jobs **increased by approximately 900 000** from 9,3 million in the second quarter of 2015 to 10,2 million in the second quarter of 2019.

Total gross earnings paid in the quarter increased from R688,4 billion in Q1:2019 to R699,9 billion in Q2:2019.












# Q2:2019 GROSS EARNINGS COMPOSITION R699,9bn

### **QUARTER-ON-QUARTER CHANGE IN GROSS EARNINGS**

Gross earnings increased by R11,5 billion in the second quarter of 2019. Increases in gross earnings were due to increases in basic salaries payments by R15 billion while bonuses and overtime payments declined by R3,4 billion.

### YEAR-ON-YEAR CHANGE IN GROSS EARNINGS

Year-on-year gross earnings **increased** by **R45,4 billion**. Increases were due to basic salary payments made by **R39,9 billion** and bonus and overtime payments **increased** by **R5,5 billion**.








### PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN GROSS EARNINGS

### **Q2:2019 GROSS EARNINGS TIME SERIES**

Gross earnings **increased by R188 billion** from **R499,9 billion** in second quarter of 2015 to **R699,9 billion** in the second quarter of 2019. Gross earnings are steadily increasing since 2015.
















### **AVERAGE MONTHLY EARNINGS (AME)**

AME including bonuses and overtime payments increased in May 2019 from R20 859 (February 2019)

Quarter-on-quarter and year-on-year AME increased by 2,7% and 4,9% respectively.














### FEB 2019: AVERAGE MONTHLY EARNINGS

The **transport** industry reported the largest **increase of 6,7%** in average monthly earnings in the second quarter compared with first quarter of 2019.

Year-on-year the **electricity** industry is leading other industries and **rose by 8,7%**.

The **community** services and **construction** industries grew below the total average of **4,9%** in May 2019 compared with May 2018.
