




Background and concepts


- 1. The reference period (HEI financial year): 1 Jan 31 Dec 2015
- 2. Information obtained from audited / draft financial statements
- 3. Financials:
 - a. Receipts: (actual cash received, irrespective for which period):
 - * Grants from national government
 - * Tuition fees
 - * Donations
 - b. Payments: (actual cash paid, irrespective for which period):
 - * Compensation of employees
 - * Goods and services
 - * Capital expenditure
- 4. Scope:
 - * 26 HEIs (20 universities; 6 universities of technology)
 - * Excludes private institutions
- 5. <u>Time series</u>: Data for last 10 years (2006-2015)
- 6. <u>Unit data</u> available on request
- 7. Forms part of the consolidated government financials; adjusted from accrual to cash for consolidation purposes (see next slide)











Higher education student enrolment

Contribution of first-year students to 2015 enrolment




Proportion completing grade 12 after completing grade 9






Proportion completing bachelor's degree after completing grade 12

The alarming evidence points to regressive proportions in Bachelor's completion rates amongst Blacks






Student enrolment: 2015







Growth in student numbers: 2006–2015





HEIs receipts and payments (2015)






Payments (R54,1 billion)








Receipts (Rm)






Tuition fees received per HEI for the 2015 financial year (Rm)






Tuition fees as a percentage of HEI total income: 2015






Grants received per HEI in 2015 (Rm)






Main contributors to grants received by HEIs: 2011-2015 (Rm)






Grants from national government: 2006–2015 (Rm)






Donations to HEIs: 2015 (Rm)











Compensation of employees per HEI for 2015 (Rm)






HEIs purchases of goods and services: 2015 (Rm)





Bursaries per HEI for 2015 (Rm)










Capex per HEI for 2015 (Rm)





Statement of sources and uses of cash

Net cash flow from operating activities = $receipts^1 - payments^2 = A$

Net cash flow from investment in non-financial assets = $sales^1 - purchases^2 = B$

Surplus (net inflow) before net financing activities = A + B = C

Net cash flow from financing = borrowing¹ – purchases of financial assets² = D


Net change in the stock of cash = C + D

² outflow




Surplus (net inflow) before net financing activities [C]: 2015 (Rm)





Net change in the stock of cash (movement of bank balance during the year) (Rm)











Annual percentage change in tertiary education fees and headline CPI

Closing remarks

- 1. The <u>number of students enrolled</u> in higher education grew by 32,8% from 2006 to 2015
- 2. First-year students constitute 17,5% of total HEI student intake in 2015. This percentage indicates challenges within the system
- 3. <u>Grants by national government</u> to HEIs increased by 144% over the ten-year period 2006 to 2015
- 4. <u>Salaries comprise</u> about 58% of total current HEI expenditure over the ten-year period 2006 to 2015
- 5. On average, <u>income from tuition fees increased</u> by 12,7% p.a. over the tenyear period 2006 to 2015
- 6. <u>Annual rise in tuition fees for tertiary education (CPI) in 2015 was 9,8%. In 2016 is was 0%. In 2017 it has been set to no more than 8%</u>
- 7. This publication only reports on the <u>cash transactions of HEIs</u>, adapted from the annual statements provided by the respondents
