PREFACE

Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) has undertaken an annual non-financial census of municipalities covering 284 municipalities with effect from 2002. The purpose of the census is to measure the level of development and performance of municipalities. The results of the census provide information that can serve as a framework to stakeholders and policy-makers for planning and monitoring. It allows national and provincial governments to analyse the actual services provided by municipalities in terms of water, electricity, solid waste management and sewerage and sanitation. The 2003 non-financial census of municipalities obtained information regarding:

- ◆ Particulars of total employment in the municipalities as at 30 June 2003.
- ◆ Demographic and social information as at 30 June 2003.
- ◆ Particulars of services provided between 1 July 2002 and 30 June 2003.

This statistical release contains the preliminary results of the 2003 non-financial census of municipalities and the revised figures for 2002. In the event of revised figures being obtained for 2003, they will be incorporated into the 2004 non-financial census of municipalities (if applicable).

Introduction

Background

Statistics South Africa conducted the first non-financial census of municipalities for the year ended 30 June 2002. A discussion document was produced and made available in December 2003. As a result of the proposals and recommendations made by both internal and external stakeholders, the results of non-financial municipal data for the financial year ended June 2003 is now published as a statistical release.

This publication of the non-financial municipal data will assist in monitoring the progress made with regard to the implementation of service provision, free basic services and poverty alleviation as national priorities.

Purpose of the survey

The purpose of the non-financial census of municipalities is to provide baseline non-financial information from those institutions classified as municipalities in terms of the Local Government Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No. 117 of 1998).

The results of this census will be used to provide information that can serve as a framework to stakeholders and policy-makers for planning, as well as monitoring and evaluating the performance of municipalities. It will also allow national and provincial government and other stakeholders to analyse the actual services provided by municipalities.

Questionnaire and data collection

The questionnaire for 2003 was amended from that used for 2002, taking into consideration stakeholders needs. The methods used for collection were personal visits, telephone calls, facsimiles, emails and post. Data is then generally comparable for both 2002 and 2003 publication.

Methodology

Sampling

No sampling was done. All municipalities were covered by the census.

Projections of number of households

If the number of households reported by a municipality was taken from Census 2001 data, then this number was projected to June 2003 by Stats SA. The 2001 data were stratified by province and three demographic categories: gender, five-year age group and population group. The growth rates and projected figure between Census '96 and Census 2001 were calculated. For each province the total number of males and females, and the total number in each five-year age group were calculated. These totals were used as marginal totals for benchmarking the Census 2001 data.

Weighting

A two-stage weighting procedure was done that resulted in two sets of weights, household weights and person weights. The person weights are used for estimating the number of persons per household. The total estimated number of persons in 2003 was benchmarked to the marginal totals and benchmarked weights were used to estimate the number of persons and households per municipality and the number of persons per household.

Limitations of the survey

- This publication is not necessarily comparable with data from the population census of 2001 and Stats SA household surveys. This is partly because the data source for this publication is municipalities, and partly because of the different uses of the term 'household'. Most municipalities do not have a system for identifying multiple households served by one billing unit or delivery point.
- The electricity information in this publication does not include electricity provided by Eskom directly to households.



Key findings on selected variables for the year ended 30 June 2003

The number of households* receiving basic services from municipalities increased between 30 June 2002 and 30 June 2003. The largest increase in the provision of services was in water (1 499 381 households or 23,6 %), followed by sewerage and sanitation (1 166 523 households or 22,3%), solid waste management (1 106 445 households or 19,9%) and electricity (244 028 households or 6,3%).

Table A shows that on 30 June 2003 there were an estimated 241 494 positions in the municipalities in South Africa, of which 82,6% were occupied by full-time employees, 4,0% were occupied by part-time employees and 15,8% were vacant. Mpumalanga was the province with the highest percentage of full-time employees (88,8%), followed by KwaZulu-Natal (88,5%) and Western Cape (88,2%). The province with the lowest percentage of full-time employees was Gauteng (74,9%).

The province with the highest proportion of part-time employees was KwaZulu-Natal (8,1%), followed by Western Cape (7,9%) and Mpumalanga (4,2%). North West and Gauteng reflected the lowest proportion of part-time employees (1,3%).

The province with the highest proportion of vacant posts was Gauteng (23,9%), followed by Free State (19,2%) and Western Cape (16,5%). The province with the lowest proportion of vacant positions was KwaZulu-Natal (3,5%).

There was an increase of 13,8% in the overall number of positions between 30 June 2003 and 30 June 2002 in South Africa.

There were an estimated 5 640 managerial positions in municipalities in South Africa, which have been categorised according to section 57 of the Local Government Municipal Systems Act 2000 and the organisational organogram of individual municipalities. There were 4 523 full-time managers and 131 part-time managers, while 986 posts were vacant. Western Cape was the province with the highest percentage of full-time managers (90,6%), followed by Northern Cape (88,3%) and KwaZulu-Natal (87,3%). Limpopo had the lowest number of full-time managers (63,7%).

The province with the highest proportion of part-time managers was Eastern Cape (10,0%), followed by Western Cape (4,6%) and KwaZulu-Natal (2,3%). Northern Cape, Free State and Mpumalanga had no part-time managers.

Limpopo reported the highest proportion of vacant posts (34,1%), followed by Free State (28,8%). The province with the lowest number of vacant positions was Western Cape (4,8%).

There was an increase of 33,5% in the overall number of managerial positions between 30 June 2003 and 30 June 2003.

Table C shows that there were an estimated 7,8 million households in South Africa receiving water from municipalities as at 30 June 2003. This represents an increase of 23,6% between 30 June 2002 and 30 June 2003.

The province with the highest increase between 2002 and 2003 was Limpopo (64,1%), followed by Gauteng (37,2%) and North West (34,0%). The province with the lowest increase was Western Cape with 3,6%, followed by Northern Cape (7,4%) and Free State (12,2%).

This table shows what proportion of households were benefiting from the free basic water policy. Of the 7,8 million households receiving water from municipalities in South Africa, 5,9 million (75,7%) had access to free basic water. Free State shows the highest proportion (91,5%) followed by North West (85,5%) and Gauteng (81,3%). Western Cape shows the lowest proportion (58,0%).

The 5,9 million households receiving free basic water from municipalities in 2003, as compared with 4,2 million households in 2002, represents an increase of 41,7%.

Table E shows that there were an estimated 4,1 million households in South Africa receiving electricity from municipalities as at 30 June 2003. This represents an increase of 6.3% between 30 June 2002 and 30 June 2003.

The province with the highest increase was Limpopo (27,4%), followed by Mpumalanga (21,9%) and North West (21,6%). The province with the lowest increase of households receiving electricity service from municipalities was Gauteng with 0,9%, followed by Western Cape (2,0%) and KwaZulu Natal (5,2%).

This table shows what proportion of households receiving electricity from municipalities were benefiting from the free basic electricity policy. Of the 4,1 million households receiving electricity from municipalities in South Africa as at 30 June 2003, 57,3% had access to free basic electricity. Free State showed the highest proportion (90,3%), followed by Gauteng (84,8%) and Western Cape (64,5%). The province with the lowest proportion was KwaZulu-Natal (4,1%).

The 2,4 million households receiving free basic electricity from municipalities in 2003, as compared with 1,6 million households in 2002, represents an increase of 48,7%.

Table G shows that there were an estimated 6,4 million households in South Africa receiving sewerage and sanitation services from municipalities as at 30 June 2003. This represents an increase of 22,3% between 30 June 2002 and 30 June 2003.

The province with the highest increase was Limpopo (65,7%), followed by North West (33,7%) and Gauteng (32,4%). The province with the lowest increase was Northern Cape with 13,1%, followed by Free State (13,5%) and KwaZulu Natal and Western Cape (13,6%).

Explanatory notes

Introduction

- 1 This publication contains results of the annual non-financial census of municipalities for the year ended 30 June 2003. The survey is designed to obtain information regarding:
 - Particulars of total employment in the municipalities as at 30 June 2003.
 - Demographic and social information as at 30 June 2003.
 - Particulars of services provided between 1 July 2002 and 30 June 2003.

Scope of the survey

2 This survey covers non-financial information of all 284 municipalities.

Classification

3 The Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), the Fifth Edition, January 1993, was used to classify the statistical units (municipalities) in the census. The SIC is based on the 1990 International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC), with suitable adaptations for local conditions.

Statistical unit

4 The statistical unit for the collection of information is the municipality.

Reporting unit

5 Data were reported at district and metropolitan municipality level. (Data for local municipality is included in district municipality.)

Survey methodology and design

The information is collected annually from 284 municipalities administered through questionnaires by means of post, email and facsimile.

Reliability of estimates

Inaccuracies may occur because of imperfections in reporting by municipalities. Every effort is made to reduce errors to minimum by carefully designing the questionnaire, undertaking pilot studies/ workshops and editing the data.

9 The 2003 non-financial census of municipalities is generally comparable with 2002 non-financial census of municipalities.

Revision of data

10 Information is preliminary, and may be revised. The revised figures are due to respondents reporting revisions. Estimations made in 2002 for non-response have been revised on information provided by respondents.

Glossary

District municipality District municipality means a municipality that has municipal executive and legislative authority in an area that includes more than one

municipality, and which is described in section 155(1) of the Constitution as a category C municipality (Refer to The Local Government:

Municipal Structures Act 1998, (Act No.117 of 1998)).

Employees are those people employed by the individual/enterprise/business/organisation who received payment (in salaries, wages

commission, piece rates or payments in kind) for any part of the reference period (excluding independent contractors and employers).

Formal dwelling A structure built according to approved architectural plans and intended for human habitation. This includes houses, flats and rooms.

Full-time employees are those employees (permanent, temporary or casual) who normally work the agreed hours for a full employee in a

specific occupation. If agreed hours do not apply, employees are regarded as full-time if they normally work 35 hours per week, including

seasonal employees.

Free basic electricity

An amount of electricity determined by government that should be provided free to poor households to meet basic needs, currently set at

50kWh per month per household.

Free basic water

An amount of water determined by government that should be provided free to poor households to meet basic needs, currently set at 6kl

per month per household.

Household (a) A group of persons who live together and provide themselves jointly with food or other essentials for living, or a single person who lives

alone. (b) A billing unit or delivery point. (Both definitions were specified in the questionnaire.) Given the different meanings of household, users are advice to use caution when comparing this publication with other Stats SA publications that report data at the household level

(for example, the General Household Survey and the Labour Force Survey).

Informal dwelling A makeshift structure not erected according to approved architectural plans. Include shacks or shanties in informal settlements or in

backyards.

Infrastructure Physical structures used for the delivery of services (e.g. power lines, pipes, roads and assets such as trucks and equipment to unblock

sewerage, pay point offices and computers).

Integrated Development Plan Is a process by which municipalities prepare 5-year strategic plans that is reviewed annually in consultation with communities and

stakeholders.

Local Economic Development Is an approach towards economic development which allows and encourages local people to work together to achieve sustainable

economic growth and development thereby bringing economic benefits and improved quality of life for all residents in a local municipal

area.

Local municipality Local municipality that shares municipal executive and legislative authority in its area with a district municipality

within whose area it falls and is described in section 155(1) of the Constitution as a category B municipality. (Refer to The Local

Government: Municipal Structures Act 1998, (Act No.117 of 1998)).

Managerial position For the purpose of this survey, managerial positions refer to section 57 managers, according to the Local Government Municipal System

Act, 2000 (Act No. 1187 of 20 Nov 2000) and other managers according to the organogram.

Metropolitan municipality Metropolitan municipality that has exclusive executive and legislative authority in its area, and which is described in

section 155(1) of the Constitution as a category A municipality. (Refer to The Local Government: Municipal Structure Act 1998, (Act

No.117 of 1998)).

Municipality Municipality Municipality is a generic term describing the "unit" of government in the local spheres responsible for local government in a geographically

demarcated area and includes district, local and metropolitan municipalities. A municipality is an institution consisting of a municipal council

(elected political representatives) and the municipal administration (appointed officials).

Part-time employees Part time employees are employees (permanent, temporary or casual) who are not full-time employees as defined above or who normally

work less than 35 hours per week, including seasonal employees.

Traditional dwelling Traditional dwelling is a dwelling made of clay, mud, reeds or other locally available materials. This is a general term that includes huts,

rondavels, etc. Such dwellings can be found as single units or in clusters.

Water Service Development Plan The WSDP is a sectoral plan that falls within the inter-sectoral umbrella plan of the IDP.
