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#### PREFACE

Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) has undertaken an annual Non-financial census of municipalities covering 284 municipalities with effect from 2002. The purpose of the census is to measure the level of development and performance of municipalities. The results of the census provide information that can serve as a framework to stakeholders and policy-makers for planning and monitoring. It allows national and provincial governments to analyse the actual services provided by municipalities in terms of water, electricity, sewerage and sanitation and solid waste management. The 2005 Non-financial census of municipalities obtained information regarding:

- ◆ Particulars of services provided between 1 July 2004 and 30 June 2005.
- ◆ Particulars of total employment in the municipalities as at 30 June 2005.

This statistical release contains the preliminary results of the 2005 Non-financial census of municipalities and the revised figures for 2004. In the event of revised figures being obtained for 2005, they will be incorporated into the 2006 Non-financial census of municipalities (if applicable). All results are presented at district municipality level; however, the detailed information by each responded is available upon request.

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#### Introduction

#### **Background**

Statistics South Africa conducted the first non-financial census of municipalities for the year ended 30 June 2002. A discussion document was produced and made available in December 2003. As a result of the proposals and recommendations made by both internal and external stakeholders, the results of the non-financial municipal data for the financial year ended June 2003 was published as a statistical release in March 2005. The results of the financial year ending June 2004 was also published as a statistical release in November 2005.

#### Purpose of the survey

This publication of the non-financial municipal data will:

- Assist in monitoring the progress made with regard to the implementation of service provision, free basic services and poverty alleviation as national priorities.
- Provide baseline non-financial information from those institutions classified as municipalities in terms of the Local Government Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No. 117 of 1998).
- Provide information that can serve as a framework to stakeholders and policy-makers for planning, as well as monitoring and evaluating the performance of municipalities.
- Allow national and provincial governments and other stakeholders to analyse the actual services provided by municipalities.
- Be used by research organisations and individuals for research.

#### Questionnaire and data collection

The 2005 questionnaire was amended from that used for 2004, taking into consideration stakeholder needs. As in 2004, the methods used for collection were personal visits, telephone calls, facsimiles, emails and post. Data is then generally comparable for both the revised 2004 and 2005 publications.

#### Methodology

#### Sampling

No sampling was done. All 284 municipalities responded and were covered in the census.

#### Supplementary data

This publication includes data from other service providers.

#### Limitations of the survey

- This publication is not necessarily comparable with the Stats SA population census of 2001 and household survey data, partly because the data source is municipalities as opposed to households, and partly because of the different definitions of 'household'. Most municipalities do not have a system for identifying multiple households served by one billing unit or delivery point.
- Consumer unit refers to an entity to which the service is (or would be) delivered, and which receives one bill if the service is billed, alternatively known as a delivery point and is therefore not comparable with other Stats SA surveys on households.



#### Key findings on selected variables for the year ended 30 June 2005

Figure A: Number of consumer units receiving basic services from municipalities in South Africa over the period 2003 to 2005

The number of consumer units receiving basic services from municipalities increased between 30 June 2003\*, 2004\* and 2005. The largest increase from 2004 to 2005 in the

provision of services was in solid waste management (19,3%), followed by sewerage and sanitation (16,3%), water (14,8%) and electricity (14,7%).




Figure B: Number of consumer units still using the bucket toilet system in each province

Over the period 2003 to 2005, all nine provinces displayed a decline in the use of the bucket toilet system. Mpumalanga, KwaZulu-Natal and Western Cape provinces showed the highest reduction in the number of consumer units using the bucket toilet system.

Free State and Eastern Cape showed the lowest shifts in the use of the bucket toilet system, which explains the prevalence of the highest number of buckets in these provinces.

Figure C: Distribution of councillors in municipalities by gender for the financial year ended 2005




Figure C above, shows that there were 8 425 councillors in South Africa, out of which only 33% (2 800) are females.

Figure D: Councillors per province for the financial year ended 2005




Figure D shows the distribution of councillors in all provinces in South Africa. The province with the highest number of councilors is KwaZulu-Natal (23,0%), followed by Eastern Cape (17,0%) and Limpopo (14,0%). Northern Cape has the lowest number of councillors.

Figure E: Number of managers in municipalities by gender for the financial year 2005




Figure F: Managers per province for the financial year 2005




Figure E shows the proportion of managers by gender. Municipalities reported 5 383 managerial positions of which 77% (4 139) are occupied by males and 23% (1 244) occupied by females.

Figure F shows the distribution of part-time and full-time managers. The province with the highest number of managers is Gauteng (38,0%) followed by KwaZulu-Natal (14,0%) and Western Cape (11,0%).

Table A shows that there were an estimated 9,9 million consumer units in South Africa receiving water from municipalities as at 30 June 2005. This represents an increase of 14,8% between 30 June 2004 and 30 June 2005.

The province with the highest increase was Mpumalanga (29,9%), followed by Limpopo (28,1%), and North West (24,2%). The provinces with the lowest increase were Gauteng and Free State (2,8%) and Northern Cape (5,9%).

This table shows the proportion of consumer units that benefited from the free basic water policy. Of the 9,9 million consumer units receiving water from municipalities in South Africa, 6,8 million (69,0%) had access to free basic water services. Gauteng shows the highest proportion (93,7%) followed by Western Cape (91,9%) and Mpumalanga (64,7%). The province with the lowest proportion is North West (48,1%).

There were 6,8 million consumer units receiving free basic water from municipalities in 2005 as compared with 6,6 million consumer units in 2004. The decrease in the number of consumer units receiving free basic services is mainly due to the change in the mechanism used by municipalities to roll out such services, from broad based to either self-targeting, technical or geographical mechanisms.

Table C shows that there were an estimated 6,8 million consumer units in South Africa receiving electricity from municipalities as at 30 June 2005. This represents an increase of 14,7% between 30 June 2004 and 30 June 2005.

The province with the highest increase was Free State (35,7%), followed by North West (24,8%) and Northern Cape (24,2%). The province with the lowest increase of consumer units receiving electricity services was Gauteng (5,8%), followed by KwaZulu-Natal (8,0%) and Mpumalanga (9,5%).

Table D shows the proportion of consumer units that benefited from the free basic electricity policy. Of the 6,8 million consumer units receiving electricity from municipalities in South Africa, 3,5 million (51,6%) had access to free basic electricity. Gauteng shows the highest proportion (89,7%), followed by Free State (72,5%) and Western Cape (47,1%). KwaZulu-Natal shows the lowest proportion

(14,1%). There were 3,5 million consumer units receiving free basic electricity in 2005, compared with the 3,3 million consumer units in 2004. The decrease in the number of consumer units receiving free basic services is mainly due to the change in the mechanism used by municipalities to roll out such services, from broad based to either self-targeting, technical or geographical mechanisms.

Table E shows that there were an estimated 8,3 million consumer units in South Africa receiving sewerage and sanitation services as at 30 June 2005. This represents an increase of 16,3% between 30 June 2004 and 30 June 2005.

The province with the highest increase was KwaZulu-Natal (36,5%), followed by North West (30,0%) and Limpopo (27,3%). The province with the lowest increase was Northern Cape with (6,3%), followed by Free State (6,9%) and Gauteng (7,4%).

Table F shows the proportion of consumer units receiving free sewerage and sanitation from municipalities. Of the 8,3 million consumer units receiving sewerage and sanitation from municipalities in South Africa, 4,2 million (50,5%) had access to free basic sewerage and sanitation. Gauteng showed the highest proportion (87,2%), followed by Western Cape (81,8%) and Eastern Cape (44,2%).

The province with lowest proportion was KwaZulu-Natal (14,5%). The decrease in the number of consumer units receiving free basic services is mainly due to the change in the mechanism used by municipalities to roll out such services, from broad based to either self-targeting, technical or geographical mechanisms.

Table G shows that there were an estimated 7,0 million consumer units in South Africa receiving solid waste management services as at 30 June 2005. This represents an increase of 19,3% between 30 June 2004 and 30 June 2005.

The province with the highest increase was Limpopo (37,2%), followed by KwaZulu-Natal (30,7%) and North West (27,1%). The province with the lowest increase was Western Cape (7,5%), followed by Northern Cape (8,5%) and Gauteng and Mpumalanga (19,2%).

Table H shows the proportions of consumer units receiving free solid waste management services from municipalities. Of the 7,0 million consumer units receiving solid waste management in South Africa as at 30 June 2005, 3,7 million (53,2%) had access to free basic solid waste management.

Gauteng shows the highest proportion (95,2%), followed by Western Cape (46,3%) and North West (38,6%). The provinces with the lowest proportions were Limpopo and KwaZulu-Natal (19,1%). The decrease in the number of consumer units receiving free basic services is mainly due to the change in the mechanism used by municipalities to roll out such services, from broad based to either self-targeting, technical or geographical mechanisms.

Of the 2,9 million households identified as indigent, 64,1% receive water, 38,1% receive electricity, 44,0% receive sewerage and sanitation and 42,3% receive solid waste management services in South Africa as at 30 June 2005.

- 1 This publication contains results of the annual non-financial census of municipalities for the year ended 30 June 2005. The survey is designed to obtain information regarding:
  - Particulars of services provided between 1 July 2004 and 30 June 2005.
  - Particulars of total employment in the municipalities as at 30 June 2005.

Scope of the survey

2 This survey covers non-financial information of all 284 municipalities.

Classification

3 The Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), the Fifth Edition, January 1993, was used to classify the statistical units (municipalities) in the census. The SIC is based on the 1990 International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC), with suitable adaptations for local conditions.

Statistical unit

4 The statistical unit for the collection of information is the municipality.

Reporting unit

5 Data were reported at district and metropolitan municipality level. (Data for local municipality is included in district municipality.)

Survey methodology and design

6 The information is collected annually from 284 municipalities administered through questionnaires by means of post, email and facsimile.

Reliability of estimates

Inaccuracies may occur because of imperfections in reporting by municipalities. Every effort is made to reduce errors to minimum by carefully designing the questionnaire, undertaking pilot studies/ workshops and editing the data.

Supplementary data

11 The 2005 non-financial data includes data from other service providers. This includes electricity information from Eskom and Centlec, and water information from Botshelo Water, Magalies Water, Lepelle Water, DWAF, uThukela Water, uMgeni water, Rand water and Odi Rand Retail.

Glossary

**Broad based approach** Approaches whereby everyone receives free basic services on the current billing system of the municipality.

Consumer unit An entity to which the service is (or would be) delivered, and which receives one bill if the service is billed, alternatively known as a delivery

point. (This concept is often referred to as a household by municipalities, but this is not strictly correct, as households and consumer units do not coincide one to one, particularly in blocks of flats, on stands where there are multiple households in the same dwelling or in

additional dwellings, such as garden flats, backyard rooms, etc. and in the case of public taps.)

District municipality District municipality means a municipality that has municipal executive and legislative authority in an area that includes more than one

municipality, and which is described in section 155(1) of the Constitution as a category C municipality. (Refer to Local Government:

Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No.117 of 1998)).

**Employees** Employees are those people employed by the individual/enterprise/business/organization who received payment (in salaries, wages

commission, piece rates or payments in kind) for any part of the reference period (excluding independent contractors and employers).

Full-time employees Full-time employees are those employees (permanent, temporary or casual) who normally work the agreed hours for a full-time employee

in a specific occupation. If agreed hours do not apply, employees are regarded as full-time if they normally work 35 hours per week,

including seasonal employees.

Free basic electricity

An amount of electricity determined by government that should be provided free to poor households to meet basic needs, currently set at

50kWh per month per household.

Free basic water

An amount of water determined by government that should be provided free to poor households to meet basic needs, currently set at 6kl

per month per household within 200 meters from each dwelling.

Geographical targeting

The process whereby consumers living in a particular area assumed to have the same socio-economic profile and therefore tariffs can be

set on location.

Household (a) A group of persons who live together and provide themselves jointly with food or other essentials for living, or a single person who lives

alone. (b) A billing unit or delivery point. (Both definitions were specified in the questionnaire.) Given the different meanings of household, users are advised to use caution when comparing this publication with other Stats SA publications that report data at the household level

(for example, the General Household Survey and the Labour Force Survey).

**Infrastructure** Physical structures used for the delivery of services (e.g. power lines, pipes, roads and assets such as trucks and equipment to unblock

sewerage, pay point offices and computers).

Integrated Development Plan

Is a process by which municipalities prepare 5-year strategic plans that is reviewed annually in consultation with communities and

stakeholders.

Local municipality Local municipality means a municipality that shares municipal executive and legislative authority in its area with a district municipality

within whose area it falls, and which is described in section 155(1) of the Constitution as a category B municipality. (Refer to Local

Government: Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No.117 of 1998)).

Managerial position For the purpose of this survey, managerial positions refer to section 57 managers, according to the Local Government Municipal System

Act, 2000 (Act No. 1187 of 20 Nov 2000) and other managers according to the organogram.

Metropolitan municipality Metropolitan municipality means a municipality that has exclusive executive and legislative authority in its area, and which is described in

section 155(1) of the Constitution as a category A municipality. (Refer to Local Government: Municipal Structure Act 1998, (Act No.117 of

1998)).

Municipality Municipality is a generic term describing the "unit" of government in the local spheres responsible for local government in a geographically

demarcated area and includes district, local and metropolitan municipalities. A municipality is an institution consisting of a municipal council

(elected political representatives) and the municipal administration (appointed officials).

Part-time employees Part time employees are employees (permanent, temporary or casual) who are not full-time employees as defined above or who normally

work less than 35 hours per week, including seasonal employees.

**Self-targeting approach**A system whereby only indigent households receive the benefits of the free basic services programme as mutually determined by the

Service Provider and Service Authority.

Water Service Development Plan The WSDP is a sectoral plan that falls within the inter-sectoral umbrella plan of the IDP.
