CSS MAKES COMPREHENSIVE PUBLICATION ON SOUTH AFRICAN LABOUR STATISTICS AVAILABLE

The CSS has just released the 1995 edition of **SOUTH AFRICAN LABOUR STATISTICS** - the tenth edition of this publication since 1986.

The report covers the following eight main areas:

A. Population statistics

Demographic data on the RSA

B. Employment and unemployment

Data on the economically active population (covering both workers and the unemployed) are provided, as well as particulars of, inter alia, employment and vacancies according to the manpower surveys, registered unemployment at the Department of Labour and employment according to skills level.

C. Education and training

Pupil, student andstaff numbers of the various formal educational sectors are provided, as well as data on training centres managed by employers. Data on the training of unemployed persons, which was initiated on 7 June 1985 by the Department of Labour, are also incorporated in the report.

D. Conditions of employment and social security

Statistics on, inter alia, the average salaries and wages of workers, the Unemployment Insurance Fund and Workmen's Compensation, and the Consumer Price Index are provided.

E. Labour relations

Statistics are provided on trade unions and employer's organisations, industrial councils, conciliation boards, strikes and cases referred to the Industrial Court.

F. International migration

Statistics on immigrants and emigrants are provided according to occupational groups.

G. Productivity

Productivity indices, indices of unit labour costs, the inflation rate and the gross domestic product per capita, as well as per worker, of a number of countries besides that of the RSA are published in the report.

H. Career services and placement

Statistics regarding the career services offered by the Department of Labour, as well as of private employment offices, among others, are incorporated in the report.

The information in **SOUTH AFRICAN LABOUR STATISTICS** therefore covers a wide range of both recent and historical data and is an excellent reference work for all those directly or indirectly involved in the labour field.
