






Small fry, big impact

It is often said that small businesses hold the key to economic growth. Recently released data paint an interesting picture of where small businesses are making a substantial contribution.

Notice in the chart how large businesses dominate turnover in the mining and utility industries? The utility industry in particular is dominated by a few large companies; think of how Eskom generates the bulk – to be more precise, 93% – of the nation's electricity to the national grid.

Small businesses, however, are playing the field pretty well in the business services, trade and construction industries.


Infographic of the month

Imagine a basket sitting in front you, filled with a range of food items. Imagine that these items represent what the average South African household buys.

If we measure the total price of this basket, it was 9,8% more expensive in March 2016 than it was in March 2015, according to the latest consumer price data.

Let's unpack the basket. Vegetables and fruit were both 18,7% more expensive, in particular tomatoes, pumpkins and bananas. Other food items that have had an impact on your food expenses in the last year have been oils & fats, bread & cereals, and sugar & desserts.

Provincial snapshot



With South Africa having experienced one of its worst droughts in recent history, the role of local municipalities to provide clean water and maintain infrastructure has become more important than ever.

In August 2015 Stats SA published data on staff vacancies in water management departments, highlighting the top 10 municipalities with the highest vacancy rates. The map on the right provides more detail with vacancy rates for all municipalities.

Municipalities in Free State seem to be struggling the most. The province recorded a vacancy rate of 24,4% in 2014. Of the 3 415 posts available in departments involved in water purification and water infrastructure, 833 were vacant.
