#### Purpose of the NCA COP

#### **Purpose**

The Community of Practice will support best practices by building capacity and momentum in Africa to mainstream

NCA into statistical production and policy in all African countries.

Networking and dialogue

Annual forums; newsletters; linking with other groups

Joint communication and advocacy

Mobilising resources for the Community of Practice; case studies on NCA in Africa; advocating for NCA and use in regional policy

Peer-to-peer exchange, coaching, and mentoring


South-south exchanges; joint trainings/workshop; linkages between national fora, committees, and workshops


Collective learning and co-generation of knowledge

Themed working groups; peer review; building up knowledge platform of resources in different languages

#### Structure & Governance

- **General membership:** anyone with an interest can sign up online
- Focal points: Nominees from countries, businesses and institutions
- Steering Committee: A set of key institutions and governments meeting quarterly to discuss the NCA COP
- M&E framework has been set up with baseline data collected through sign-up forms











# Affiliations/places of work for individual members of the NCA COP

Most of the members (260) work in government from statistics agencies and ministries while (179) members work with different International Organizations, civil society members (9), academia (18), and private sector (4).

 Strengthened capacity of governments to use NCA for decisionmaking



The CoP membership continues to grow and currently stands at 48 African Countries and 483 individual members The Africa NCA CoP secretariat facilitated and organized approximatively every month with a total of 14 webinars so far. Three capacity building training events have been conducted. Even if the response rate was low, a capacity need assessment has been conducted.

Through establishing four Technical Working Groups (TWG).

More than 5 new online exchange events of countries experiences have been organized

The COP has contributed to raise awareness of NC data, methods and tools and has played a catalytic role by cultivating interest into demand from countries for Technical Assistance to support the development and use of data for informing policy making

Operationalizing tools for sharing, networking, and communications (Telegram, Website, Newsletter)



### **Challenges Faced**



#### 01

#### COVID 19

Partner institutions could have committed more (in particular on south-south, e.g. UNSD exchanges between statistics organizations which could have generated additional opportunities). Networking has been hampered. With the pandemic, there has been no face-to-face activity during the first year.

#### Language barrier

All materials/trainings are prepared in English. Difficult to reach out to non-English speaking participants.

# Membership beyond GPS participating countries

Outreach strategy not clear on how to mobilize membership from countries with no active GPS activities. GDSA and other partners need to engage more members to join the CoP

## **04** Funding

Currently WB, through GPS is providing the financial resources for the CoP activities. Mobilization of funding from partners could have been more effective.

## **Moving Forward**

Closer coordination with partner institutions and the steering committee

Deepen engagement of country focal points

Design and delivery of routine activities: webinar, training sessions, communications

Strengthen South-South knowledge exchange events for countries

Preparation for the first Africa NCA Policy Forum

Develop a sustainability strategy, including identification of a new Secretariat and confirmation/ building of its capacity
