



Measurement framework for NCA is the System of Environmental-Economic Accounting (SEEA)

Adopted by the UN Statistical Commission in 2012














System of Environmental Economic Accounting

standard for development of economic statistics such as GDP










Snapshot of NCA in South Africa







Stats SA's mandate

 To coordinate the development of statistics, as laid out in the Statistics Act (Act No. 6 of 1999), including environmental statistics.

- There is opportunity for partners to contribute to the advancement of NCA and benefit from Stats SA's mandate as the:
 - National Statistical Authority, designating statistics as official, and liaising with other countries and statistical agencies.
 - National Statistical Coordinator, promoting coordination among producers of statistics, formulating quality criteria, establishing standards, classifications and procedures, providing statistical advice, advancing comparability and optimum use of official statistics.






Land and Terrestrial Ecosystem Accounts, 1990 to 2014: Released in December 2020


Challenges
