## Key findings for April 2014

### Final manufactured goods – headline PPI

The annual percentage change in the PPI for final manufactured goods was 8,8% in April 2014 (compared with 8,2% in March 2014). From March 2014 to April 2014 the PPI for final manufactured goods increased by 1,0%.


**Figure 1.2 - Contributions to the annual percentage change in PPI for final manufactured goods**

The main contributors to the annual rate of 8,8% were food products, beverages and tobacco products (8,3% year-on-year and contributing 3,1 percentage points), coke, petroleum, chemical, rubber and plastic products (10,8% year-on-year and contributing 1,8 percentage points), metals, machinery, equipment and computing equipment (7,9% year-on-year and contributing 1,2 percentage points) and transport equipment (11,1% year-on-year and contributing 1,1 percentage points) (see Figure 1.2).

The main contributors to the monthly increase of 1,0% were food products, beverages and tobacco products (1,0% month-on-month and contributing 0,4 of a percentage point) and transport equipment (1,8% month-on-month and contributing 0,2 of a percentage point) (see Figure 1.1).

### Intermediate manufactured goods

The annual percentage change in the PPI for intermediate manufactured goods was 10,2% in April 2014 (compared with 10,1% in March 2014). From March 2014 to April 2014 the PPI for intermediate manufactured goods increased by 0,4%.


**Figure 2.2 - Contributions to the annual percentage change in PPI for intermediate manufactured goods**

The main contributors to the annual rate of 10,2% were basic and fabricated metals (10,3% year-on-year and contributing 4,0 percentage points) and chemicals, rubber and plastic products (10,0% year-on-year and contributing 3,1 percentage points) (see Figure 2.2).

The main contributors to the monthly increase of 0,4% were textiles and leather goods (2,0% month-on-month and contributing 0,2 of a percentage point) and sawmilling and wood (1,4% month-on-month and contributing 0,2 of a percentage point) (see Figure 2.1).

### Electricity and water

The annual percentage change in the PPI for electricity and water was 10,4% in April 2014 (compared with 14,6% in March 2014). From March 2014 to April 2014 the PPI for electricity and water increased by 3,1%.


**Figure 3.2 - Contributions to the annual percentage change in PPI for electricity and water**

The contributors to the annual rate of 10,4% were electricity (10,9% year-on-year and contributing 9,0 percentage points) and water (7,8% year-on-year and contributing 1,4 percentage points) (see Figure 3.2).

The contributors to the monthly increase of 3,1% were electricity (3,2% month-on-month and contributing 2,6 percentage points) and water (2,5% month-on-month and contributing 0,4 of a percentage point) (see Figure 3.1).

### Mining

The annual percentage change in the PPI for mining was 6,6% in April 2014 (compared with 3,7% in March 2014). From March 2014 to April 2014 the PPI for mining decreased by 0,7%.


**Figure 4.2 - Contributions to the annual percentage change in PPI for mining**

The main contributors to the annual rate of 6,6% were non-ferrous metal ores (10,2% year-on-year and contributing 4,4 percentage points) and coal and gas (6,8% year-on-year and contributing 1,9 percentage points) (see Figure 4.2).

The main contributor to the monthly decrease of 0,7% was gold and other metal ores (-3,6% month-on-month and contributing -0,8 of a percentage point) (see Figure 4.1).

### Agriculture, forestry and fishing

The annual percentage change in the PPI for agriculture, forestry and fishing was 7,6% in April 2014 (compared with 11,7% in March 2014). From March 2014 to April 2014 the PPI for agriculture, forestry and fishing decreased by 3,6%.

The main contributor to the annual rate of 7,6% was agriculture (8,0% year-on-year and contributing 6,3 percentage points) (see Figure 5.2).

The main contributor to the monthly decrease of 3,6% was agriculture (-4,9% month-on-month and contributing -3,9 percentage points) (see Figure 5.1).





**Figure 1.1 - Contributions to the monthly percentage change in PPI for final manufactured goods**



**Figure 2.1 - Contributions to the monthly percentage change in PPI for intermediate manufactured goods**



**Figure 3.1 - Contributions to the monthly percentage change in PPI for electricity and water**



**Figure 4.1 - Contributions to the monthly percentage change in PPI for mining**



## Explanatory notes

<p><b>Purpose and results of the survey</b></p>	<p>The Producer Price Index (PPI) measures changes in the prices of locally produced commodities. A sample of producers is surveyed each month and the results of this survey are used to compile the producer price indices for final manufactured goods, intermediate manufactured goods, electricity and water, mining, and agriculture, forestry and fishing. The PPI can be used as an economic indicator of inflation, as an escalator in contracts and as a deflator in the calculation of the national accounts.</p> <p>Further information on the weighting structure, sources of information and methods of compilation of the PPI can be found in the PPI sources and methods document, available on the Stats SA website.</p>

## Glossary

<p><b>Producer Price Index</b></p>	<p>The PPI is defined as “<i>A measure of the change in the prices of goods either as they leave their place of production or as they enter the production process (OECD).</i>”</p>
<p><b>Contributions</b></p>	<p>The monthly (annual) contribution of a specific product or group of products to the specific PPI is calculated by multiplying the weight of this product or group of products with the difference of the current index and the previous month (year) index for this product or group of products, divided by the index for the specific index, for the previous month (year).</p>
<p><b>Annual inflation rate</b></p>	<p>The annual inflation rate per specific PPI is the change in the specific PPI for all items of the relevant month of the current year compared with the specific PPI for all items of the same month in the previous year expressed as a percentage.</p>
<p><b>Annual percentage change</b></p>	<p>The annual percentage change is the change in the index of the relevant month of the current year compared with the index of the same month in the previous year expressed as a percentage.</p>
<p><b>Average annual inflation rate</b></p>	<p>The average annual inflation rate is the change in the average specific PPI for all items of one year compared with the average specific PPI for all items of the previous year expressed as a percentage.</p>
<p><b>Average annual percentage change</b></p>	<p>The average annual percentage change is the change in the average index of one year compared with the average index of the previous year expressed as a percentage.</p>
<p><b>Monthly percentage change</b></p>	<p>The monthly percentage change is the change in the specific PPI of the relevant month compared with the specific PPI of the previous month expressed as a percentage.</p>
<p><b>Chain linking</b></p>	<p>The construction of a continuous price series by multiplying together price indices that have been using different weights reference periods. The resulting index is referred to as a chained index (Practical Guide to producing Consumer Price Indices; 2009). Linking is intended to ensure that the individual indices on all levels show the correct development through time, but leads to non-additivity (IMF,2005).</p>
