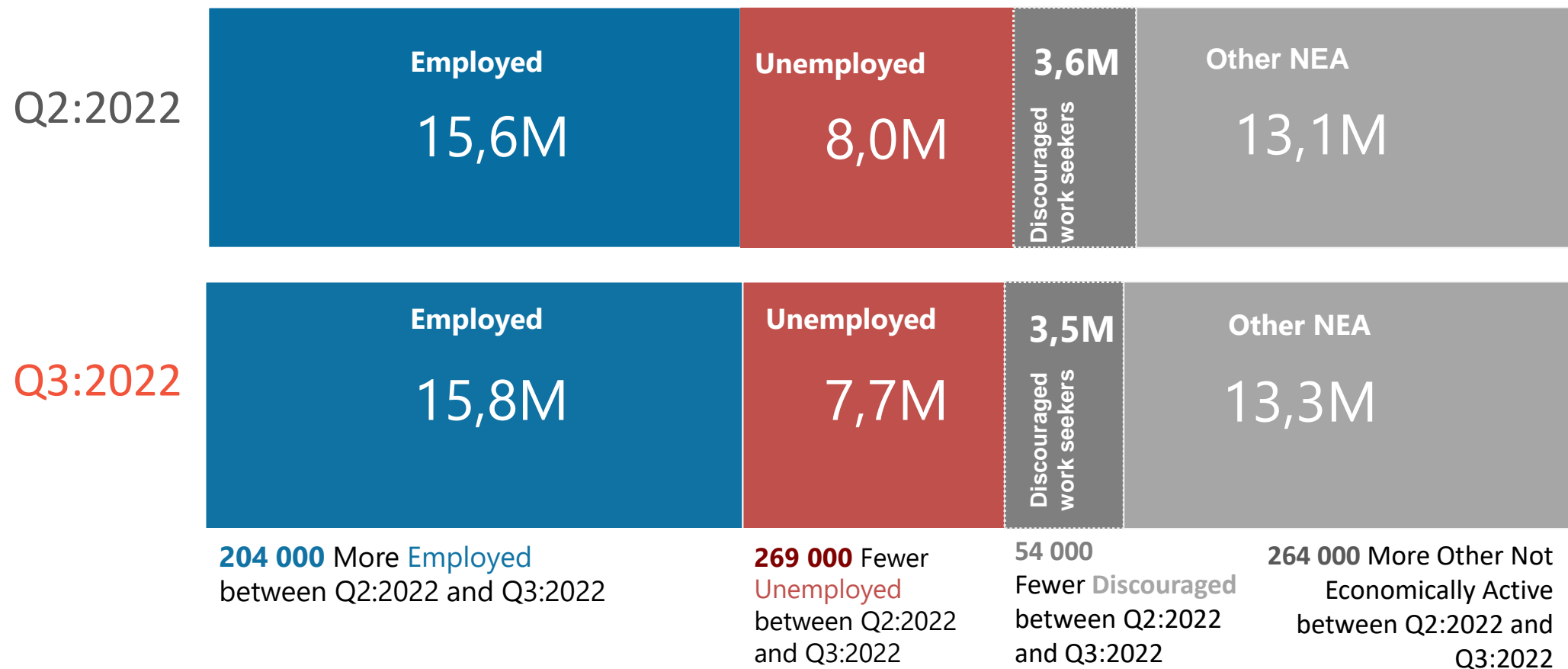

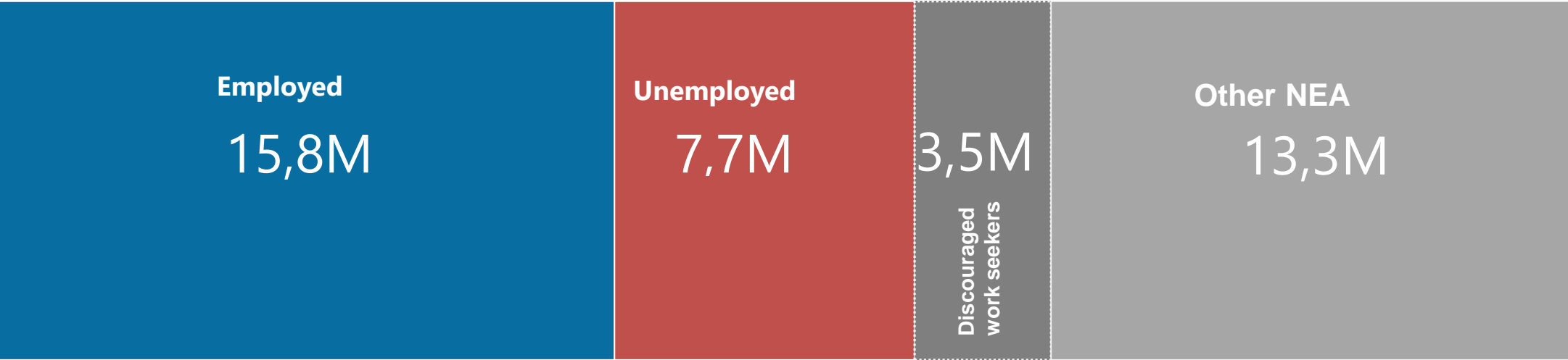

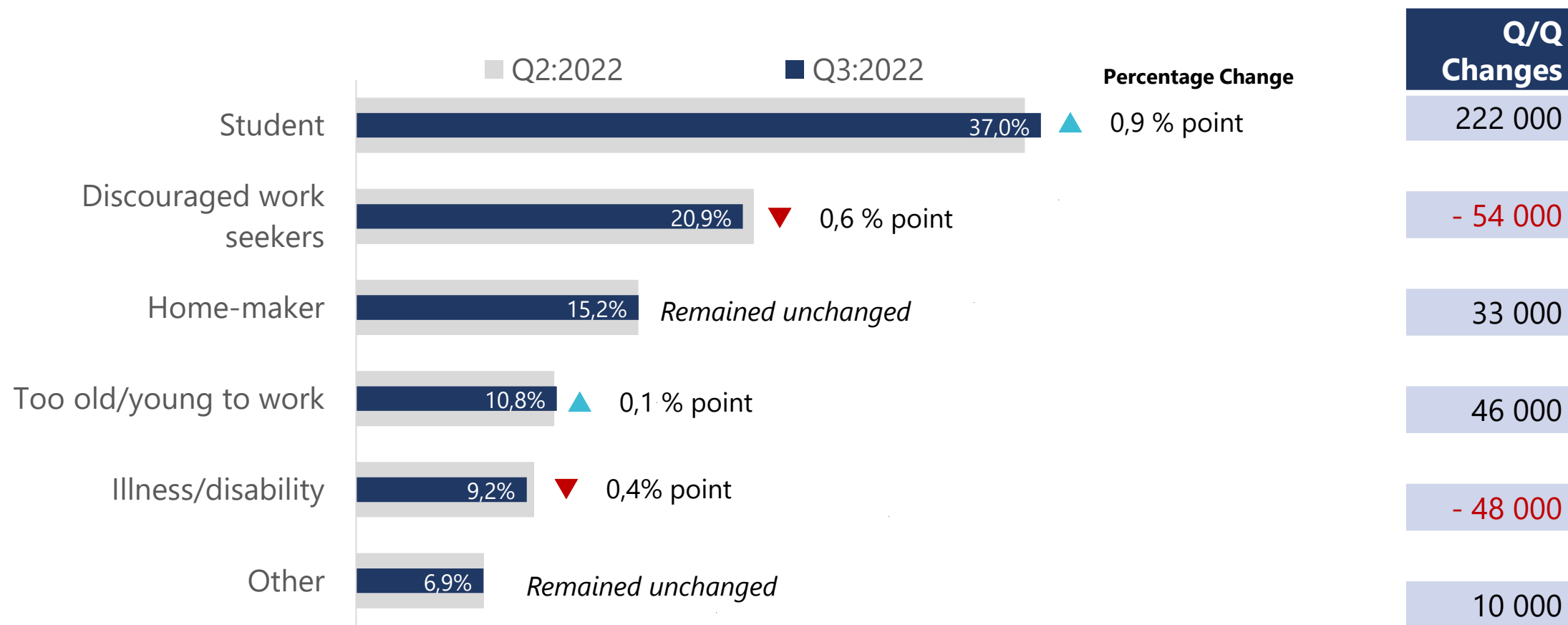
Decreased by 1,0 percentage point between Q2:2022 and Q3:2022

The number of **Not Economically Active** persons **increased by 210 000** in Q3:2022 compared to Q2:2022

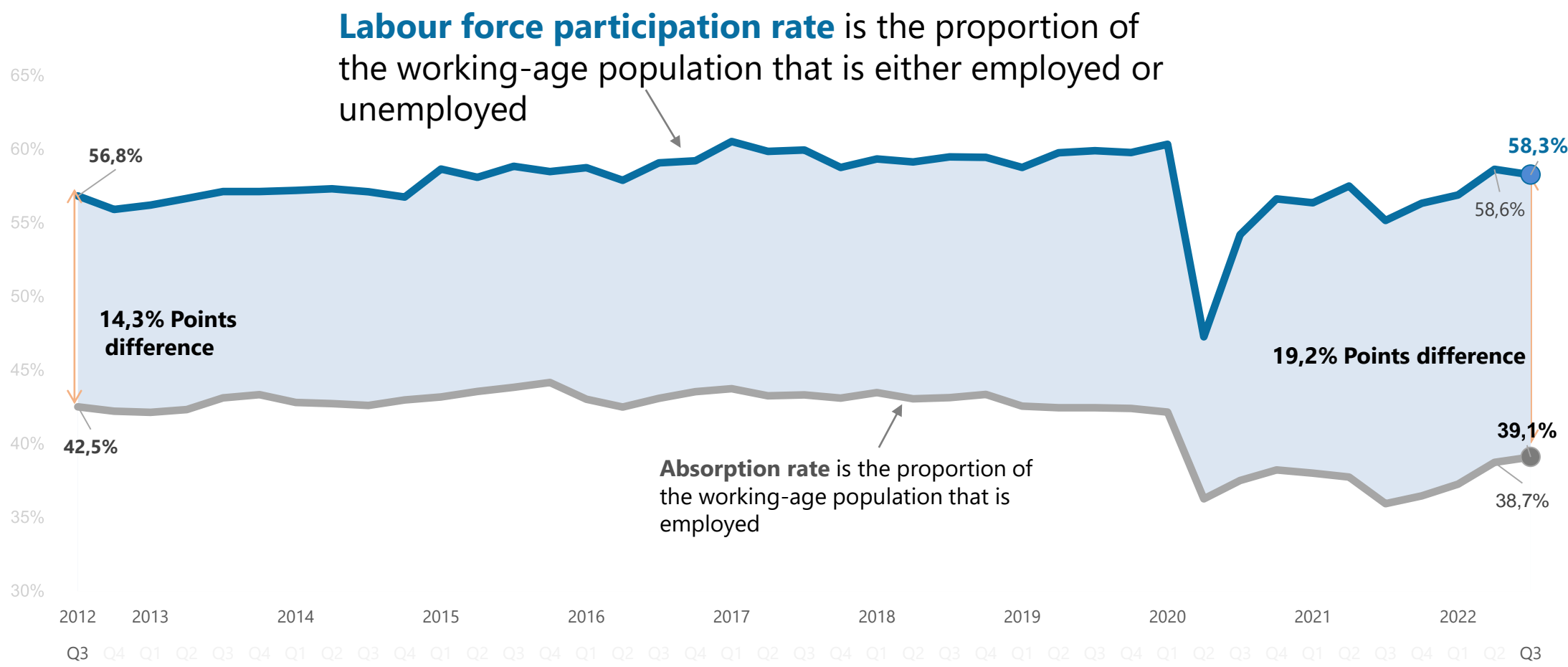
Characteristics of the not economically active, Q2:2022 vs Q3:2022

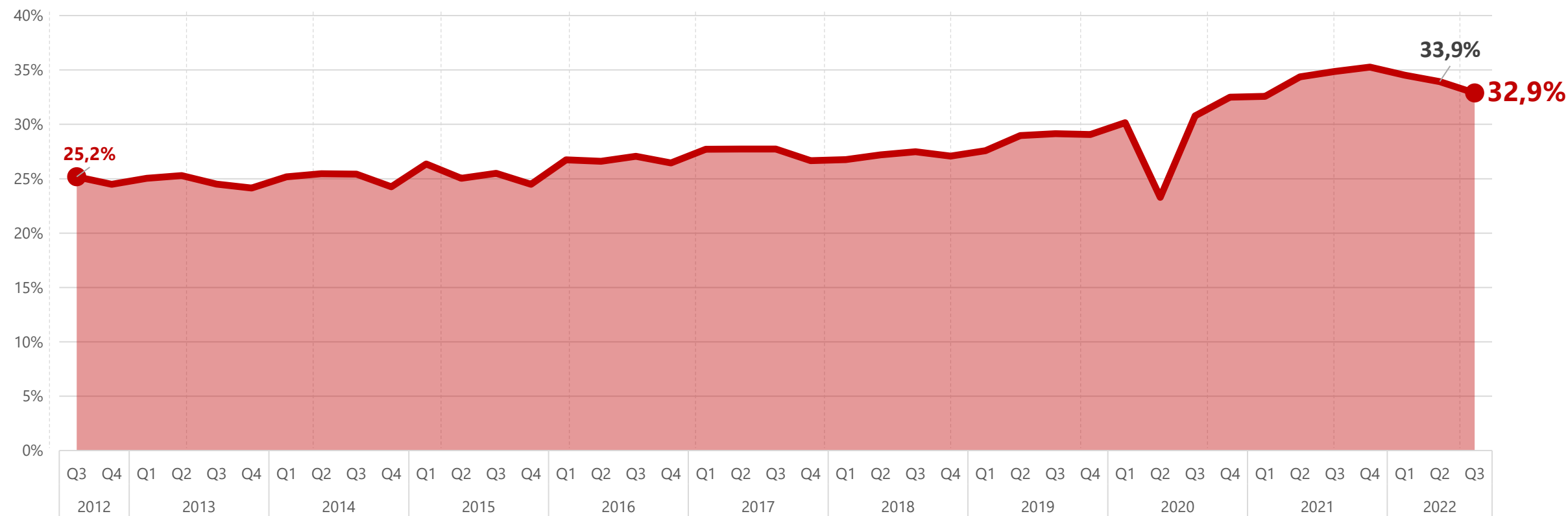
The **Labour force participation rate** decreased by 0,3 of a percentage point from 58,6% in Q2:2022 to 58,3% in Q3:2022

Labour force participation and absorption rates Q3:2012-Q3:2022



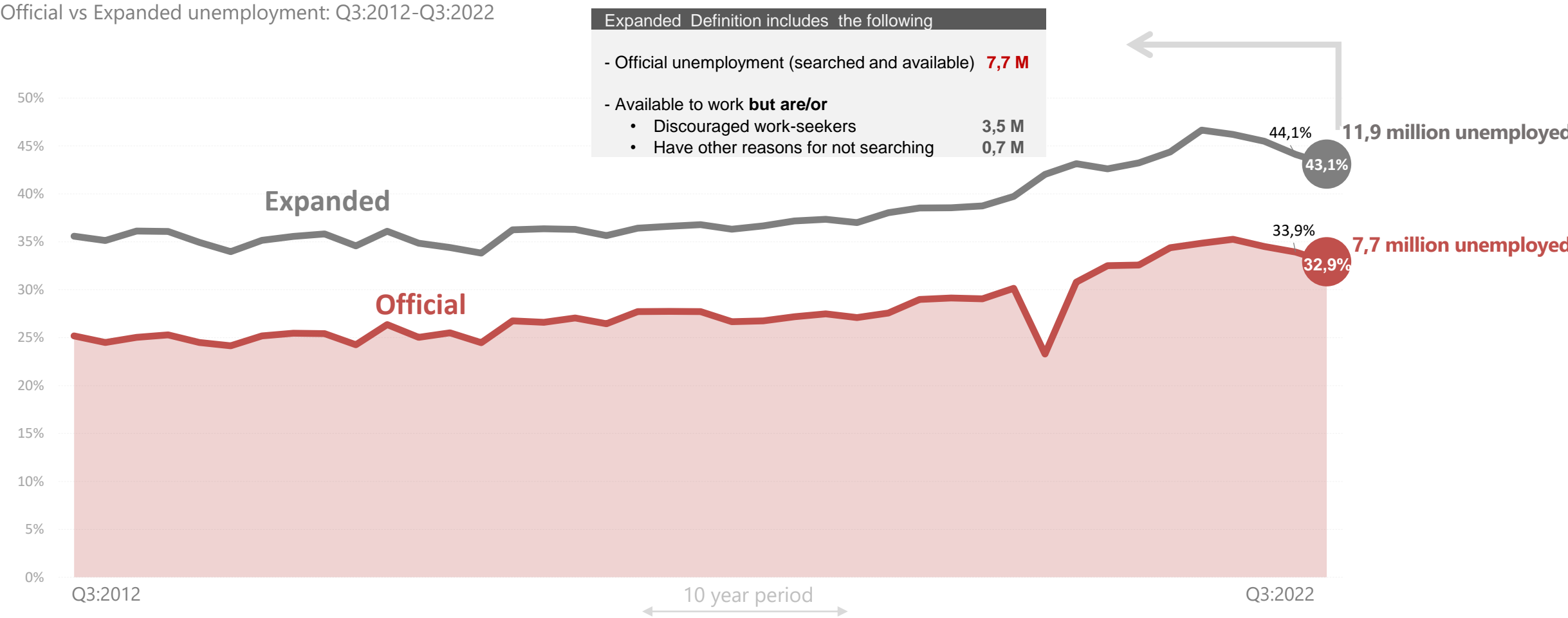
South Africa's **unemployment rate decreased** by **1,0** percentage point to **32,9%** in Q3:2022 compared to Q2:2022.

Unemployment rate trends: Q3:2012 to Q3:2022



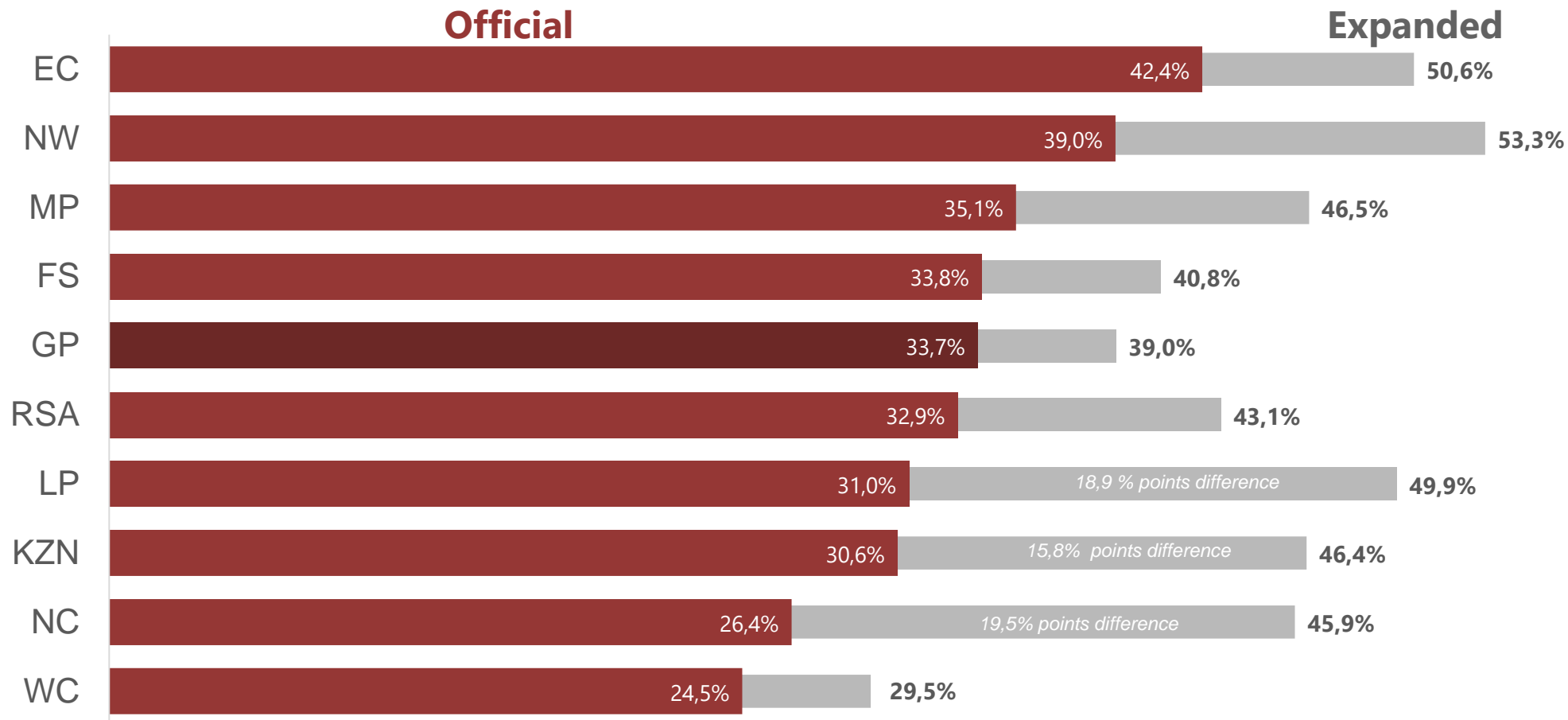
Expanded unemployment rate **decreased by 1,0** percentage point to **43,1%** in Q3:2022 compared to Q2:2022.

Official vs Expanded unemployment: Q3:2012-Q3:2022



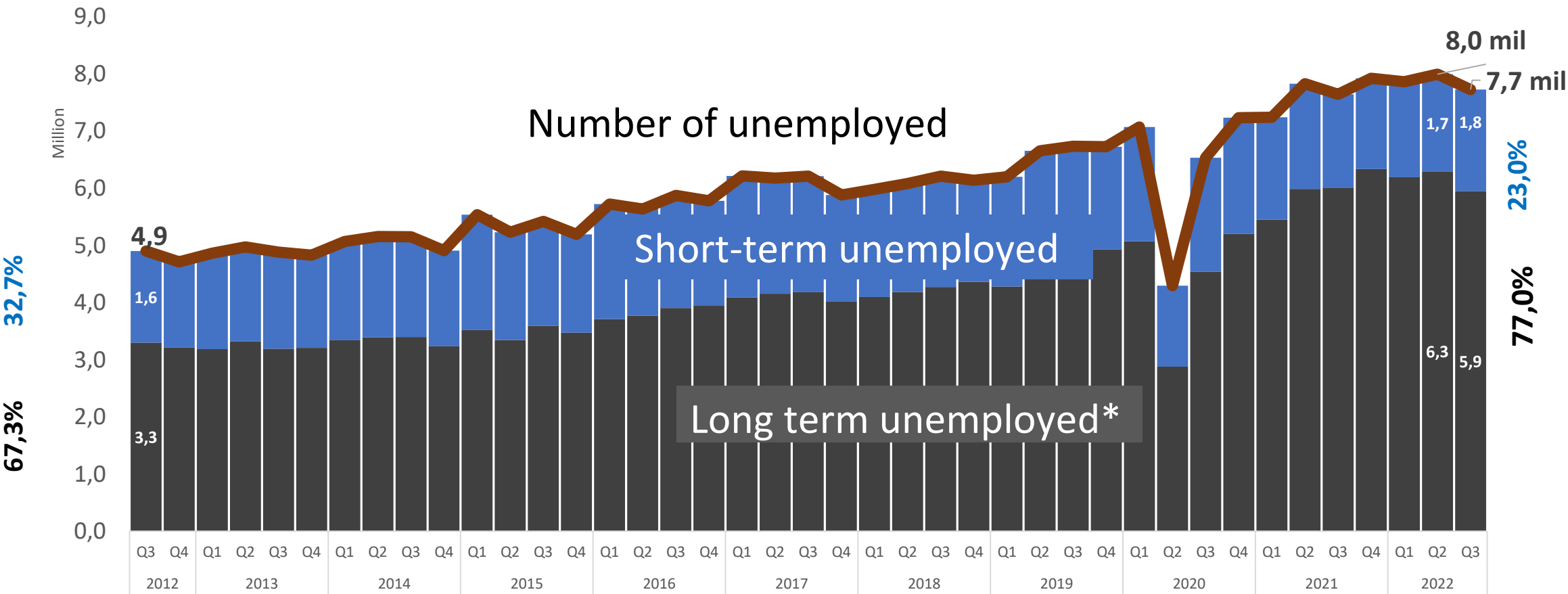
NW (53,3%) recorded the **highest expanded unemployment rate** in Q3:2022, followed by EC (50,6%).
NC, LP and KZN recorded more than 15 percentage points difference between expanded and official unemployment rates

Provincial unemployment rate: Official vs Expanded Q2:2022



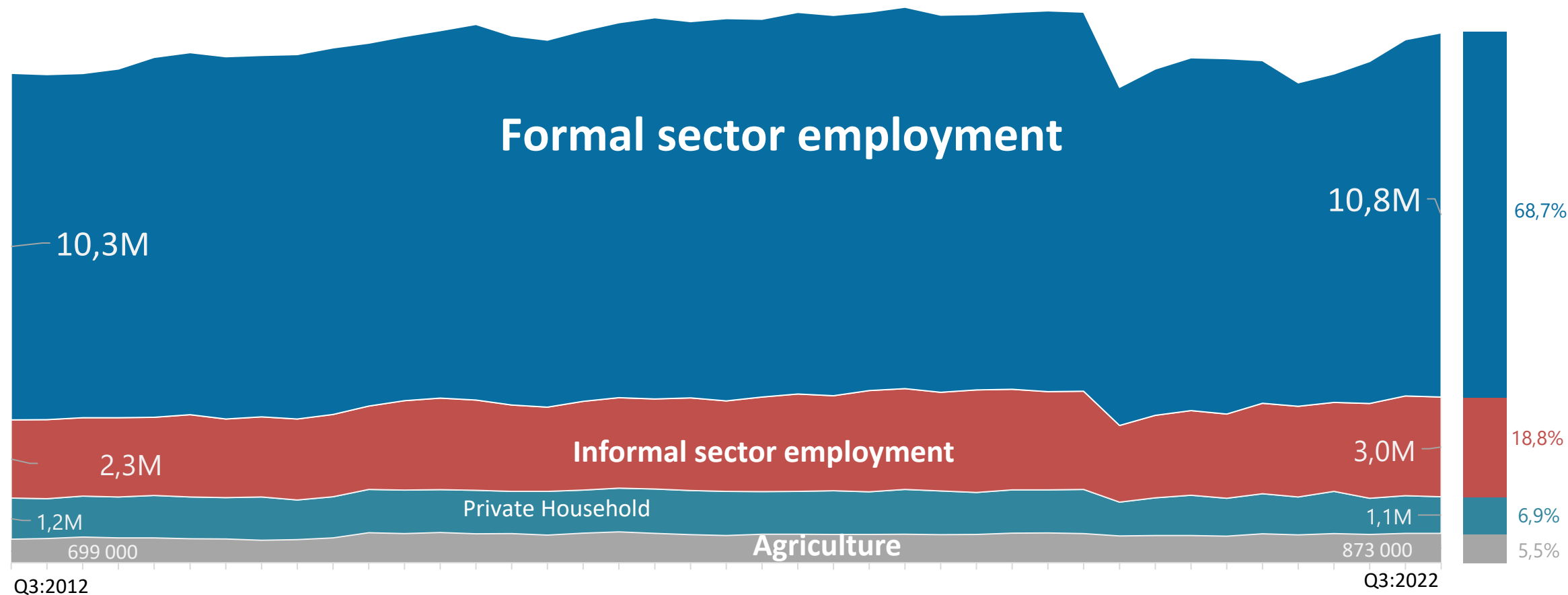
The number of unemployed people in South Africa increased from 4,9 million in Q3:2012 to 7,7 million in Q3:2022. The proportion of those in long-term unemployment increased from 67,3% in Q3:2012 to 77,0% in Q3:2022

*Long term unemployment –unemployed for a year or longer



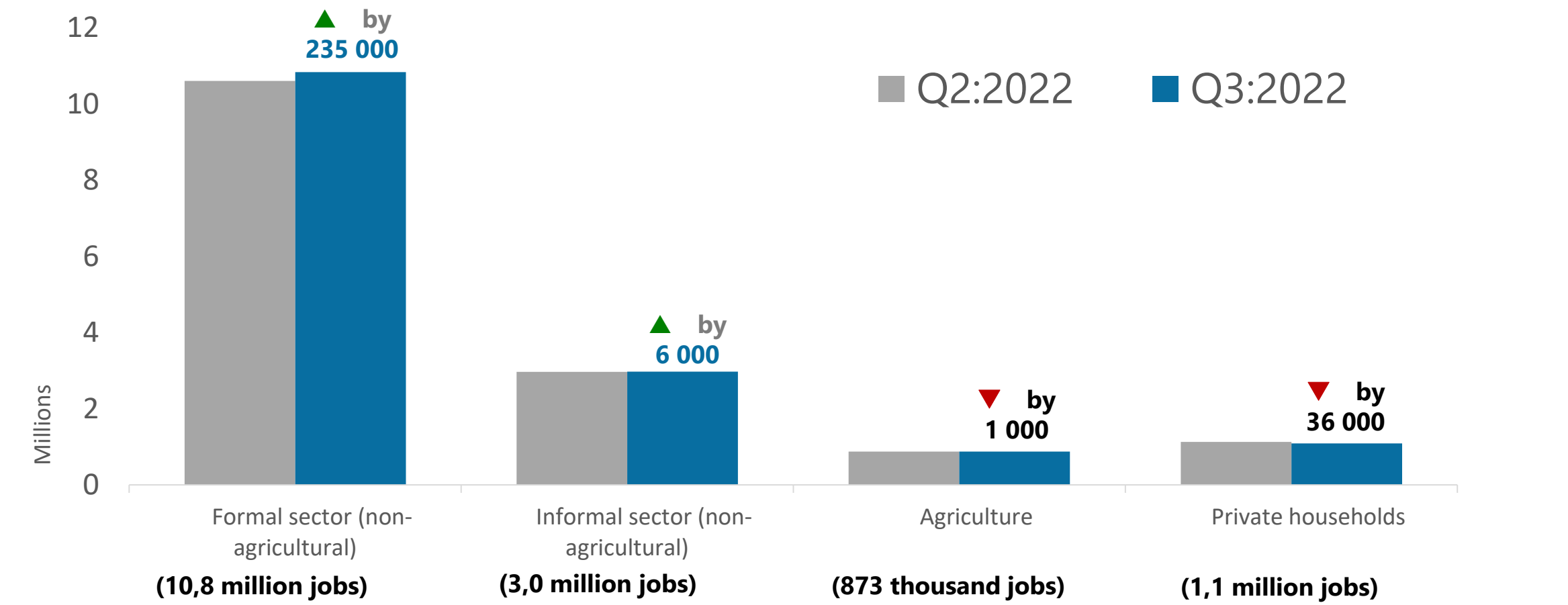
The **formal sector** in South Africa accounts for **68,7%** of total employment.

Employment share by sector, Q3:2012 to Q3:2022



Formal and Informal sector employment increased by **235 000** and **6 000** jobs respectively between Q2:2022 and Q3:2022.

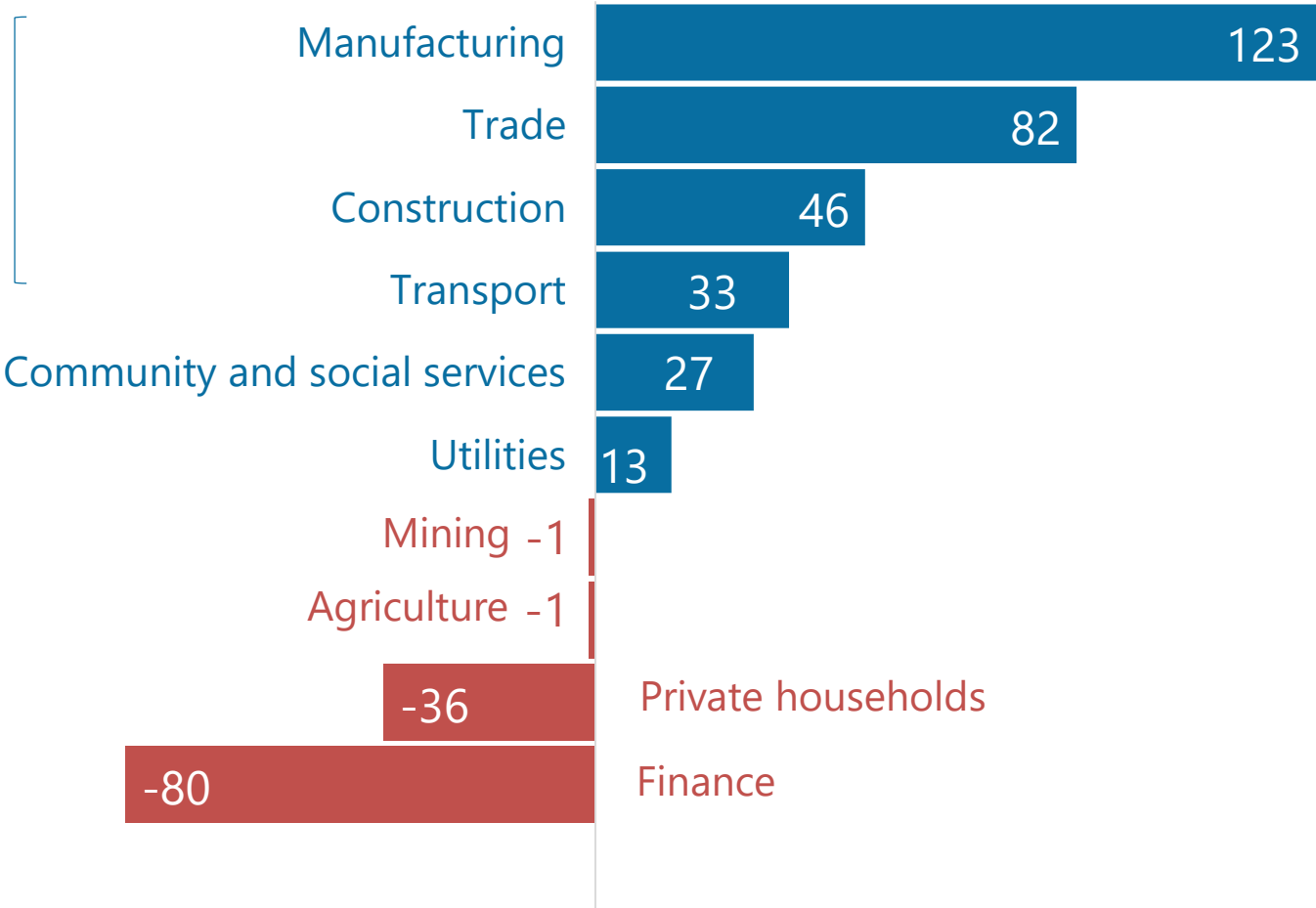
Employment changes by sector, (Quarter-on-quarter)

Employment changes by industry, **Quarter-on-quarter change** ('000)

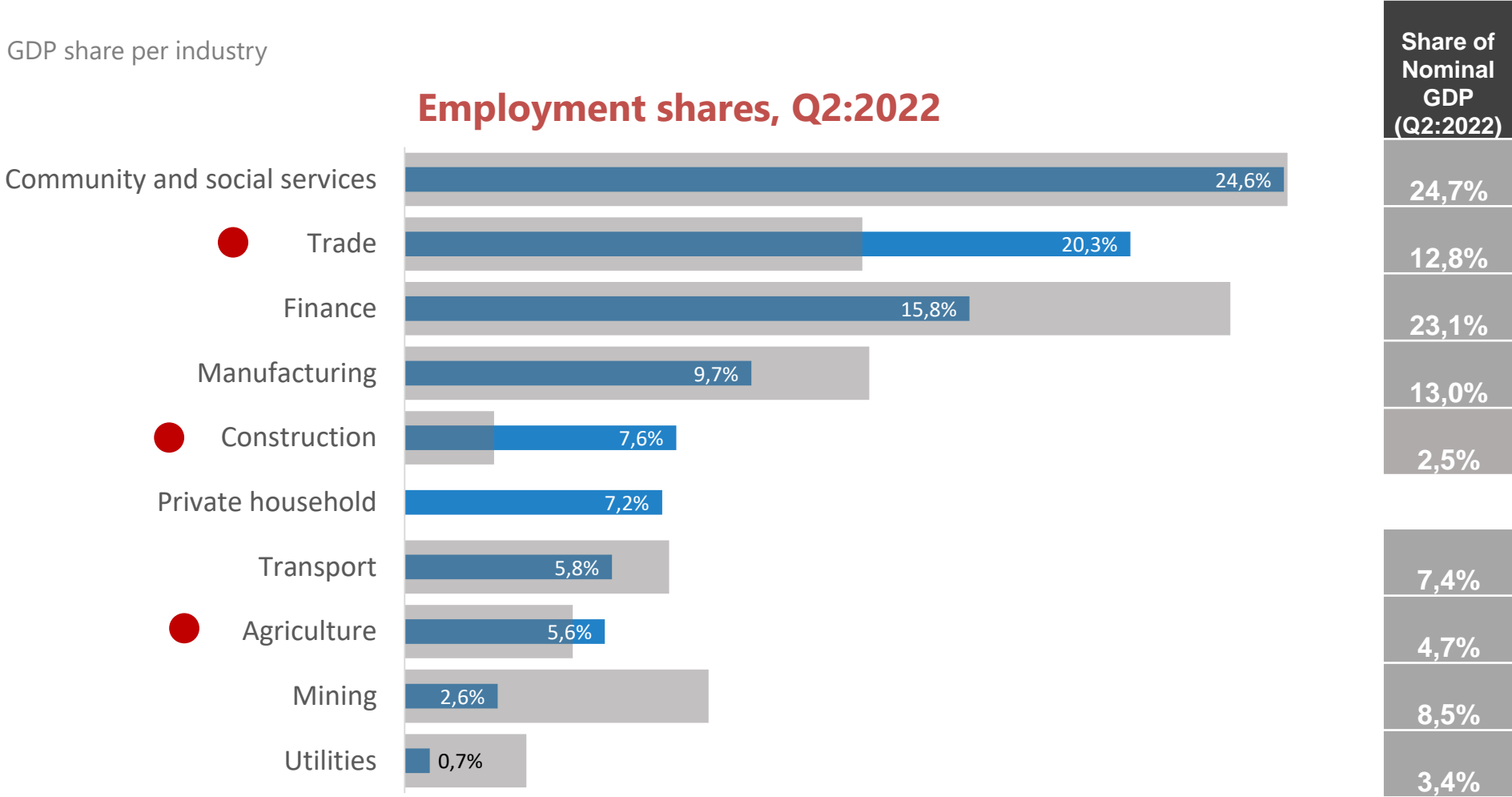
Increases in employment were mainly in **Manufacturing, Trade, Construction**

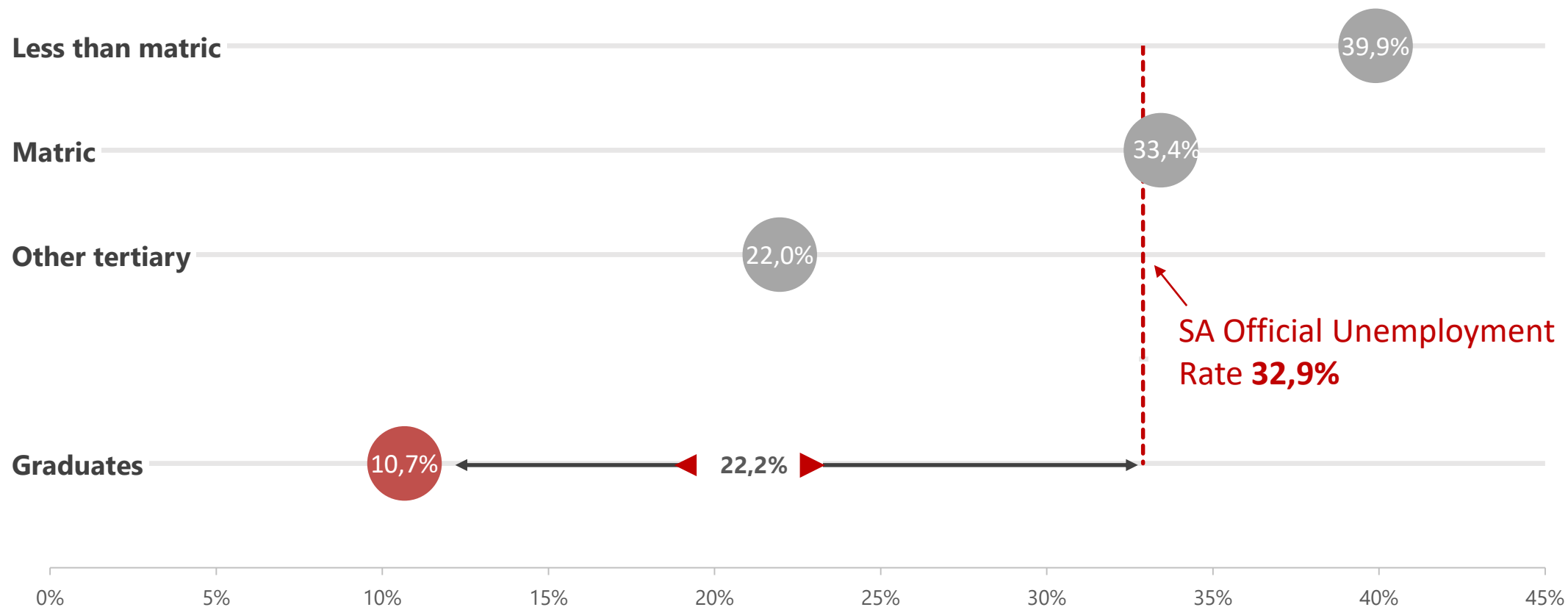
Trade, construction and agriculture have higher employment shares relative to their GDP contribution.

Graduate unemployment rate (10,7%) is 22,2 percentage points lower than the national official unemployment rate.

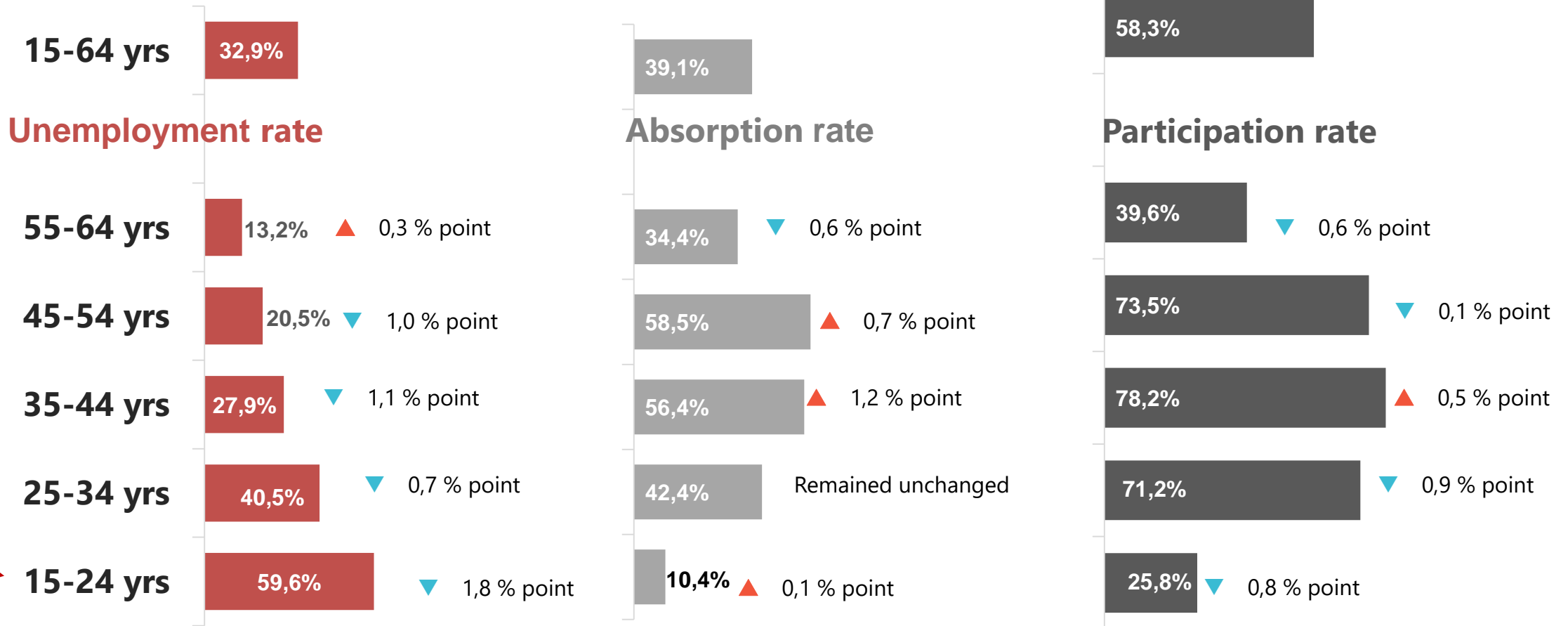
Official Unemployment rate Q3:2022



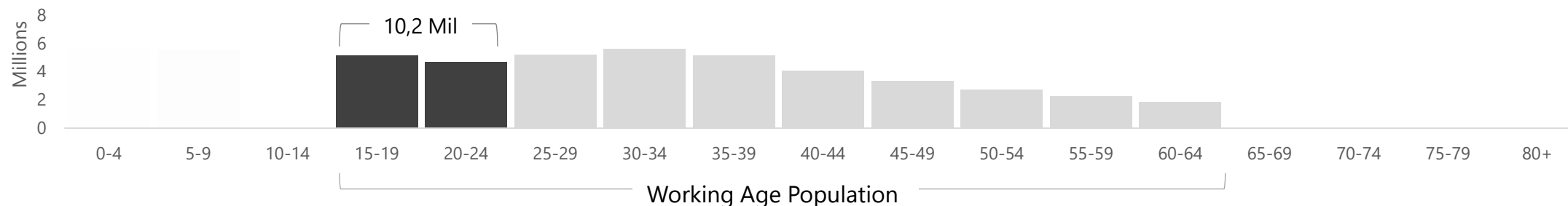
Youth aged 15-24 years and 25-34 years recorded the highest unemployment rates of 59,6% and 40,5% respectively.

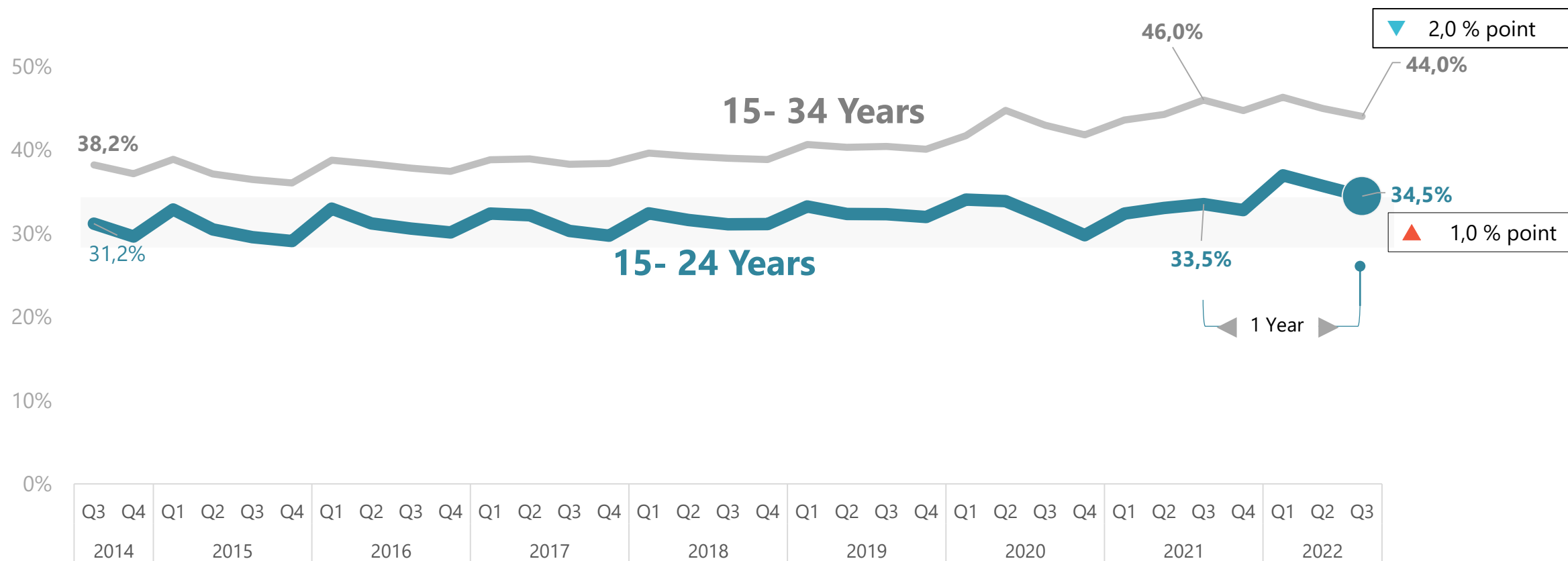

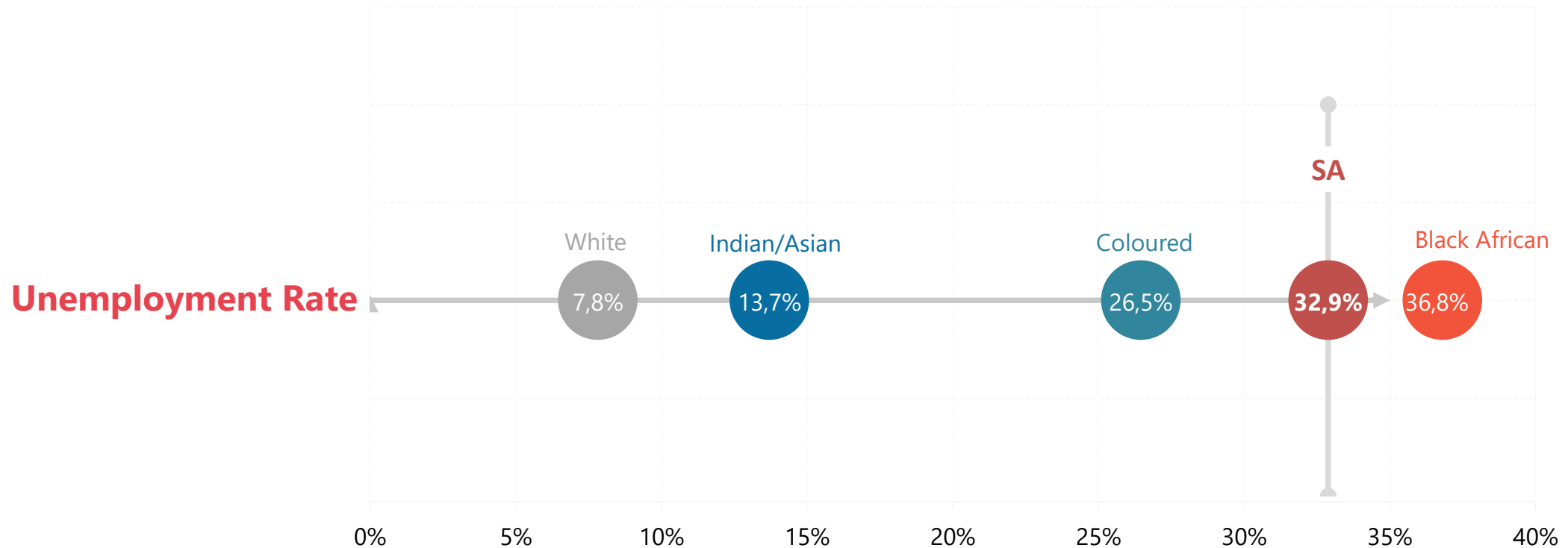
The overall NEET rate (15 – 24) increased by 1,0 percentage point in Q3:2022 compared to Q3:2021.

2014-2022 NEET rate for ages 15-24 & 15-34



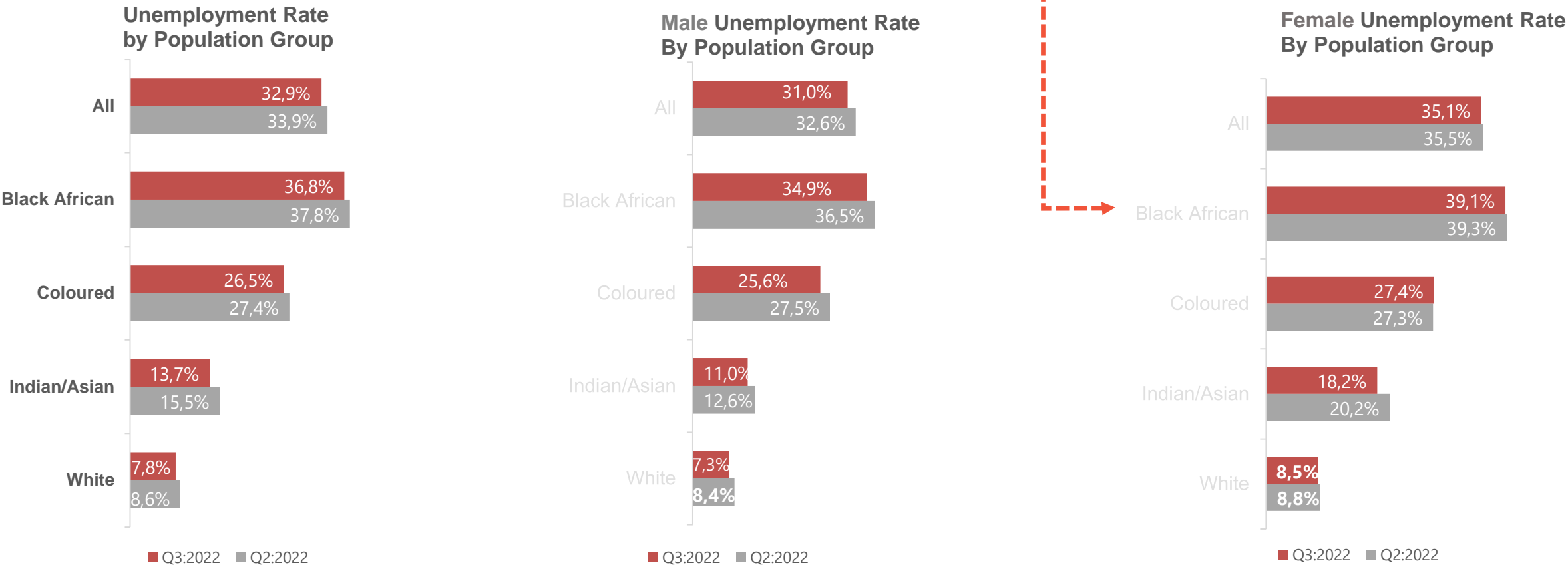
The unemployment rate among the **Black African (36,8%)** population group remains higher than the national average and other population groups.

OFFICIAL unemployment rate by population group, Q3:2022



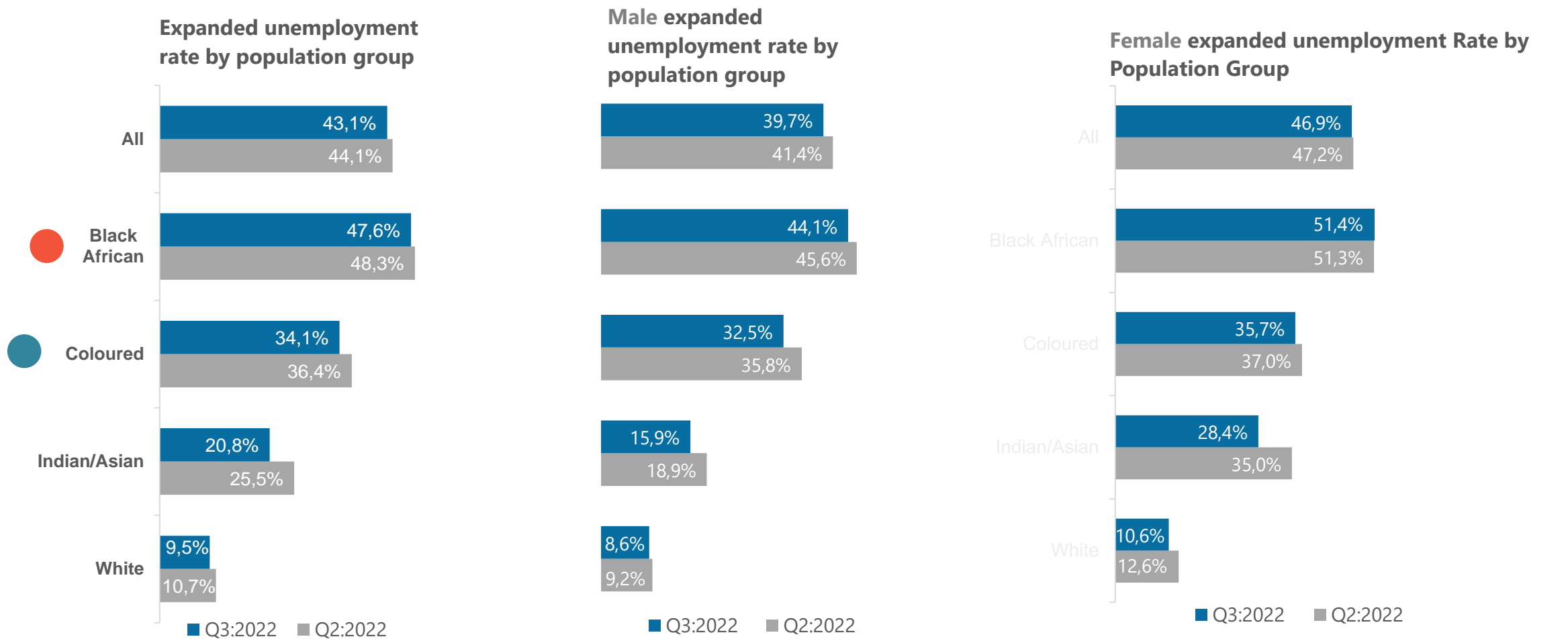
Black African women are the most vulnerable with an **unemployment rate of 39,1%** in Q3:2022. *This is 4,0 percentage points higher than the national average for women at 35,1%.*

Black African and Coloured population groups remain vulnerable in the labour market.

RECAP

(QLFS, Q3:2022)

- ❖ Unemployment rate **decreased** by 1,0 percentage point to 32,9%. The Absorption rate (39,1%) increased by 0,4 of a percentage point and labour force participation rate (58,3%) decreased by 0,3 of a percentage point.
- ❖ The number of those **unemployed** and those **discouraged** decreased by 269 000 and 54 000 respectively in Q3:2022 compared to Q2:2022. The not economically active increased by 264 000 in the same quarter.
- ❖ The largest **employment gains** were recorded in Manufacturing (123 000), Trade (82 000), Construction (46 000).
