





# **QES Background**

QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities


Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected

## **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

The number of employed persons decreased by **194 000** from **10 899 000** in Q3:2023, to **10 705 000** in Q4:2023.

There was a decrease of **194 000** jobs in fourth quarter 2023. This figure represents a decline of **-1,8%** when compared to the previous quarter.





Year-on-year there was an annual increase of **98 000** jobs (or 0,9%) in Q4:2023 compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year.






## **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

Full-time employment decreased from **9 498 000** in Q3:2023 to **9 493 000** in Q4:2023.

Part-time employment decreased from **1 401 000** in Q3:2023, down to **1 212 000** in Q4:2023.



There was a decrease of **5 000** full-time jobs quarter-on-quarter.

Year-on-year there were **12 000** full-time jobs that were added.

Part-time jobs decreased by **189 000** quarter-on-quarter and year-on-year there was an increase of **86 000** part-time jobs.





#### Quarter-on-quarter changes in employment

During Q4:2023, there was a net job decrease of **194 000**. Community Services reported a net **loss** of **214 000** jobs, primarily driven by decreases in both full-time and part-time employment. Trade, transport and electricity reported increases of **56 000**, **2 000** and **1 000** jobs, respectively.

#### **Year-on-year** changes in employment

There was a year-on-year net gain of **98 000** employees, driven primarily by increases in part-time employment with **86 000** jobs. Community services saw a substantial net gain of **80 000** jobs. Conversely, business services and construction industries reported a net loss of **28 000** and **16 000** jobs, respectively.



### **All industries (Total)**

The total number of employees decreased by **194 000** in Q4:2023 compared with Q3:2023. Year-on-year total employment for all industries increased by **98 000** compared with same quarter of the previous year.





## **Mining**

In fourth quarter of 2023, mining industry lost 1 000 jobs. There was an annual increase of 9 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of the previous year.





### Manufacturing

Manufacturing industry lost **7 000** jobs in the third quarter of 2023. Year-on-year, the industry saw an annual increase of **3 000** jobs in Q3:2023 compared to same quarter of 2022.





### **Electricity**

The electricity industry increased by 1 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2023. Year-on-year the industry added 2 000 jobs when comparing Q4:2023 with Q4:2022.





#### Construction

The construction industry shed **19 000** jobs in the fourth quarter of 2023, relative to the previous quarter. The industry also saw a decline of **16 000** jobs from the same quarter of the previous year.








#### **Trade**

In the fourth quarter of 2023, the trade industry added **56 000** jobs compared to the third quarter. Year-on-year the industry gained **39 000** jobs compared to the same quarter of 2022.








### **Transport**

Transport industry saw a gain of **2 000** jobs in the fourth quarter of 2023, compared to the previous quarter. The industry experienced a year-on-year gain of **3 000** jobs compared with the same quarter of 2022.





#### **Business services**

The fourth quarter of 2023 saw a net loss of **12 000** jobs in the Business services industry, compared to the second quarter. Year-on-year the industry also lost **28 000** jobs compared to same quarter of 2022.





#### **Community services**

The Community services industry lost **214 000** jobs in the fourth quarter of 2023, compared to the previous quarter. The industry also saw an annual growth of **80 000** jobs compared to the same quarter of 2022.













#### **Changes in gross earnings**

During the fourth quarter of 2023, the gross earnings saw a rise of **R54,5 billion**, equivalent to a **5,8%** increase, reaching R995,6 billion compared to the third quarter's R941,3 billion. Basic salaries experienced a growth of **R7,9 billion**, representing a **0,9%** increase, while bonus payments rose by **R45 billion**, marking a **69%** growth during the same quarter. Overtime payments saw an increase of **R1,6 billion**, reflecting an increase of **6,1%**.









#### Quarter-on-quarter changes in gross earnings

Gross earnings increased by **R54,5** billion (or **5,8%**) in the fourth quarter of 2023 compared to Q3:2023. Most increases in gross earnings were due to increases in bonus payments by **R45** billion. The basic salary/wages increased by **R7,9** billion and overtime payments increased by **R1,6** billion.

#### Year-on-year changes in gross earnings

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R42 billion (or 4,4%). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by R43,6 billion. There were also increases in overtime payments by R3,6 billion. However, bonus payments decreased by R5,2 billion.




### All industries (Total)








### Manufacturing













## **AME RESULTS**

AME including bonuses and overtime payments increased by 1,6% from R26 471 in August 2023 to R26 894 in November 2023.








# **AME** by industry

Three industries, namely, construction, community services and manufacturing saw a rise in AME above industry average of **1,6%** in November 2023. Trade, mining and transport industries reported quarterly decreases in AME. Year-on-year construction industry reported the largest annual increase whilst community services showed the only decrease in same period.







# AME quarter-on-quarter change

The average monthly earnings (AME) amounted to R26 894 in November 2023. This is an increase of 1,6%, up from R26 471 reported in August 2023.
