





QES Background

QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected

EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

The number of employed persons decreased by 67 000 from **10 731 000** in Q4:2023 to **10 664 000** in Q1:2024.

There was a decrease of 67 000 jobs in first quarter 2023. This figure represents a decline of -0,6% when compared to the previous quarter.





Year-on-year there was an annual decrease of 74 000 jobs (or -0,7%) in Q1:2024 compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year.






EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

Full-time employment decreased from 9 513 000 in Q4:2023 to 9 484 000 in Q1:2024.

Part-time employment decreased from 1 218 000 in Q4:2023, down to 1 180 000 in Q1:2024.



There was a quarter-on-quarter decrease of 29 000 full-time jobs. Year-on-year full-time jobs decreased by 16 000.

Part-time jobs decreased by 38 000 quarter-on-quarter and year-on-year there was a decrease of 58 000 jobs.





Quarter-on-quarter changes in employment

There was a quarter-on-quarter decrease of 67 000. Trade industry reported most loss of 57 000 jobs, primarily driven by decreases in both full-time and part-time employment. Community services followed with a decrease of 18 000 jobs.

There were also job increases reported by manufacturing, transport and construction industries.

Year-on-year changes in employment

There was a year-on-year net loss of 74 000 employees, driven primarily by community services, construction industry as well as business services. Even though there were increases reported, this could not offset the total losses where some industry reported a total gain of 31 000 jobs.



All industries (Total)

The total number of employees decreased by 67 000 in Q1:2024 compared with Q4:2023. Year-on-year total employment for all industries decreased by 74 000 compared with same quarter of the previous year.

In first quarter of 2024, mining industry lost 3 000 jobs. Year-on-year the industry lost 3 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of the previous year.





Manufacturing

Manufacturing industry increased by 12 000 jobs in the first quarter of 2024. Year-on-year, the industry saw an annual increase of 15 000 jobs compared to same quarter of 2023.








Electricity

The electricity industry remained unchanged in the first quarter of 2024. Year-on-year the industry added 1 000 jobs when comparing Q1:2024 with Q1:2023.










Construction

The construction industry increased by 1 000 jobs in the first quarter of 2024. The industry saw a decline of 30 000 jobs compared with same quarter of the previous year.









Trade

Trade industry lost 57 000 jobs in Q1:2024. Year-on-year the industry gained 7 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2023.

Transport

Transport industry gained 2 000 jobs in the first quarter of 2024, compared to the previous quarter. The industry experienced a year-on-year gain of 5 000 jobs compared with the same quarter of 2023.










Business services

Business services industry saw a net loss of 4 000 jobs in the first quarter of 2024, compared to previous quarter. Year-on-year the industry lost 14 000 jobs compared to same quarter of 2023.








Community services

The Community services industry lost 18 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2023, compared to the previous quarter. The industry also saw an annual decline of 61 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2023.
















Changes in gross earnings

Gross earnings declined by R35,1 billion (or -3,5%) reaching R957,9 billion compared to Q4:2023 (R993 billion). Basic salaries experienced a decline of R6,7 billion, representing a 0,8% decrease, bonus payments fell by R27,6 billion (or -25,3%) and overtime payments declined by R779 million (or -2,7%).







Quarter-on-quarter changes in gross earnings

Most decreases in gross earnings in Q1:2024 were due to decreases in bonus payments by R27,6 billion. The basic salary/wages decreased by R6,7 billion and overtime payments decreased by R779 million.

Year-on-year changes in gross earnings

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R43,5 billion (or 4,8%). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by R40 billion. There were also increases in overtime payments by R3 billion and bonus payments increased by R438 million.



Gross earnings for all industries decreased by R35,1 billion in the Q1:2024.





Gross earnings paid in the mining industry decreased by R216 million in Q1:2024.








Manufacturing

Gross earnings paid in the manufacturing industry decreased by R10 billion in Q1: 2024.








Electricity

Gross earnings paid in the electricity industry decreased by R1,1 billion in Q1: 2024.








Construction

Gross earnings paid in the construction industry decreased R6,3 billion in Q1:2024.








Trade

Gross earnings paid in the trade industry decreased by R12,3 billion in Q1:2024.








Transport

Gross earnings paid in the transport industry decreased by R3,4 billion in Q1:2024.








Business services

Gross earnings paid in the business services industry increased by R9,3 billion in Q1: 2024.








Community services


AME RESULTS

AME including bonuses and overtime payments decreased by 0,1% from R26 822 in November 2023 to R26 791 in February 2024.

Year-on-year AME increased by 4,6%.








AME by industry

Mining, manufacturing and business services declined in AME in February 2024. Even though there was an overall decrease in AME, other industries saw increases in average earnings in same period. Year-on-year transport industry reported the largest annual increase of 9,5%, whilst community services showed the lowest increase of 2,3%.







AME quarter-on-quarter change

The average monthly earnings (AME) amounted to R26 791 in February 2024, down from R26 822 reported in November 2023. This is a decrease of 0,1%.
