





QES Background

QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected

EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

The number of employed persons decreased by 133 000 from 10 738 000 in Q2:2024 to 10 605 000 in Q3:2024.

There was a decrease of 133 000 jobs in third quarter 2024. This figure represents a decrease of 1,2% when compared to the previous quarter.





Year-on-year there was an annual decrease of 294 000 jobs (or -2,7%) in Q3:2024 compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year.






EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

Full-time employment decreased from 9 468 000 in Q2:2024 to 9 454 000 in Q3:2024.

Part-time employment decreased from 1 270 000 in Q2:2024 to 1 151 000 in Q3:2024.



There was a quarter-on-quarter decrease of 14 000 full-time jobs. Year-on-year full-time jobs decreased by 44 000.

Part-time jobs decreased by 119 000 quarter-on-quarter and year-on-year there was a decrease of 250 000 jobs.





Quarter-on-quarter changes in employment

There was a quarter-on-quarter decrease of 133 000 jobs. Community services industry reported the most decline with 131 000 jobs, primarily driven by decreases in part-time employment.

There were job decreases reported by six of the eight industries.

Year-on-year changes in employment

Year-on-year employment decreased by 294 000, which was driven primarily by community services, business services, construction as well as the mining and manufacturing industries. Despite the reported losses, there were gains in the trade and electricity industries.

All industries (Total)

The total number of employees decreased by 133 000 in Q3:2024 compared with Q2:2024. Year-on-year total employment for all industries decreased by 294 000 compared with same quarter of the previous year.












Manufacturing

Manufacturing industry decreased by 4 000 jobs in Q3:2024.

Year-on-year, the industry saw an annual decrease of 6 000 jobs compared to same quarter of 2023.








Electricity

Electricity industry





The construction industry increased by 4 000 jobs in the third quarter of 2024. The industry saw a decline of 16 000 jobs compared with same quarter of the previous year.








Trade






Transport






Business services

Business services industry saw a net loss of 15 000 jobs in the third quarter of 2024, compared to previous quarter.

Year-on-year the industry lost 24 000 jobs compared to same quarter of 2023.









Community services

The Community services industry lost 131 000 jobs in the third quarter of 2024, compared to the previous quarter. The industry also saw an annual decline of 265 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2023.

Community services industry















Changes in gross earnings

Gross earnings increased by R12,2 billion (or 1,3%) reaching R966,3 billion compared to Q2:2024 (R954,1 billion). Basic salaries rose by R6,7 billion, representing 0,8% increase. Bonus payments increased by R6,9 billion (or 12,9%). Overtime payments saw a declined of R1,4 billion (or -4,8%).









Quarter-on-quarter changes in gross earnings

Gross earnings in Q3:2024 increased due to bonus payments by **R6,9** billion and basic salaries/wages by **R6,7** billion. However, overtime payments decreased by R1,4 billion. Business services contributed the most to the increase, followed by community services, mining and electricity.

Year-on-year changes in gross earnings

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R24,9 billion (or 2,6%). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by R28,7 billion and overtime payments by R614 million. Bonus payments reported a decrease of R4,5 billion.



Gross earnings for all industries increased by R12,4 billion in the Q3:2024.





Gross earnings paid in the mining industry increased by R1,5 billion in Q3:2024.










Manufacturing

Gross earnings paid in the manufacturing industry decreased by R522 million in Q3:2024.





Gross earnings paid in the electricity industry increased by R302 million in Q3:2024.










Construction

Gross earnings paid in the construction industry decreased by R334 billion in Q3:2024.








Trade

Gross earnings paid in the trade industry decreased by R1,2 billion in Q3:2024.








Transport

Gross earnings paid in the transport industry decreased by R884 million in Q3:2024.










Business services



AME RESULTS

AME including bonuses and overtime payments increased by 2,6% from R27 511 in May 2024 to R28 220 in August 2024.








AME by industry

Seven out of the eight industries increased in AME in August 2024. Even though there was an overall increase in AME, trade industry remained unchanged in average earnings in same period. Year-on-year community services industry reported the largest annual increase of 12%, whilst manufacturing industry showed the lowest increase of 2,4%.







AME quarter-on-quarter change

The average monthly earnings (AME) amounted to R28 220 in August 2024, up from R27 511 reported in May 2024. This is an increase of 2,6%.

Number of employees decreased by 133 000 Q/Q & decreased by 294 000 Y/Y.
