





# **QES Background**

QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected

## **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

The number of employed persons increased by 12 000 from **10 628 000** in Q3:2024 to **10 640 000** in Q4:2024.

There was an increase of 12 000 jobs in fourth quarter 2024. This figure represents an increase of 0,1% when compared to the previous quarter.





Year-on-year there was an annual decrease of 91 000 jobs (or -0,8%) in Q4:2024 compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year.





## **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

Full-time employment increased from 9 477 000 in Q3:2024 to 9 487 000 in Q4:2024.

Part-time employment increased from 1 151 000 in Q3:2024 to 1 153 000 in Q4:2024.



There was a quarter-on-quarter increase of 10 000 full-time jobs. Year-on-year full-time jobs decreased by 26 000.

Part-time jobs increased by 2 000 quarteron-quarter and year-on-year there was a decrease of 65 000 jobs.





#### Quarter-on-quarter changes in employment by industry

Trade industry reported the most increase with 42 000 jobs, driven both by full-time and part-time. Business services followed with 22 000 where most contribution is coming from full-time jobs. There were also job losses reported by four of the eight industries. Community services industry decreased by 26 000, followed by construction and manufacturing both losing 13 000 jobs.

## Year-on-year changes in employment by industry

Year-on-year employment decreased by 91 000, which was driven primarily by community services, manufacturing, mining and transport industries.

Despite the reported losses, there were gains in the construction, business services, trade and electricity industries.

## **All industries (Total)**

The total number of employees increased by 12 000 in Q4:2024 compared with Q3:2024. Year-on-year total employment for all industries decreased by 91 000 compared with same quarter of the previous year.

## **Mining**

In Q4:2024, mining industry lost 3 000 jobs. Year-on-year the industry lost 13 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of the previous year.




## Manufacturing

Manufacturing industry decreased by 13 000 jobs in Q4:2024.

Year-on-year, the industry saw an annual decrease of 19 000 jobs compared to same

quarter of 2023.








## **Electricity**

The electricity industry increased by 1 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2024 compared to Q3:2024.

#### Construction



## **Transport**

Transport industry gained 2 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2024, compared to the previous quarter. The industry lost 5 000 jobs compared with the same quarter of 2023.










#### **Business services**

Business services industry saw an increase of 22 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2024, compared to previous quarter.

Year-on-year the industry gained 9 000 jobs compared to same quarter of 2023.










#### **Community services**

The community services industry lost 26 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2024, compared to the previous quarter. The industry also saw an annual decline of 77 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2023.

#### Community services industry















#### Changes in gross earnings

Gross earnings increased by R59,1 billion (or 6,1%) reaching R1,03 trillion compared to Q3:2024 (R969,4 billion). Basic salaries rose by R9,5 billion, representing 0,8% increase. Bonus payments increased by R51,8 billion (or 12,9%). Overtime payments saw a decline of R2,2 billion (or -4,8%).









#### Quarter-on-quarter changes in gross earnings by industry

Gross earnings in Q4:2024 increased due to bonus payments by **R51,8** billion and basic salaries/wages by **R9,5** billion. However, overtime payments decreased by R2,2 billion. Trade, manufacturing and community services contributed the most to the increase.

#### Year-on-year changes in gross earnings by industry

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R35,5 billion (or 3,6%). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by R34,1 billion and bonus payments by R3,4 billion.

Overtime payments reported a decrease of R2 billion.



Gross earnings for all industries increased by R59,1 billion in the Q4:2024.





Gross earnings paid in the mining industry decreased by R910 million in Q4:2024.





Gross earnings paid in the manufacturing industry increased by R12,9 billion in Q4:2024.








## **Electricity**

Gross earnings paid in the electricity industry increased by R2,5 billion in Q4:2024.














## **AME RESULTS**

AME including bonuses and overtime payments decreased by 0,2% from R28 274 in August 2024 to R28 231 in November 2024.

Year-on-year AME increased by 5,3%.

# **AME** by industry

Six out of the eight industries increased in AME in November 2024. Even though there was an overall increase in AME, there were decreases in mining and business services industries.

Year-on-year community services industry reported the largest annual increase of 8,8%, whilst mining industry reported the lowest increase of 2,0%.




