Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected










EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

The number of employed persons decreased by 74 000 from 10 653 000 in Q4:2024 to 10 579 000 in Q1:2025.

There was a decrease of 74 000 jobs (or -0,7%) in first quarter 2025 compared to the previous quarter.





Year-on-year there was an annual decrease of 95 000 jobs (or -0,9%) in Q1:2025 compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year.







EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

Full-time employment decreased from 9 503 000 in Q4:2024 to 9 448 000 in Q1:2025.

Part-time employment decreased from 1 150 000 in Q4:2024 to 1 131 000 in Q1:2025.



There was a quarter-on-quarter decrease of 55 000 full-time jobs. Year-on-year full-time jobs decreased by 40 000.

Part-time jobs decreased by 19 000 quarteron-quarter and year-on-year there was a decrease of 55 000 jobs.







Quarter-on-quarter changes in employment by industry

Trade reported the most decrease with 52 000 jobs lost; followed by community services with 17 000 jobs. Despite total loss in jobs, business services added 2 000 jobs).

Year-on-year changes in employment by industry

Year-on-year employment decreased by 95 000, which was driven primarily by community services, manufacturing, mining and transport industries.

Gains were reported in business services, construction and trade industries.








Mining






Manufacturing






Electricity




Trade






Transport




Business services








Changes in gross earnings

Gross earnings decreased by R47,3 billion (or-4,6%) reaching R983,1 billion compared to Q4:2024 (R1,03 trillion). Basic salaries fell by R9,4 billion (or -1,1%), bonus payments decreased by R36,5 billion (or -32,5%) and overtime payments saw a decline of R1,4 billion (or-5,1%).









Quarter-on-quarter changes in gross earnings by industry

Gross earnings in Q1:2025 decreased due to bonus payments by R36,5 billion, followed by basic salary payments R9,4 billion and overtime payments by R1,4 billion. The business services industry experienced a rise in total earnings, driven by bonus payments..

Year-on-year changes in gross earnings by industry

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R26,1 billion (or 2,7%). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by R33,1 billion (3,9%). Bonus payments fell by R5,7 billion (-6,9%) and overtime payments reported a decrease of R1,3 billion (-4,7%).





Gross earnings paid in the mining industry decreased by R0,1 billion in Q1:2025.










Manufacturing



Gross earnings paid in the electricity industry decreased by R2,1 billion in Q1:2025.














AME RESULTS

AME including bonuses and overtime payments decreased by 0,1% from R28 316 in November 2024 to R28 289 in February 2025.


Year-on-year AME increased by 5,6% from R26 783 in February 2024 to R28 289 in February 2025.






AME by industry

Four out of the eight industries decreased in AME in February 2025. Even though there was an overall decrease in AME, there were increases reported in community services, construction, trade and electricity industries.

Year-on-year community services industry reported the largest annual increase of 10,5%, whilst business services industry reported the lowest increase of 2,5%.












AME quarter-on-quarter change
