

# **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

The number of employed persons increased by 29 000 from **10 520 000** in Q2:2025 to **10 549 000** in Q3:2025.

There was an increase of 29 000 jobs (or 0,3%) in Q3:2025 compared to the previous quarter.





Year-on-year there was an annual decrease of 79 000 jobs (or -0,7%) in Q3:2025 compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year.






# **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

Full-time employment decreased from 9 426 000 in Q2:2025 to 9 405 000 in Q3:2025.

Part-time employment increased from 1 094 000 in Q2:2025 to 1 144 000 in Q3:2025.



There was a quarter-on-quarter decrease of 21 000 full-time jobs. Year-on-year full-time jobs decreased by 72 000.

Part-time jobs increased by 50 000 quarteron-quarter and year-on-year there was a decrease of 7 000 jobs.





### Quarter-on-quarter changes in employment by industry

Community service reported the most significant increase, with 39 000 jobs added, followed by trade, which gained 6 000 jobs. Mining industry increased by 5 000 jobs. Even though total employment has increased, there were job losses reported by business services with 12 000 jobs, followed by manufacturing which lost 5 000 jobs and construction saw a decline of 4 000. Electricity and transport industries remain unchanged for the quarter.

# Year-on-year changes in employment by industry

Year-on-year employment decreased by 79 000, which was driven primarily by community services, manufacturing, construction, trade, and transport industries.

Gains were reported in business services, electricity and mining industries.

# **All industries (Total)**

The total number of employees increased by 29 000 in Q3:2025 compared with Q2:2025. Year-on-year total employment for all industries decreased by 79 000 compared with same quarter of the previous year.

# **Mining**

In Q3:2025, mining industry gained 5 000 jobs. Year-on-year the industry added 2 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of the previous year.






# Manufacturing

Manufacturing industry decreased by 5 000 jobs in Q3:2025.






# **Electricity**

The electricity industry reported no change in the third quarter of 2025 compared to Q2:2025. Year-on-year the industry increased by 3 000 jobs when comparing Q3:2025 with the previous quarter.







#### Construction




#### **Business services**




## **Community services**








### Changes in gross earnings

Gross earnings increased by **R10,7** billion (or **1,1%**) reaching **R1 000,7** billion compared to Q2:2025 (**R990,0** billion). Basic salaries rose by **R7,8** billion (or **0,9%**), and bonus payments increased by **R6,2** billion (or **10,9%**). However, overtime payments saw a decline of **R3,3** billion (or **-11,1%**).









## Quarter-on-quarter changes in gross earnings by industry

Gross earnings in Q3:2025 increased due to basic salary payments by R7,8 billion as well as bonus payments by R6,2 billion. Overtime payments declined by R3,3 billion.

### **Year-on-year** changes in gross earnings by industry

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R31,2 billion (or 3,2%). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by R31,0 billion. Bonus payments rose by R2,2 billion and overtime payments reported a decrease of R2,0 billion.



Gross earnings for all industries increased by R10,7billion in the Q3:2025.





Gross earnings paid in the mining industry increased by R1,7 billion in Q3:2025.

















# **AME RESULTS**

AME including bonuses and overtime payments increased by **0,3%** from **R29 402** in May 2025 to **R29 490** in August 2025.






# **AME** by industry

In August 2025, several industries saw an increase in Average Monthly Earnings (AME). The manufacturing industry experienced the fastest growth, followed by the transport, construction and business services sectors. Trade, community services and electricity declined in the quarter.

On a year-on-year basis, the **community services** industry reported the largest annual increase at **6,1%**, while the **business services** industry had the lowest growth at 2,1%. Conversely, **mining** industry declined year-on-year by **0.8%**.








# **AME** series
