QES Background

QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected

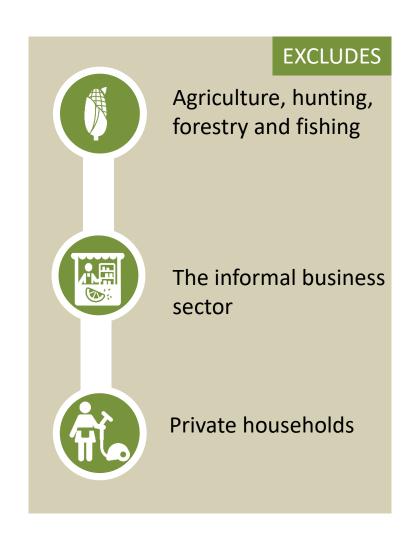

EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

The number of employed individuals increased to **10 176 000** in Q3:2023, up from **10 145 000** in Q2:2023.

In the third quarter of 2023 (Q3:2023), there was an increase in employment, with a net gain of **31 000** jobs. This figure represents a growth rate of **0,3%** when compared to the preceding quarter.





There was an annual increase of 256 000 jobs, which is a growth rate of 2,6%, when comparing Q3:2023 with the corresponding quarter of the previous year.



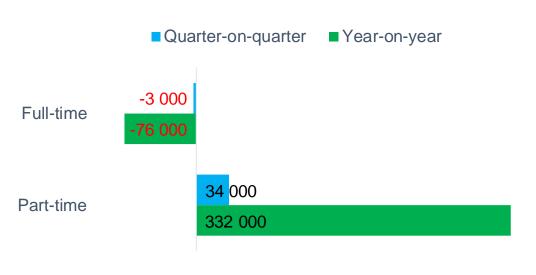


EMPLOYMENT RESULTS



Full-time employment declines from 8 792 000 in Q2:2023 to 8 789 000 in Q3:2023.

Part-time employment increased to **1 387 000** in Q3:2023, up from **1 353 000** in Q2:2023.



There has been a decline in full-time employment, with 3 000 fewer jobs reported quarter-on-quarter and 76 000 fewer jobs reported year-on-year.

There has been an increase of 34 000 part-time jobs in the third quarter of 2023 and year-on-year there was an increase of 332 000 jobs.





QES Q3:2023

Quarter-on-quarter changes in employment

During Q3:2023, there was a net job increase of 31 000.

Community Services reported a net gain of 42 000 jobs, primarily driven by an increase in both full-time and part-time employment.

However, manufacturing industry experienced a decline in full-time and part-time employment, leading to a net loss of 7 000 jobs.

QES Q3:2023

Year-on-year changes in employment

There was a year-on-year net gain of 256 000 employees, driven by increases in part-time employment with 332 000 jobs. Community services saw a substantial net gain of 270 000 employees. Conversely, construction industry reported a net loss of 27 000 jobs.

In third quarter of 2023, mining industry added 2 000 jobs. There was an annual increase of 12 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of the previous year.



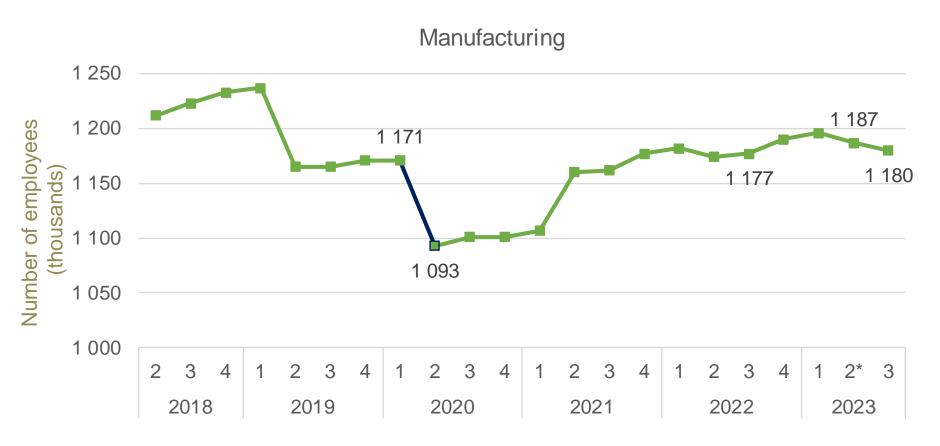








Manufacturing industry lost 7 000 jobs in the third quarter of 2023. Year-on-year, the industry saw an annual increase of 3 000 jobs in Q3:2023 compared to same quarter of 2022.





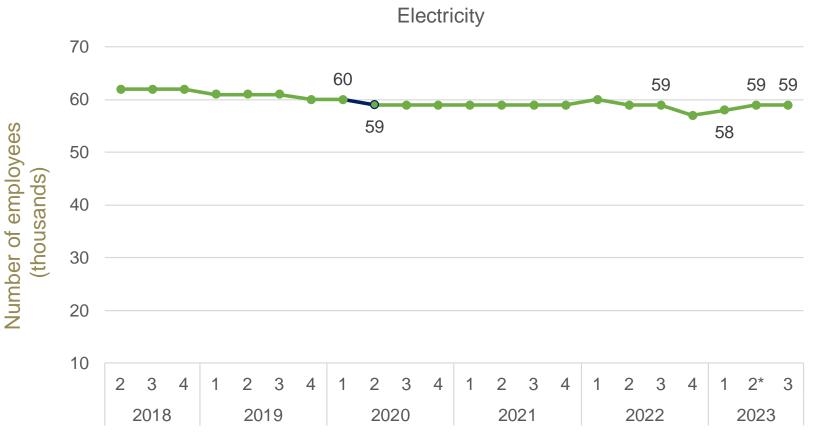






The Electricity industry remained unchanged in the third quarter of 2023, where an increase of 1 000 jobs in full-time employment was offset by a 1 000 jobs decrease in part-time.

Year-on-year the industry remained unchanged when comparing Q3:2023 with Q3:2022.

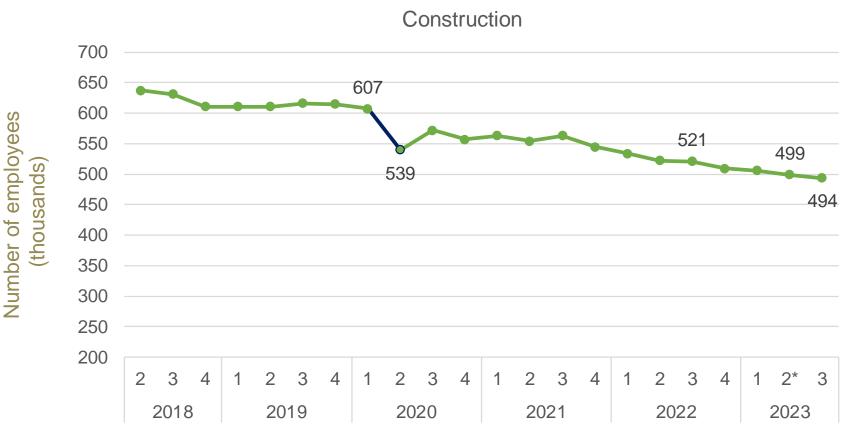

The Construction industry shed 5 000 jobs in the third quarter of 2023, relative to the previous quarter. The industry also saw a decline of 27 000 jobs from the same quarter of the previous year.











In the third quarter of 2023, the trade industry added 4 000 jobs compared to the second quarter.

Year-on-year the industry gained 6 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2022.



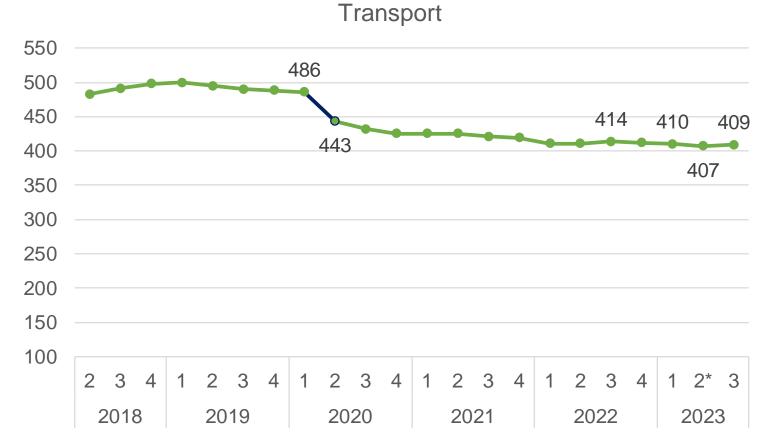






Transport industry saw a gain of 2 000 jobs in the third quarter of 2023, compared to the previous quarter.

The industry experienced a year-on-year loss of 5 000 jobs compared with the same quarter of 2022.



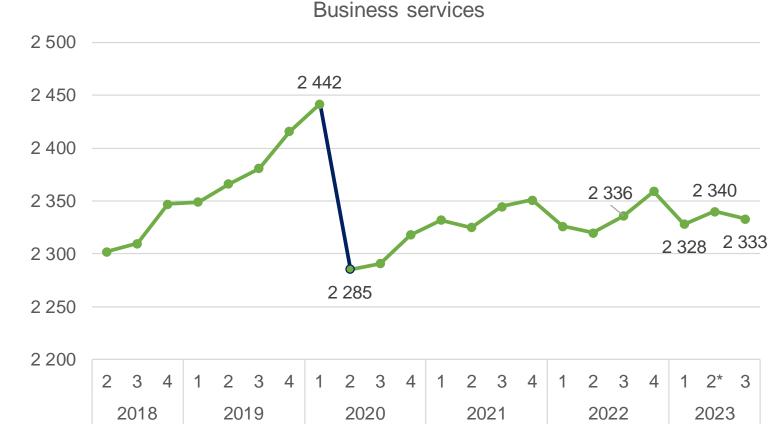






The third quarter of 2023 saw a net loss of 7 000 jobs in the Business services industry, compared to the second quarter.

Year-on-year the industry also lost 3 000 jobs compared to same quarter of 2022.



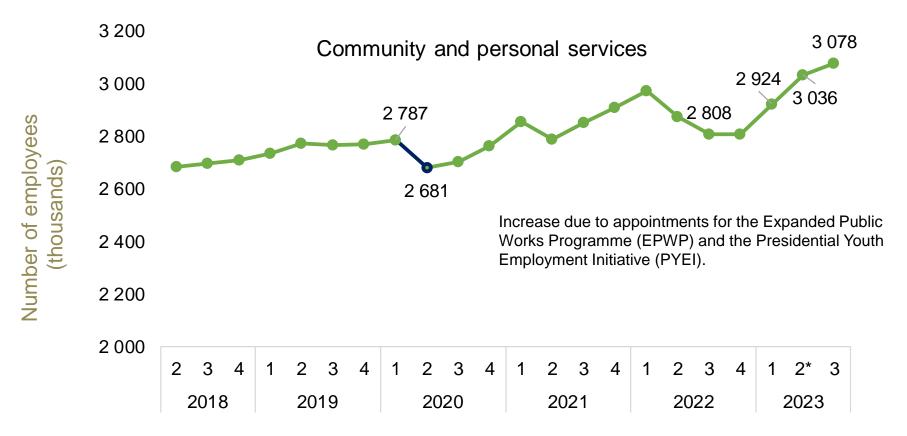








The Community services industry added 42 000 more jobs in the third quarter of 2023, compared to the previous quarter. The industry also saw an annual growth of 270 000 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2022.









The total number of persons employed increased by 31 000 in Q3:2023 compared with Q2:2023. Year-on-year total employment for all industries increased by 256 000 compared with same quarter of the previous year.









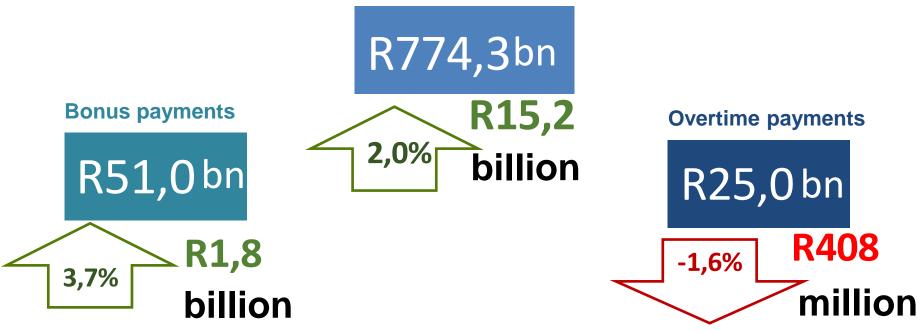




Changes in gross earnings

During the third quarter of 2023, the gross earnings saw a rise of R16,7 billion, equivalent to a 2% increase, reaching R850,3 billion compared to the second quarter's R833,6 billion. Basic salaries experienced a growth of R15,2 billion, representing a 2% increase, while bonus payments rose by R1,8 billion, marking a 3,7% growth during the same quarter. However, overtime payments saw a decline of R408 million, reflecting a decrease of 1,6%.









QESQ3:2023

Quarter-on-quarter changes in gross earnings

Gross earnings increased by R16,7 billion (or 2%) in the third quarter of 2023 compared to Q2:2023. Increases in gross earnings were due to increases in basic salary/wages by R15,2 billion and bonus payments by R1,8 billion. However, overtime payments decreased by R408 million.

QES Q3:2023

Year-on-year changes in gross earnings

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R51,6 billion (or 6,5%). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by R44,9 billion. There were also increases in bonus payments by R4,4 billion and overtime payments by R2,2 billion.

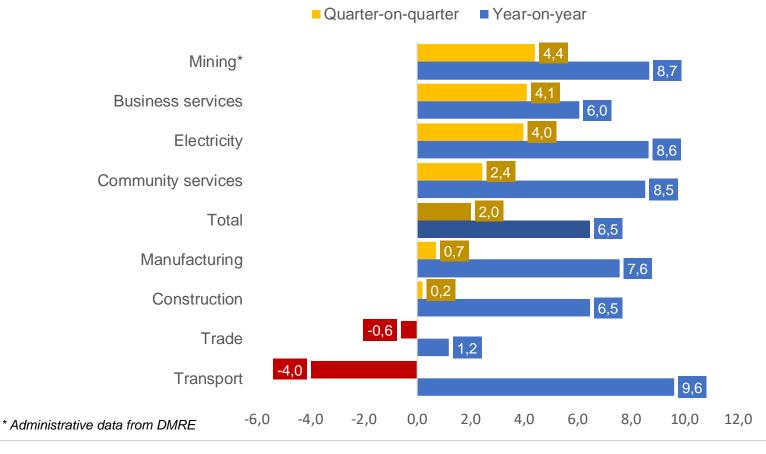




Percentage changes in gross earnings

There was a quarterly increase of **2**% in gross earnings in the third quarter of 2023 compared to second quarter.

Year-on-year earnings increased by 6,5% in the third quarter of 2023 compared with same quarter of the previous year.



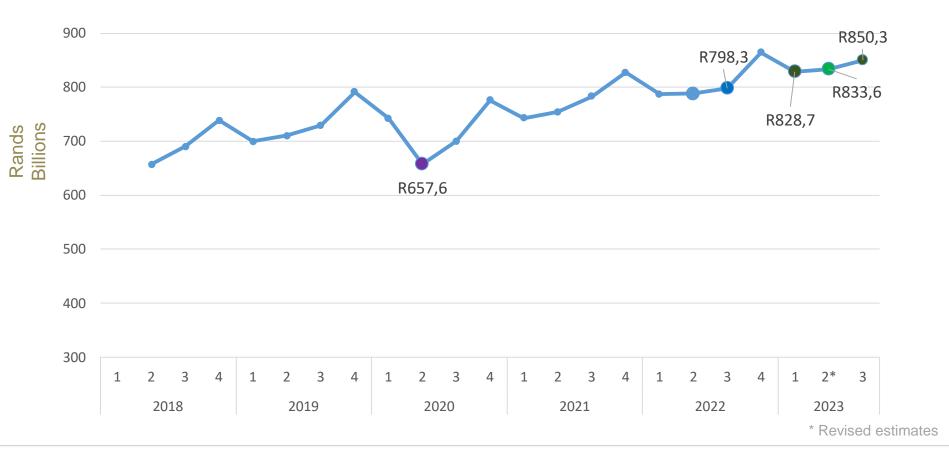






The total gross earnings paid to employees increased by R16,7 billion from R833,6 billion in Q2:2023 to R850,3 billion in Q3:2023.

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R51,6 billion compared with the same quarter of the previous year (i.e. Q3:2022)









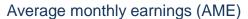






AME including bonuses and overtime payments increased by **0,9%** from **R25 866** in May 2023 to **R26 086** in August 2023.

Year-on-year AME increased by 4,7%.

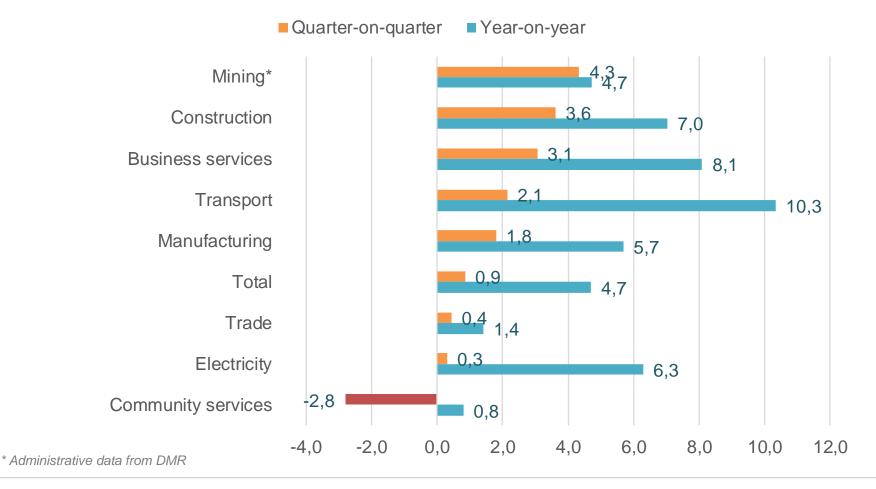








Compared to the first quarter of 2023, every industry saw a rise in their average monthly earnings (AME) in the second quarter. Transport grew largest of all industries in the quarter by 5,6%, whereas business services was the lowest with 1,8%. The business services industry had the highest AME growth of 9,6% from a year ago, while the construction industry experienced a 1,9% drop.









In August 2023, the average monthly earnings (AME) amounted to R26 086.

Number of employees increased by 31 000 Q/Q & increased by 256 000 Y/Y.
