QES Background

QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected

New sample

Statistics South Africa has pledged to provide updated and quality statistics from the Quarterly Employment Statistics survey to correctly inform users and policy makers.

Since 2015, Statistics South Africa has drawn QES samples on an annual basis except in 2020 due to hard lockdown. The latest QES 2021 sample was drawn in April 2021.

The results published today are based on 2021 sample. This is an annual procedure which typically affects the level of employment and gross earnings. To avoid breaks in time series and to minimise revisions to historical growth rates, historical employment and gross earnings levels were revised (i.e. they were linked to the estimates based on the new sample).

There was a quarterly increase of 62 000 jobs (or **0,6%**) in Q4:2021 compared with Q3:2021.



Jobs increased by 154 000 (or 1,6%) in the reference quarter compared with the same quarter of 2020 (Q4:2020).





Full-time jobs decreased quarter-onquarter by 44 000 and year-on-year full-time jobs decreased by 12 000.

Part-time jobs increased quarteron-quarter by 106 000 and yearon-year part-time jobs increased by 166 000.





There was a quarterly net increase of 62 000 jobs in Q4:2021. Most of the job gains were reported in part-time employment with a net increase of 106 000 whilst full-time jobs decreased by 44 000.

Year-on-year QES reported a net gain of 154 000 jobs in Q4:2021 compared with Q4:2020. Part-time increased by 166 000 jobs, whilst full-time jobs declined by 12 000.



The mining industry reported net decrease of 1 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2021.

Year-on-year the industry increased by 10 000 when comparing Q4:2020 with Q4:2021.





The trade industry reported net gain of 48 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2021 compared to Q3:2021.

Year-on-year the industry declined by 8 000 jobs compared with same quarter of 2020.





The community services industry reported a net gain of 45 000 jobs in the fourth quarter compared to Q3:2021.

Year-on-year the industry increased by 92 000 jobs compared with same quarter of the previous year (i.e. Q4:2020).








The total number of persons employed increased by 62 000 from **9 953 000** in Q3:2021 to **10 015 000** in Q4:2021.

Year-on-year total employment increased by 154 000 compared with same quarter of the previous year (i.e. Q4:2020).



Gross Earnings increased by **R44,3** billion to **R827,3** billion in Q4:2021







Gross earnings increased by R44,3 billion (or 5,7%) in the fourth quarter of 2021 compared to Q3:2021. Increases in gross earnings were due to increases in bonus payments by R36,9 billion, basic salary/wages by R6,2 billion and overtime payments by R1,3 billion.

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R51,7 billion (or 6,7%). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by R46,4 billion, overtime payments by R2,5 billion and bonus payments by R2,8 billion.



There was a quarterly increase of **5,7%** in gross earnings in the fourth quarter of 2021 compared to Q3:2021. Year-on-year earnings increased by **6,7%** in the fourth quarter of 2021 compared with same quarter of the previous year.








The total gross earnings paid to employees increased by R44,3 billion from R783,0 billion in Q3:2021 to R827,3 billion in Q4:2021.

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by **R51,7** billion compared with the same quarter of the previous year (i.e. 2020:Q4)










AME including bonuses and overtime payments increased by **0,3%** from **R23 908** in August 2021 to **R23 982** in November 2021. Year-on-year AME increased by **3,9%**.










Six out of eight industries reported increases in average monthly earnings in the fourth quarter compared with Q3:2021. Six industries increased above industry average of **0,3%** quarter-on-quarter. Year-on-year the construction industry reported an increase of 8,4% in AME while the electricity industry declined by **0,8%**.










Average monthly earnings were measured at R23 982 in the formal non-agricultural sector of the economy in November 2021.
