

What is this survey about?







The survey

Who was included?

- Enterprises registered for VAT that are primarily engaged in agriculture and related services
- Based on the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC)
- Units covered by the survey may be involved in other secondary economic activities

Scope and coverage

- Growing of crops, market gardening, horticulture and production of organic fertiliser
- Farming of animals
- Growing of crops combined with farming of animals (mixed farming)
- Agricultural and animal husbandry services, except veterinary activities
- Hunting, trapping, and game propagation, including related services

Period covered

- The information was collected from enterprises for their financial year, which ended on any date between 1 July 2021 and 30 June 2022
- The majority of enterprises have a financial year ending February 2022

- Finances (including capital expenditure)
- Details of purchases and sales of goods and services
- Employment



Percentage contribution of industries to total value added (2022) Total: R5,95 trillion*






The contribution of agriculture, forestry & fishing to total value added has grown










In 2022, the industry generated **R450,2 billion** in income, a rise of 11,2% compared with 2021





Total income has risen over the years












Small, medium and micro enterprises accounted for **31%** of income in the entire industry



Purchases was the largest contributor to expenditure in 2022


Expenditure for the major contributors in the agriculture and related services industry, 2021 and 2022








Percentage breakdown of the workforce by male and female








Income from sales of other agriculture products in 2022 (Total: R15,3 billion)

Overview (2022)

- The industry generated R450,2 billion in income, a rise of 11,2% compared with 2021
- The biggest source of income was from animals and animal products
- Small, medium and micro enterprises accounted for 31% of total income
- The category 'motor vehicles, plant, machinery, tractors & other transport' was the largest contributor to capital expenditure
- Agriculture created 30 773 jobs between 2021 and 2022, representing a rise of 3,9%
- Horticulture crops accounted for 26,3% of total sales
- Western Cape was the biggest contributor in sales of goods, salaries and employment
