The survey

Who was included?

- Enterprises registered for VAT that are primarily engaged in agriculture and related services
- Based on the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC)
- Units covered by the survey may be involved in other secondary economic activities
- The PDF statistical release is titled: *Agriculture survey* (P1101)

Scope and coverage

- Growing of crops, market gardening, horticulture and production of organic fertiliser
- Farming of animals
- Growing of crops combined with farming of animals (mixed farming)
- Agricultural and animal husbandry services, except veterinary activities
- Hunting, trapping, and game propagation, including related services

Period covered

- The information was collected from enterprises for their financial year, which ended on any date between 1 July 2023 and 30 June 2024
- The majority of enterprises have a financial year ending February 2024

- Details of purchases and sales of goods and services
- Employment









Economic importance




Financial overview







In 2024, the industry generated **R537,1 billion** in income, a rise of 9,7% compared with 2023










In 2024, capital expenditure was **R54,0 billion**, an annual rise of 17,9% compared with 2022





Total income has risen over the years










The biggest source of income was from animals and animal products








Small, medium and micro enterprises accounted for 34% of income in the industry

Expenditure for the major contributors in the agriculture and related services industry










Motor vehicles, plant, machinery, tractors & other equipment was the largest contributor

Percentage contribution of industries to total employed (2024)* Total: 16,9 million






Agriculture created **25 614** jobs between 2023 and 2024, representing a rise of 3,1%

Total number of persons employed in the agriculture and related services industry










In 2024, almost six in ten employees in the agriculture industry were men

Percentage breakdown of the workforce by male and female










In 2024, the workforce was almost equally split between large enterprises and SMMEs

Income from sales of goods by type of product (Total: R471,9 billion)










Horticultural crops: Fruits excluding grapes generated the most income

Income from sales of field crops in 2024 (Total: R114,6 billion)










Animals: Cattle generated the most income

Income from sales of animals in 2024 (Total: R110,1 billion)










Animal products: Chicken meat generated the most income

Other agricultural products: Animal feed generated the most income


Income from sales of other agricultural products in 2024 (Total: R16,0 billion)

Overview (2024)

- The industry generated R537,1 billion in income, a rise of 9,7% compared with 2023
- The biggest source of income was from animals and animal products
- Small, medium and micro enterprises accounted for 34% of total income and 51% of employment
- The category 'motor vehicles, plant, machinery, tractors & other equipment' was the largest contributor to capital expenditure
- Agriculture created 25 614 jobs between 2023 and 2024, representing a rise of 3,1%
- Horticulture crops accounted for 26,5% of total sales
- Western Cape was the biggest contributor in sales of goods, salaries and employment
