PREFACE

Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) has undertaken an annual non-financial census of municipalities covering 284 municipalities with effect from 2002. The purpose of the census is to measure the level of development and performance of municipalities. The results of the census provide information that can serve as a framework to stakeholders and policy-makers for planning and monitoring. It allows national and provincial governments to analyse the actual services provided by municipalities in terms of water, electricity, solid waste management and sewerage and sanitation. The 2004 non-financial census of municipalities obtained information regarding:

- ◆ Particulars of services provided between 1 July 2003 and 30 June 2004.
- ◆ Particulars of total employment in the municipalities as at 30 June 2004.

This statistical release contains the preliminary results of the 2004 non-financial census of municipalities and the revised figures for 2003. In the event of revised figures being obtained for 2004, they will be incorporated into the 2005 non-financial census of municipalities (if applicable).

Introduction

Background

Statistics South Africa conducted the first non-financial census of municipalities for the year ended 30 June 2002. A discussion document was produced and made available in December 2003. As a result of the proposals and recommendations made by both internal and external stakeholders, the results of the non-financial municipal data for the financial year ended June 2003 was published as a statistical release in March 2005.

Purpose of the survey

This publication of the non-financial municipal data will:

- Assist in monitoring the progress made with regard to the implementation of service provision, free basic services and poverty alleviation as national priorities.
- Provide baseline non-financial information from those institutions classified as municipalities in terms of the Local Government Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No. 117 of 1998).
- Provide information that can serve as a framework to stakeholders and policy-makers for planning, as well as monitoring and evaluating the performance of municipalities.
- Allow national and provincial governments and other stakeholders to analyse the actual services provided by municipalities.
- Be used by research organisations and individuals for research.

Questionnaire and data collection

The 2004 questionnaire was amended from that used for 2003, taking into consideration stakeholder needs. As in 2003, the methods used for collection were personal visits, telephone calls, facsimiles, e-mails and post. Data is then generally comparable for both the 2003 and 2004 publications.

Methodology

Sampling

No sampling was done. All 284 municipalities responded and were covered to the census.

Limitations of the survey

- This publication is not necessarily comparable with the Stats SA population census of 2001 and household survey data, partly because the data source is municipalities as opposed to households, and partly because of the different definitions of 'household'. Most municipalities do not have a system for identifying multiple households served by one billing unit or delivery point.
- The electricity information in this publication does not include electricity provided by Eskom directly to households.
- Water information does not include water provided by Department of Water Affairs and Forestry and community water schemes.
- Household refers to billing unit and is therefore not comparable with other Stats SA surveys on households.



Figure A: Number of households receiving basic services from municipalities in South Africa for the years ended 30 June 2002*, 2003* and 2004





The number of households receiving basic services from municipalities increased between 30 June 2002*, 2003* and 2004.

The largest increase from 2003 to 2004 in the provision of services was in water (14,0%), followed by sewerage and sanitation (11,8%), electricity (11,3%) and solid waste management (8,8%).

Figure B shows the number of households that relied on bucket toilet system for the years ended 30 June 2002, 2003 and 2004. All the provinces show a decrease in the number of households who rely on the bucket toilet system.

Western Cape shows the highest reduction in 2004, followed by KwaZulu-Natal and then Limpopo.




Figure C: Number of positions in the six metropolitan municipalities for the years ended 30 June 2002, 2003and 2004

Municipalities had approximately 237 662 positions for the year ended 30 June 2004, of which 48% are in the metropolitan municipalities.

These positions include full-time, part-time and vacant posts. There was a general decrease in the number of positions for 2004 as compared to 2003. The City of Cape Town shows the highest number of positions as compared to other metropolitan municipalities.

Table A shows that there were an estimated 8,4 million households in South Africa receiving water from municipalities as at 30 June 2004. This represents an increase of 14,0% between 30 June 2003 and 30 June 2004.

The province with the highest increase was Limpopo (30,6%), followed by Eastern Cape (29,8%) and Free State (29,3%). The province with the lowest increase was Gauteng (2,9%) followed by Western Cape (5,5%) and North West (6,3%).

Table B shows the proportion of households that benefited from the free basic water policy. Of the 8,4 million households receiving water from municipalities in South Africa, 6,5 million (77,1%) had access to free basic water. Gauteng shows the highest proportion (97,2%), followed by Western Cape (91,7%) and North West (74,9%). Northern Cape shows the lowest proportion (55,0%).

There were 6,5 million households receiving free basic water from municipalities in 2004, as compared with 5,2 million households in 2003.

Table C shows that there were an estimated 4,7 million households in South Africa receiving electricity from municipalities as at 30 June 2004. This represents an increase of 11,3% between 30 June 2003 and 30 June 2004.

The province with the highest increase was Northern Cape (21,3%), followed by North West (20,2%) and Gauteng (17,3%). The province with the lowest increase of households receiving electricity services from municipalities was KwaZulu-Natal with 5,5%, followed by Western Cape (5,7%) and Mpumalanga (8,1%).

Table D shows the proportion of households that were benefiting from the free basic electricity policy. Of the 4,7 million households receiving electricity from municipalities in South Africa as at 30 June 2004, 64,6% had access to free basic electricity. Gauteng showed the highest proportion (90,7%), followed by Western Cape (89,4%) and Free State (83,8%). The province with lowest increase was KwaZulu-Natal (5,8%).

The 3,0 million households receiving free basic electricity from municipalities in 2004, as compared with 2,2 million households in 2003.

Table E shows that there were an estimated 7,0 million households in South Africa receiving sewerage and sanitation services from municipalities as at 30 June 2004. This represents an increase of 11,8% between 30 June 2003 and 30 June 2004.

The province with the highest increase was Limpopo (32,2%), followed by North West (30,8%) and Mpumalanga (25,5%). The province with the lowest increase was Gauteng with 4,3%, followed by Western Cape (4,8%) and KwaZulu-Natal (6,7%).

Table F shows the proportion of households receiving sewerage and sanitation from municipalities that were receiving such services free. Of the 7,0 million households receiving sewerage and sanitation from municipalities in South Africa as at 30 June 2004, 48,3% had access to free basic sewerage and sanitation.

Western Cape showed the highest proportion (79,6%), followed by Gauteng (60,4%) and Free State (42,7%). The province with lowest proportion was KwaZulu-Natal (23,9%).

Table G shows that an estimated 6,5 million households in South Africa were receiving solid waste management services from municipalities as at 30 June 2004. This represents an increase of 8,8% between 30 June 2003 and 30 June 2004.

The province with the highest increase was Eastern Cape (25,1%) followed by Free State (22,0%) and North West (18,4%). The province with the lowest increase was Western Cape (4,1%) followed by KwaZulu-Natal (4,6%) and Gauteng (5,6%).

Table H shows the proportion of households receiving solid waste management services from municipalities that were receiving such services free. Of the 6,5 million households receiving solid waste management from municipalities in South Africa as at 30 June 2004, 52,3% had access to free solid waste management.

Western Cape showed the highest proportion (80,7%), followed by Gauteng (63,4 %) and Free State (41,9%). The province with the lowest proportion was Mpumalanga (12,9%).

Explanatory notes

Introduction

- This publication contains results of the annual non-financial census of municipalities for the year ended 30 June 2004. The survey is designed to obtain information regarding:
 - Particulars of services provided between 1 July 2003 and 30 June 2004.
 - Particulars of total employment in the municipalities as at 30 June 2004.

Scope of the survey

2 This survey covers non-financial information of all 284 municipalities.

Classification

The Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), the Fifth Edition, January 1993, was used to classify the statistical units (municipalities) in the census. The SIC is based on the 1990 International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC), with suitable adaptations for local conditions.

Statistical unit

4 The statistical unit for the collection of information is the municipality.

Reporting unit

5 Data were reported at district and metropolitan municipality level. (Data for local municipality is included in district municipality.)

Survey methodology and design

The information is collected annually from 284 municipalities administered through questionnaires by means of post, email and facsimile.

Reliability of estimates

Inaccuracies may occur because of imperfections in reporting by municipalities. Every effort is made to reduce errors to minimum by carefully designing the questionnaire, undertaking pilot studies/ workshops and editing the data.

Glossary

Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No.117 of 1998)).

Employees Employees are those people employed by the individual/enterprise/business/organisation who received payment (in salaries, wages

commission, piece rates or payments in kind) for any part of the reference period (excluding independent contractors and employers).

Full-time employees Full-time employees (permanent, temporary or casual) who normally work the agreed hours for a full-time employee

in a specific occupation. If agreed hours do not apply, employees are regarded as full-time if they normally work 35 hours per week,

including seasonal employees.

Free basic electricity

An amount of electricity determined by government that should be provided free to poor households to meet basic needs, currently set at

50kWh per month per household.

Free basic water

An amount of water determined by government that should be provided free to poor households to meet basic needs, currently set at 6kl

per month per household within 200 meters from each dwelling.

Household In this publication, household refers to a billing unit or delivery point.

Infrastructure Physical structures used for the delivery of services (e.g. power lines, pipes, roads and assets such as trucks and equipment to unblock

sewerage, pay point offices and computers).

Integrated Development Plan

Is a process by which municipalities prepare 5-year strategic plans that is reviewed annually in consultation with communities and

stakeholders.

Local municipality Local municipality means a municipality that shares municipal executive and legislative authority in its area with a district municipality within

whose area it falls, and which is described in section 155(1) of the Constitution as a category B municipality. (Refer to Local Government:

Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No.117 of 1998)).

Managerial position For the purpose of this survey, managerial positions refer to section 57 managers, according to the Local Government Municipal System

Act, 2000 (Act No. 1187 of 20 Nov 2000) and other managers according to the organogram.

Metropolitan municipality Metropolitan municipality means a municipality that has exclusive executive and legislative authority in its area, and which is described in

section 155(1) of the Constitution as a category A municipality. (Refer to Local Government: Municipal Structure Act 1998, (Act No.117 of

1998)).

Municipality Municipality is a generic term describing the "unit" of government in the local spheres responsible for local government in a geographically

demarcated area and includes district, local and metropolitan municipalities. A municipality is an institution consisting of a municipal council

(elected political representatives) and the municipal administration (appointed officials).

Part-time employees Part time employees are employees (permanent, temporary or casual) who are not full-time employees as defined above or who normally

work less than 35 hours per week, including seasonal employees.

Water Service Development Plan The WSDP is a sectoral plan that falls within the inter-sectoral umbrella plan of the IDP.
