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Limpopo: Financial and production statistics

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1. Introduction

1.1 Aim and collection unit

This publication presents estimates in respect of the Census of Commercial Agriculture (CoCA), 2017 – Limpopo. The survey aims to provide financial, production, employment and related information for the commercial agriculture industry in South Africa.

The last CoCA was conducted in 2007 (Reports No. 11-02-08 (2007)).

It is important to note that in 2007 the collection unit was a farming enterprise. The collection unit for CoCA 2017 is a farming unit, where a farming unit consists of one or more farms, holdings or pieces of land, whether adjacent or not, operated as a single unit and situated within the same local municipality. In this report, the word farm means farming unit.

1.2 Scope and coverage

CoCA 2017 covers enterprises registered for value added tax (VAT) and which are mainly or primarily engaged in the following activities classified according to the January 1993 edition of the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), Fifth edition.

- Growing of crops, market gardening and horticulture (SIC 111),
- Farming of animals (SIC 112),
- A combination of the above (mixed farming) (SIC 113),
- Agricultural and animal husbandry services, except veterinary activities (SIC 114), and
- Game propagation, including related services (SIC 1151).

1.3 Data items

The following categories of data items were collected: general information, land use, field crops, horticultural crops, animals, employment, income, expenditure and details of purchases.

1.4 Reference period

The questionnaires were completed for the financial year ended on any date between 1 March 2017 and 28 February 2018, according to the usual reporting schedule of the enterprise, with the following exceptions:

- Animals on farms as at 30 September 2018, and
- Employment as at 30 June 2018.

1.5 Current prices

The rand values are at current prices.

1.6 Reliability of data

The following are some of the likely sources of non-sampling errors: frame not up to date, wrong definitions and classification, phrasing of questions, non-response, processing and estimation. Every effort is made to minimise non-sampling errors by updating the frame, careful design of questionnaires, testing them with a sample of respondents, editing reported data and implementing efficient operating procedures. Non-sampling errors occur in both sample surveys and censuses.

1.7 Confidentiality

According to section 17 of the Statistics Act, 1999 (Act No. 6 of 1999), completed questionnaires remain confidential to Statistics South Africa (Stats SA). Individual business information is never disclosed. Results are presented in aggregated form only.

2. Key findings

2.1 Farming units, income, and employment

The total number of farms/ farming units involved in the commercial agriculture industry in 2017 was 3 054. The largest proportion of farms was in farming of animals (930 farms or 30,5% of the total), followed by mixed farming (852 or 27,9%) and growing of cereals and other crops (630 or 20,6%).

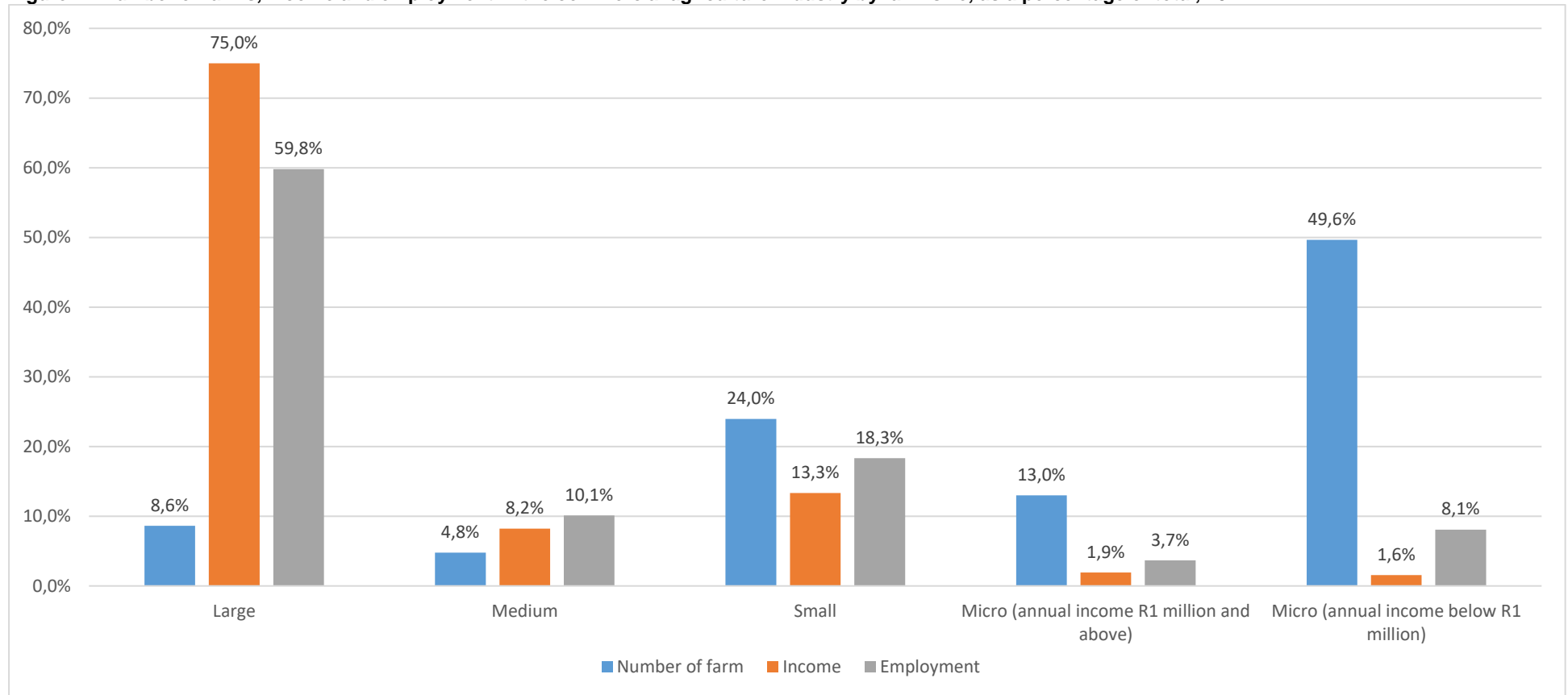
The district municipality with the highest number of farms in 2017 was Waterberg (1 362 farms or 44,8% of the provincial total), followed by Capricorn and Mopani (both 464 or 15,2%).

The total income for the commercial agriculture industry in 2017 was R31,4 billion, which was 393% higher than the R6,4 billion recorded for 2007. In 2017, the major contributor to total income was horticulture (R13,3 billion or 42,3%), followed by mixed farming (R7,6 billion or 24,3%) and farming of animals (R5,8 billion or 18,5%).

The district municipality contributing the most to total income in 2017 was Mopani (R8,7 billion or 27,6%), followed by Waterberg (R7,5 billion or 23,7%) and Vhembe (R5,4 billion or 17,1%).

The total number of persons employed in commercial agriculture on 30 June 2018 was 97 478, up from 74 878 on 28 February 2007 (+30,2%). In terms of employment, the major commercial agriculture activity in 2017 was horticulture (48 079 employees or 49,4% of the total), followed by mixed farming (24 881 or 25,5%).

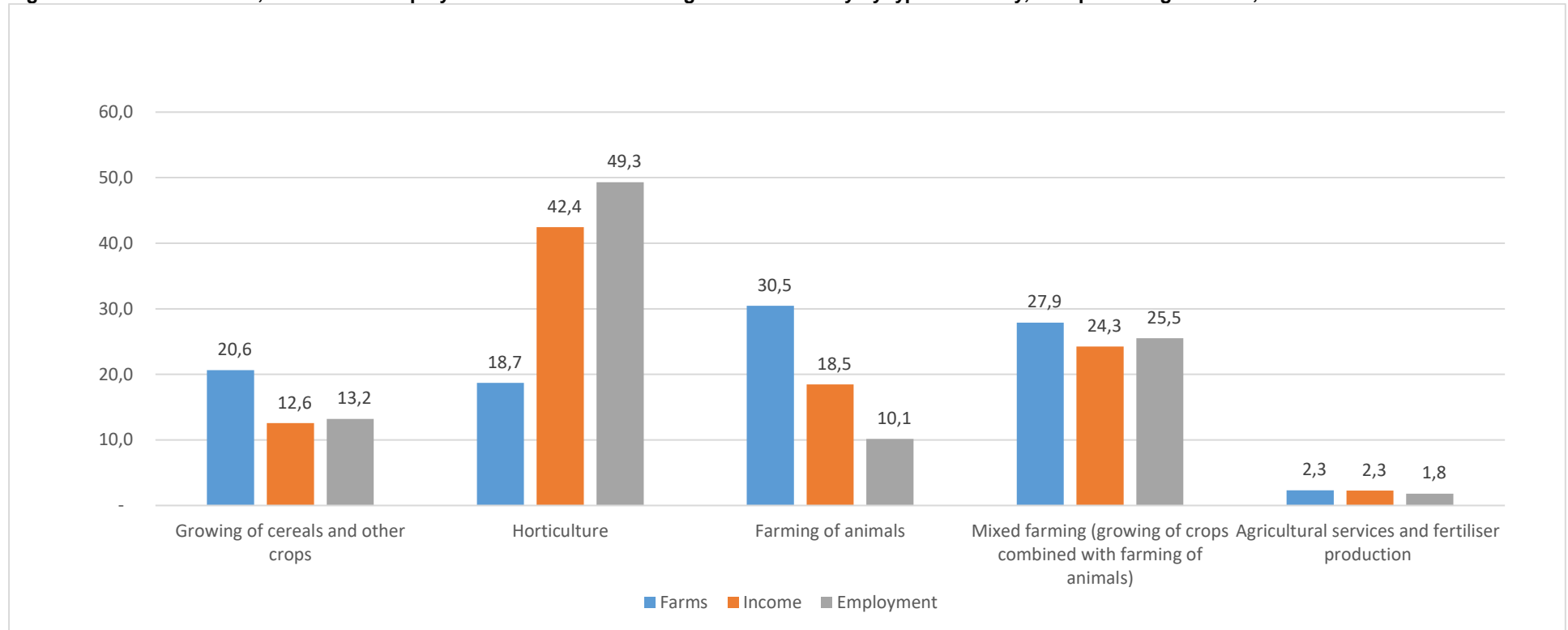
Figure 1 - Number of farms, income and employment in the commercial agriculture industry by farm size, as a percentage of total, 2017



In 2017, 263 large farms (those with annual income of more than R22,5 million) constituted 8,6% of the total number of farms in the commercial agriculture industry, and accounted for 75,0% of total income and 59,8% of total employment. This was in contrast to the 1 516 micro farms (annual income below R1 million) which made up 49,6% of the total number of farms, but which accounted for just 1,6% of total income and 8,1% of total employment. Taken together, there were 1 141 large, medium and small farms in 2017, with combined shares of 37,4% of the number of farms, 96,5% of income, and 88,2% of employment.

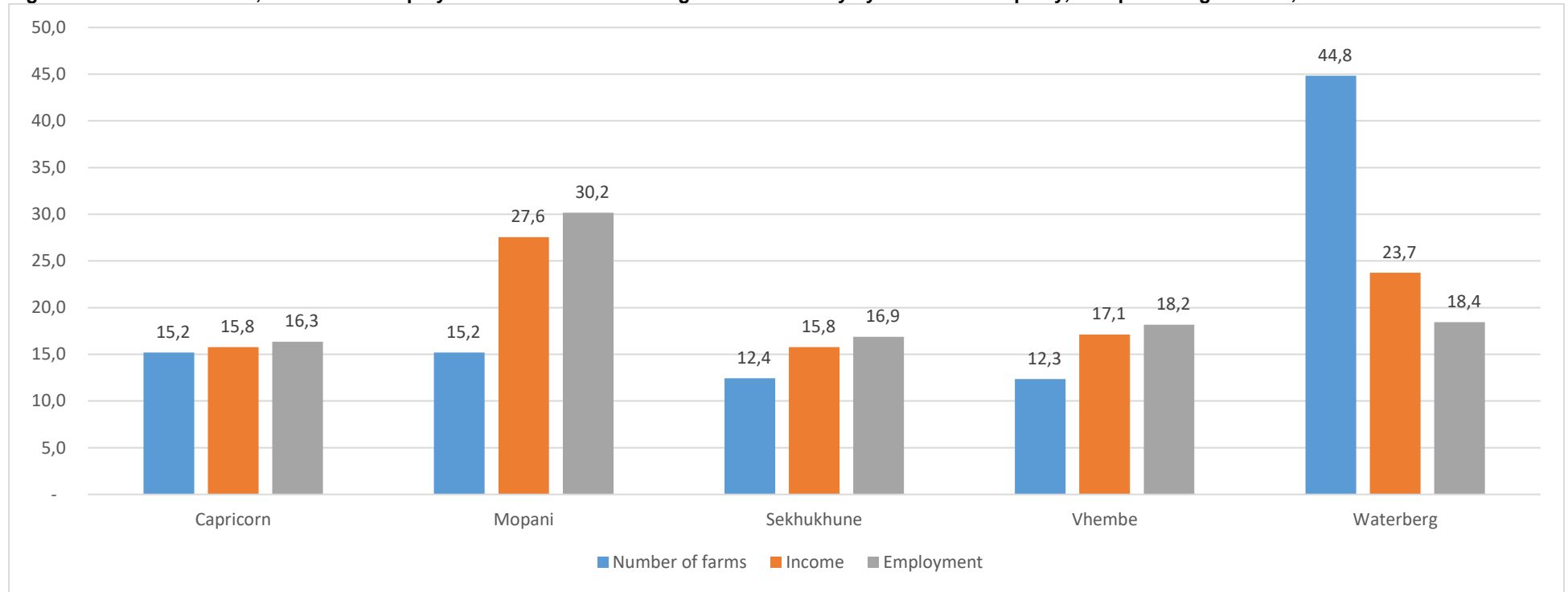
Measured by farm size, small farming units were the second largest in terms of number of farms, income and employment in 2017.

Horticulture had the largest share of income (42,4%) and employment (49,3%) in 2017. Farming of animals had the largest share of number of farms (27,9%), while mixed farming had the second largest share in all three categories shown in Figure 2 (27,9% of number of farms, 24,3% of income and 25,5% of employment).

Waterberg district municipality recorded the largest provincial share of the number of farms (44,8%) and the second largest share of income (23,7%) and employment (18,4%). Mopani had the largest share of income (27,6%) and employment (30,2%).

Of the total income of R31,4 billion in the commercial agriculture industry in 2017, R26,9 billion was derived directly from agricultural activities, which is herein referred to as gross farming income. The horticultural products category was the biggest contributor to gross farming income with 60,5% of the provincial total, followed by animals and animal products (22,9%). Horticultural products accounted for 87,7% of gross farming income in the Mopani district municipality, and animals and animal products accounted for 10,5%.

2.2 Land use

On 30 September 2018, the total land used for commercial agriculture in Limpopo was 1,7 million hectares, which represents 13,7% of the total land area of Limpopo (12,6 million hectares). Commercial agricultural land in Limpopo comprised mainly grazing land (1,2 million hectares) and arable land (0,4 million hectares). Grazing land is used for livestock and game farming, and arable land is used for crop production.

The Waterberg district accounted for the largest share of Limpopo's commercial agricultural land (52,6%), followed by Capricorn (20,2%), Vhembe (13,0%) and Mopani (8,5%). Sekhukhune district (5,8%) recorded the smallest share.

Regarding grazing land, over 80% was located in three districts, namely Waterberg (53,9%), Capricorn (21,1%) and Vhembe (14,7%). Four districts accounted for over 90% of arable land, namely Waterberg (42,4%), Capricorn (18,6%), Mopani (17,7%) and Sekhukhune (11,8%).

2.3 Field crops

Field crops are important for food security, and they account for the largest portion of cultivated land in South Africa. In terms of area planted, the major field crops in both 2007 and 2017 were sunflower seeds, maize and wheat. Sunflower seeds (97,6% of sunflower seeds) were mostly planted under dry land in both years, i.e. their main source of water was rain. In the case of wheat, dry land dominated in 2007 but irrigation dominated in 2017.

Between 2007 and 2017, sunflower seed production increased by 47% (from 40 thousand to 59 thousand tons); there was an increase in the volume of production per hectare (from 1,1 to 1,5 tons). Waterberg district produced 99,5% of sunflower seeds in Limpopo province in 2017.

Maize production decreased by 47% (from 147 thousand to 77 thousand tons) between 2007 and 2017. Two districts accounted for over 95% of the province's total in 2017, namely Waterberg (57,9%) and Sekhukhune (39,0%).

Although the area planted for wheat decreased between 2007 and 2017, production increased by 13% (from 42 thousand to 48 thousand tons). This was due to an increase in the volume of production per hectare. Two districts accounted for almost 99% of the province's wheat production in 2017, namely Waterberg (65,4%) and Sekhukhune (33,2%).

2.4 Horticultural crops

2.4.1 Vegetables

The major vegetables in terms of production were potatoes, tomatoes and onions. Potatoes and onions showed an increase in area planted between 2007 and 2017, while tomatoes showed a decline.

Regarding production, there were increases of 76% in potatoes (from 274 thousand to 482 thousand tons) and 162% in onions (from 60 thousand to 158 thousand tons) between 2007 and 2017. Tomato production declined by 0,1%.

Over 85% of potatoes in Limpopo province were produced in two districts in 2017, namely Capricorn (70,2%) and Waterberg (16,4%). In 2017 the three leading districts in tomato production were Vhembe (53,2% of the province's total), Capricorn (27,1%) and Mopani (12,1%). The bulk of the province's onions was produced in Waterberg (76,1%) and Capricorn (23,4%) in 2017.

The largest proportions of all three major vegetables were sold through fresh produce markets in 2017. These were the largest marketing channel for potatoes (82,5%), tomatoes (47,9%) and onions (92,4%).

2.5 Fruits

2.5.1 Citrus fruits

Citrus fruits continue to play an important role in the economy, with strong links to packaging, processing and distribution in the agriculture value chain. Oranges still have the largest area planted between 2007 and 2017.

Regarding production, oranges increased by 33% between 2007 and 2017 (from 516 thousand to 688 thousand tons) and lemons by 926% (from 16 thousand to 162 thousand tons).

The three leading districts in orange production were Mopani (50,2% of the province's total), Sekhukhune (33,7%) and Vhembe (10,2%) in 2017. Three districts produced 91,7% of the province's lemons: Sekhukhune (40,6%), Mopani (34,3%) and Vhembe (16,8%) in 2017. More than half (54,4%) of the grapefruit in Limpopo was produced in the Vhembe district in 2017.

Most of the 2017 production of oranges (68,4%), lemons (73,0%) and grapefruit (81,6%) was exported. The second largest marketing/distribution channel for oranges (20,7%), lemons (16,4%) and grapefruit (14,2%) was through processing factories.

2.5.2 Subtropical fruits

The cultivation of subtropical fruits is only possible in certain parts of the country due to the nature of their climatic requirements. Between 2007 and 2017, banana production decreased by 7% (from 44 thousand to 41 thousand tons). Compared with 2007, bananas showed a decrease in volume of production per hectare in 2017.

Bananas were produced mostly in the Vhembe district (80,3% of the provincial total) in 2017, and the two leading districts in avocado production were Mopani (69,6%) and Vhembe (27,2%). Over 90% of the province's mangos were produced in the Mopani district.

Over half of the banana production (56,2%) was sold to fresh produce markets in 2017, while 43,3% of the avocado production was exported. Over half of mangos produced in Limpopo were sold to processing factories in 2017.

2.5.3 Tree nuts

There was substantial growth in the tree nut industry between 2007 and 2017. Macadamia nuts grew by 91,6% in terms of area planted and by 13,4% in terms of production (production per hectare decreased). Pecan nuts grew more than 10 times in terms of production, driven by increases in area planted and production per hectare.

The two leading districts in macadamia nut production in 2017 were Vhembe (69,7% of the province's total) and Mopani (29,2%). Most of the province's pecan nuts were produced in Vhembe (71,3%) and Waterberg (14,3%).

Over half of pecan nuts (51,7%) were sold to processing factories in 2017, and 62,9% of macadamia nuts were exported.

2.6 Animals

Cattle, pigs and chickens are the most reared animals in commercial agriculture in Limpopo.

Between 2007 and 2017, the number of cattle sold decreased by 45% (from 216 thousand to 120 thousand). The leading districts in cattle sales in 2017 were Capricorn (55,4% of the province's total) and Waterberg (30,8%). The number of cattle on farm in the province fell by 47% (from 320 thousand to 170 thousand) between 2007 and 2018.

There was an increase of 24% (from 219 thousand to 272 thousand) in the number of pigs sold between 2007 and 2017. Pigs were sold mainly in the Waterberg district (81,9%) in 2017. Between 2007 and 2018, the number of pigs on farm increased by 78% (from 111 thousand to 198 thousand). Waterberg (87,2%) had the highest number of pigs on farm in 2018.

The number of chickens sold decreased by 64% (from 68 million to 25 million) between 2007 and 2017. Similarly, the number of chickens on farm in the province decreased by 90% (from 23 million to 2 million) between 2007 and 2018. In 2017, the largest number of chicken sales took place in the Mopani district (80,2%). In 2018, Waterberg (40,4%), Mopani (35,4%) and Sekhukhune (12,2%) reported the largest number of chickens on farm.

Explanatory notes**Background**

The results presented in this publication have been derived from the Census of Commercial Agriculture (CoCA), 2017 – Limpopo. This publication summarises data on the size, structure and nature of the commercial agriculture industry.

The frame was drawn from Stats SA's business register. The business register is mainly based on the value added tax (VAT) database of the South African Revenue Service (SARS).

The last CoCA was conducted for the year 2007 (Report No. 11-02-10 (2007)).

Value added tax (VAT)

All figures exclude value added tax (VAT).

Reference period

The information was collected from enterprises for their financial year which ended on any date between 01 March 2018 and 28 February 2019.

Statistical unit

The statistical unit is an enterprise. An enterprise is a legal unit (or a combination of legal units) that includes and directly controls all functions necessary to carry out its production activities.

Collection unit

The collection unit is a farming unit. A farming unit consists of one or more farms, holdings or pieces of land, whether adjacent or not, operated as a single unit and situated within the same local municipality. Thus, an enterprise can have one or more farming units.

Classification

The 1993 edition of the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), Fifth Edition, Report No. 09-09-02, was used to classify the statistical units in this census. The SIC is based on the third revision of the 1990 International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC), with suitable adaptations for local conditions. Farming sectors included were classified to the five-digit (subgroup) level for the detailed results.

Size groups

The enterprises are divided into four size groups according to the value of turnover recorded for them on the Stats SA business register. Table J presents the cut-off points for size groups.

Survey methodology and design

Initially, telephones were used to contact enterprises and update their information on the frame in terms of specific agriculture activity and location. Enterprises were given an option of either self-enumeration or a visit by a Stats SA official. CAPI (Computer Assisted Personal Interview), on both tablet and desktop, was used to conduct the interview and/or capture the data.

Collection rate

Collection rate = ((collected enterprises + finalised investigations) / sample size) * 100. The collection rate was 76,9%.

Farm operator/ manager	This is the person who exercises management control over the agricultural holding operation and takes major decisions regarding the use of resources.
Farming unit	A farming unit consists of one or more farms, holdings or pieces of land, whether adjacent or not, operated as a single unit and situated within the same local municipality.
Field crops	Includes grains, oil seeds, legumes, fodder crops and other field crops (e.g. cotton, sugarcane and tobacco).
Fodder crops	Includes grass, lucerne and maize for silage.
Game	Includes elephant, buffalo, rhino, springbok, impala, wildebeest, kudu, zebra, lion, leopard and cheetah.
Grains	Includes maize (white & yellow), wheat, sorghum, barley, oats and rye.
Gross farming income	Includes income earned from agricultural products sold, but excludes other income generated outside farming.
Imports	Inward flow of goods and services entering the economic territory of a country from the outside world.
Legumes	Includes beans and peas.
Livestock	Includes cattle (beef and dairy breeds), sheep (wool and non-wool breeds), pigs, goats (meat, milk and mohair breeds), horses and poultry (chickens, turkeys, ducks, ostriches and geese) etc.
Livestock products	Includes eggs, honey, meat, milk, hides and skins.
Oil seeds	Includes sunflower, groundnuts, canola and soya beans.
