## 1. Introduction

This publication updates Statistical Release P6101 'Wholesale Trade Industry 2005' and adds the details of value of sales per commodity. The financial information has been revised following the re-classification of some enterprises. Further financial tables have been added (opening inventory, closing inventory, details of sales and purchases, assets and liabilities).

Estimates are presented in respect of the 2005 wholesale trade large sample survey (LSS). The 2005 wholesale trade LSS collected data from a sample of 1776 enterprises drawn from a sampling frame of 19566 which were operating between 1 July 2004 and 30 June 2005. The sample was stratified in such a way that all large enterprises (with annual income exceeding R64 million) were included. Data were collected at the 4-digit SIC level of classification of enterprises and on 99 commodities.

The statistical unit for the collection of information is an enterprise. An enterprise is a legal unit (or a combination of legal units) that includes and directly controls all functions necessary to carry out its production activities. Each enterprise is classified to an industry that reflects its predominant activity. The estimates are presently published only at national level.

There has been no previous census or large sample survey in the wholesale trade industry in South Africa.

### 1.1 Scope and coverage

The 2005 wholesale trade large sample survey covers enterprises registered in the taxation system that are mainly engaged in the resale (sale without transformation) of new and used goods to retailers; to industrial, commercial, institutional or professional users; or to other wholesalers; or acting as agents or brokers in buying merchandise for or selling merchandise to such persons or firms. The survey includes enterprises involved in the following detailed wholesale trade activities
(i) Wholesale trade on a fee or contract basis (SIC 6110).
(ii) Agricultural raw materials and livestock (SIC 6121).
(iii) Food, beverages and tobacco (SIC 6122).
(iv) Textiles, clothing and footwear (SIC 6131)
(v) Other household goods (SIC 6139).
(vi) Solid, liquid and gaseous fuels and related products (SIC 6141).
(vii) Metals and metal ores (SIC 6142).
(viii) Construction materials, hardware, plumbing and heating equipment and supplies (SIC 6143).
(ix) Other intermediate products, waste and scrap (SIC 6149)
(x) Machinery, equipment and supplies (SIC 6150).
(xi) General and other wholesale trade (SIC 6190).

The following activities are excluded:
$>\quad$ Sale of farmers' products by farmers (SIC 11).
$>\quad$ Manufacture and sale of manufactured goods (SIC 3).
$>\quad$ Sale (retail and wholesale) of motor vehicles, motor cycles and their parts and of fuel for these items (SIC 63).
$>\quad$ Sale of food and drinks for consumption on the premises and sale of take-away foods (SIC 6420).
$>\quad$ Renting and hiring of motor vehicles, machinery and equipment and personal and household goods (SIC 85).
$>\quad$ Handling and storage activities of businesses (SIC 74).
$>\quad$ Repair and maintenance of office machinery and computers (SIC 86).
$>\quad$ Repair of machinery, which is classified under manufacturing along with the manufacture of the relevant type of machinery.

### 1.2 Data items

The following categories of data items were collected: industrial classification, details of employment, trading income, expenditure, profit or loss, inventories, book value of assets, and details of sales of goods (commodities).

### 1.3 Reference period

The questionnaires were completed for the financial year of the enterprise which ends on any date between 1 July 2004 and 30 June 2005 , according to the usual reporting schedule of the enterprise.

- 1 October 2003-30 September 2004
- 1 January 2004-31 December 2004
- 1 February 2004 - 31 January 2005
- 1 March 2004 - 28 February 2005
- 1 April 2004-31 March 2005


### 1.4 Current prices

The rand values are at current prices.

### 1.5 Reliability of data

All estimates compiled for this industry are subject to both sampling and non-sampling errors.
The estimates presented in this publication are subject to sampling variability since they are based on information obtained from a sample. They may therefore differ from the figures that would have been produced if the data had been obtained from all enterprises in the wholesale industry in South Africa. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error (SE), which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of enterprises was used. The relative standard error (RSE) provides an immediate indication of the percentage errors likely to have occurred due to sampling, and thus avoids the need to refer to the size of the estimate. The larger the RSE, the less reliable the estimate.

The following are some of the likely sources of non-sampling errors: sampling frame not-up-to date, wrong definitions and classification, phrasing of questions, nonresponse, processing and estimation. Every effort is made to minimise non-sampling errors by careful design of questionnaires, testing them in pilot studies, editing reported data and implementing efficient operating procedures. Non-sampling errors occur in both sample surveys and censuses.

### 1.6 Confidentiality

According to Section 17 of the Statistics Act, 1999 (Act No. 6 of 1999), completed questionnaires remain confidential to Statistics South Africa (Stats SA). Individual business information is never disclosed. Results are presented in aggregated form only.

### 1.7 Related publications

Stats SA conducts a monthly survey on wholesale trade. That survey is used mainly to monitor trends and provides estimates at less detailed levels of SIC than the wholesale trade large sample surveys.

### 1.8 Revisions

Estimates for the principal financial statistics in manufacturing, wholesale and retail industries for 2005 were originally published in October 2006 (P3001 Manufacturing industry 2005; P6101 Wholesale trade industry 2005; and P6201 Retail trade industry 2005). The estimates for total income were: manufacturing R926 513 million, wholesale R537 516 million and retail R312 264 million, with a total of R1 776293 million.

Analysis of products and commodities within these industries led to the re-classification of some enterprises and consequent revision of the estimates. The revised estimates are: manufacturing R943 793 million, wholesale R530 868 million and retail R304 360 million, with a total of R1 779021 million. Most reclassifications took place between manufacturing, wholesale and retail, but the net gain in total income reflects the reclassification to manufacturing of some enterprises outside of wholesale and retail.

## 2. Background to the Programme of large sample surveys

The large sample surveys serve to document comprehensively the nature and structure of all industries within the economy.
Previously, Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) periodically conducted industry censuses i.e. collections covering all entities known to be mainly engaged in particular sectors. The last industry 'census' was conducted for the manufacturing sector in 1996. Since then, Stats SA has replaced industry censuses with periodic 'large sample surveys' of industry sectors. These surveys are based on larger samples than the sub-annual and annual surveys. They do not attempt to completely enumerate all entities within the industry scope of the surveys, but are based on stratified random samples which are representative of the survey population.

### 2.1 Purpose and uses of large sample surveys

The large sample survey results are used in constructing and refreshing supply/use tables, and for benchmarking Gross Domestic Product and its components, as well as production and price indices, and annual and short-term statistical series.

Users of the large sample surveys programme include the following:

- Price statisticians, particularly in refreshing the commodity basket of producer price indices.
- Policy advisers in government for monitoring the performance of industries and their contribution to the South African economy and evaluating the effectiveness of industry policies.
- Industry associations monitoring trends in their own and competing or complementary industries in order to inform their members of market changes.
- Individual businesses using the data to analyse their performance relative to their industry.


### 2.2 Scope and coverage

This programme covers enterprises registered in the taxation system (VAT and income tax) that are mainly engaged in the following industries as defined in the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC):

- Mining and quarrying

Manufacturing
Electricity, gas and water supply

- Construction

Wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles, motor cycles and personal and household goods, and hotels and restaurants

- Transport, storage and communication
- Financial intermediation, insurance, real estate and business services
- Community, social and personal services (except national, provincial and local government activities)

Note: The agriculture, forestry, fishing, hunting and related services industry (SIC 1) is not included as it is covered by a separate program within Statistics South Africa. Similarly, the public administration and defence activities industry (SIC 92), the financial intermediation industry (SIC 81) and insurance and pension funding industry (SIC 82) are covered by other programmes both within Stats SA and elsewhere (e.g. South African Reserve Bank).

### 3.1 Income

The total income for the wholesale trade industry in 2005 was R530 868 million (Figure 1). The three largest types of wholesaler contributed 50,3\% of income: 'Machinery, equipment and supplies' (R91 744 million or 17,2\%), followed by 'Food, beverages and tobacco' (R88 713 million or $16,7 \%$ ) and 'Fuels and related products' (R86 656 million or 16,4\%).

### 3.1.1 Sources of income

Income from sales of goods contributed R504 050 million, or $95,0 \%$ of the total income. 'Fuels and related products', 'Food, beverages and tobacco' and 'Machinery, equipment and supplies' were the major contributors to total income (Figure 2).

### 3.1.2 Income by enterprise size



Analysis of income by enterprise size indicates that Large enterprises (those with turnover greater than R64 million) earned 73,0\% (or R387 623 million) of the total income (Figure 3).


The large enterprises are particularly dominant in 'Fuels and related products' and in 'Metal and metal ores'. Small and micro enterprises contributed more than 50\% of total income in 'Wholesale trade on a fee or contract basis' (Figure 4).

### 3.1.3 Extent of concentration

The 20 largest enterprises contributed $26,3 \%$ of the total income of the wholesale trade sector (Figure 5). The contribution of the five largest enterprises ranges from $8,0 \%$ of total income in this industry for 'Wholesale trade on a fee or contract basis' to $81,6 \%$ for 'Fuels and related products'.

### 3.1.4. Income (Value traded) by commodity

The commodity group with the largest value of sales was 'Food, beverages and tobacco' with R96 052 million (19,1\%) (Figure 6), followed by 'Machinery, equipment and supplies' with R90 055 million (17,9\%) and 'Fuels and related products' with R88 830 million (17,6\%).

The commodity which contributed most to income from sales was 'Petroleum and petroleum products' with R81 125 million (16,1\%) (Table B), followed by 'Grain and seeds’ with R22 831 million (4,5\%), 'Computers and related equipment' with R21 491 million (4,3\%) and 'Industrial machinery, equipment and supplies' with R15 963 million (3,2\%).

The total expenditure for the wholesale trade industry in 2005 was R511 743 million. Expenditure by type of wholesaler was highly correlated with income, and as for income the three largest contributors were 'Machinery, equipment and supplies' (R87 725 million or 17,1\%), 'Food, beverages and tobacco' (R86 151 million or 16,8\%) and 'Fuels and related products' (R82 461 million or 16,1\%) (Figure 7).

### 3.2.1 Composition of expenditure

The total expenditure was primarily made up of purchases (R411 443 million or $80,5 \%$ ), followed by salaries and wages (R37 322 million or 7,3\%).

### 3.2.2 Salaries and wages

Gross salaries and wages paid to employees in 2005 amounted to R37 322 million. Employees employed in 'Machinery, equipment and supplies' accounted for the largest proportion of salaries and wages paid (R12 091 million or 32,4\%), followed by 'Other household goods’ (R5 586 million or $15,1 \%$ ), 'General and other wholesale trade' (R4 907 million or $12,9 \%$ ) and 'Food, beverages and tobacco' (R3 673 million or 9,9\%)

Net profit before tax is computed as income plus closing stocks minus expenditure minus opening stocks. For 2005, net profit before tax was R25 180 million. The largest contributor to the net profit before tax was 'Fuels and related products' (R6 038 million or 24,0\%), followed by 'Machinery, equipment and supplies' (R5 477 million or 21,8\%) and 'Other household goods' (R3 834 million or 15,2\%) (Figure 8).

### 3.4 Profit margin

The profit margin (net profit before tax as a percentage of turnover) for the wholesale trade industry was $3,5 \%$. Wholesalers trading in 'Fuels and related products' had the highest profit margin at $5,9 \%$, followed by 'Textiles, clothing and footwear' at 5,8\% and 'Construction materials and hardware' at 5,3\%.

### 3.5 Employment

The total number of persons employed in the wholesale trade industry at end June 2005 was 424 560. 'Machinery, equipment and supplies' employed the largest number of persons ( 85809 or $20,3 \%$ ), followed by 'Food, beverages and tobacco' (82 585 or 19,4\%), 'General and other wholesale trade' (79 156 or 18,3\%), and 'Other household goods' (47 706 or $11,4 \%$ ).


Although they earned less than 30\% of the income, medium, small and micro enterprises (those with annual turnover between R0,3 million and R64 million) employed 62,7\% (266 002 workers) of the workers in the industry (Figure 9).

The mean income generated per person employed was R1,3 million, ranging from R0,5 million in 'Wholesale trade on a fee or contract basis' to R13,1 million in 'Fuels and related products'.

### 3.5.2 Employment by gender

The proportion of females in the workforce was $37,1 \%$, ranging from 22,9\% in 'Metals and metal ores' to $53,9 \%$ in 'Food, beverages and tobacco' (Figure 10).

Permanent employees made up 75,0\% of the workforce. In large enterprises, $68,1 \%$ of employees were permanent, while in medium, small and micro enterprises $78,8 \%$ were permanent.

### 3.6 Capital expenditure on new assets


Capital expenditure on new assets amounted to R7 906 million. The largest capital expenditure on new assets was by wholesalers of 'Fuel and related products' (R2 344 million or $29,6 \%$ ) followed by 'Machinery, equipment and supplies' (R2 090 million or 26,4\%), 'Food, beverages and tobacco' (R1 085 million or 13,7\%) and 'General and other wholesale' (R745 million or $9,5 \%$ ) (Figure 11). The largest expenditure was on 'Plant, machinery and equipment' (R3 957 million or 50,4\%) followed by 'Land, buildings and construction' (R1 766 million or $22,1 \%$ ).

The results presented in this publication have been derived from the 2005 Large Sample Survey of wholesale trade. This is a periodic survey which measures economic activity in the wholesale trade sector of the South African economy. This survey is based on a sample of private and public enterprises operating in wholesale trade industries.

The sample was drawn from Stats SA's business register. The business register is based mainly on the income tax (IT) and value-added tax (VAT) databases of the South African Revenue Service (SARS). All enterprises are legally bound to register for either VAT or IT or both Enterprises registered in the taxation system are included on the business register, and hence were given a chance of selection in the sample for the survey.

All figures exclude Value Added Tax (VAT).
The information was collected from enterprises for their financial year, which ended on any date between 1 July 2004 and 30 June 2005.
Results of the survey are used within Stats SA for compiling the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and its components. These statistics are also used by government policy advisers in monitoring the performance and contribution of individual industries to the South African economy and the effectiveness of industry policies, and by private sector users in analyses of comparative business and industry performance.

The 1993 edition of the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), Fifth Edition, Report No. 09-09-02, was used to classify the statistical units in the survey. The SIC is based on the 1990 International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC) with suitable adaptations for local conditions. Statistics in this publication are presented at SIC division (four-digit) level. Each enterprise is classified to an industry, which reflects its predominant activity.

The statistical unit for the collection of the information is an enterprise. An enterprise is a legal unit (or a combination of legal units) that includes and directly controls all functions necessary to carry out its production activities.

Size groups
The enterprises are divided into four size groups according to the value of turnover recorded for them on the Stats SA business register. Large enterprises are those with an annual recorded turnover of R64 million and above. Table 14 presents the size groups defined using the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) cut-off points.

A sample of approximately 1800 enterprises was drawn using stratified simple random sampling. The enterprises were first stratified at the fourdigit level according to the SIC and then by size of enterprises. All large enterprises are completely enumerated. Turnover as recorded on the business register was used as the measure of size for stratification.

## Weighting methodology

Relative standard error

For those strata not completely enumerated, the weights to produce estimates are the inverse ratio of the sampling fraction, modified to take account of non-response in the survey. Stratum estimates are calculated and then aggregated with the completely enumerated stratum to form division estimates.

Data presented in this publication are based on information obtained from a sample and are, therefore, subject to sampling variability; that is, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if the data had been obtained from all enterprises in the wholesale industry in South Africa.

One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error (SE), which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of enterprises was used. The relative standard error (RSE) provides an immediate indication of the percentage errors likely to have occurred as a result of sampling, and thus avoids the need to refer to the size of the estimate.

Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as non-sampling errors. Every effort is made to minimise non-sampling errors by careful design of questionnaires, testing them in pilot studies, editing reported data and implementing efficient operating procedures. Non-sampling errors occur in both sample surveys and censuses.
