The survey

Large sample survey covering approximately **4 500** enterprises registered for value-added tax (VAT) Enterprises involved in the following activities were selected:

- Education services
- Hospitals
- Medical & dental activities
- Veterinaries
- Social work
- Sewage & refuse disposal
- Business & employers organisations
- Professional organisations
- Trade unions
- Religious organisations

- Motion picture/video production & distribution
- Motion picture projections
- Radio & television
- Dramatic arts, music & other arts
- Libraries, archives & museums
- Sporting activities
- Washing & dry cleaning
- Hairdressing & other beauty treatment
- Funeral & related activities
- News agency activities
- Botanical & zoological gardens and nature reserve activities







The survey



- Questionnaires were completed for the financial year ended on any date between 1 July 2022 and 30 June 2023
- Employment figures are for 30 June 2023
- The survey was also conducted in 2008 and 2018








Financial summary

In 2023, the personal services industry generated R688 billion in income, up from R381 billion in 2018

Recreation, health and education accounted for the bulk of total income

Income by type of activity in the personal services industry, 2023 Total: R687,9 billion

Recreation, culture & sport R252,2bn 36,7%

Health & social work R241,0bn 35,0% Education services R145,9bn 21,2%

Membership organisations R23,5bn 3,4% Sewage, refuse disposal & sanitation R15,8bn 2,3%

Other R9,4bn 1,4%



Recreation, culture & sport has increased its share of income










Recreation, culture & sport recorded the sharpest rise in income








Personal services is less concentrated than retail trade, but more concentrated than accommodation

Concentration ratios for selected industries in the South African formal business sector The percentage of income in each industry generated by the **five largest firms**










The overall profit margin for the personal services industry declined in 2023 compared with 2018





















The labour force grew by 2,5% annually since 2018










Which activities gained or lost jobs?










Health & social work accounted for 44,6% of the personal services workforce in 2023












Women occupied 63% of jobs in the personal services industry










Health & social work accounted for 35,0% of income and 44,6% of employment










SMMEs accounted for 27,3% of income and 44,4% of employment













Breakdown of income from services rendered: Education services










Breakdown of income from services rendered: **Health services**










Breakdown of income from services rendered: **Social work**









Breakdown of income from services rendered: Sewage, refuse disposal & sanitation










Breakdown of income from services rendered: **Membership activities**










Breakdown of income from services rendered: **Entertainment**










Breakdown of income from services rendered: Libraries, archives, museums, historical sites, botanical gardens & nature reserves










Breakdown of income from services rendered: Sporting & other recreational activities










Breakdown of income from services rendered: Other service activities










Bookmaker & online gambling services recorded the most significant rise in the 2018–2023 period

Overview (2023) The industry generated R688 billion in income, representing a rise of 12,5% annually since 2018. 'Recreation, culture & sport' grew the fastest, accounting for the bulk of total income in 2023. At a more granular level, 'bookmaker and online gambling services' recorded the largest rise in income since 2018. The personal services industry has become more concentrated. The overall profit margin for the personal services industry declined in 2023 compared with 2018. The workforce grew by 2,5% annually since 2018, with education services and health & social work creating the most jobs.

• In 2023, women occupied almost two-thirds of jobs in the personal services industry.
