




Figure 1: age-sex distribution of Tafelkop



The pyramid above indicates that the number of male and females are equally distributed between the ages 0-24. The number of females were higher that males from 25-74. The figure further illustrate that there are no males aged 75 or above in Tafelkop.

Tafelkop is a main place under Elias Motsoaledi municipality, in Greater Sekhukhune District. Tafelkop has 7 788 households, 21% of the households use water vendor as their source of water. The same proportion obtains water from boreholes. 14% of the households obtain water from river/stream while 11% of the households uses water scheme operated by municipality as a source of water.

Figure 3: Proportion of no access to piped water in Elias Motsoaledi




Figure 3 indicates that places such as Phookwane, Five Morgan, Nkadimeng including Tafelkop have higher percentages of households with no access to piped water ranging between 60% to 100%, whilst some surrounding areas such as Motetema, Dikgalaopeng and Klipbank have access to piped water.





Figure 4: Access to water in Tafelkop

The pie chart above indicates the percentage of households who have access to piped water in Tafelkop. A relatively high proportion of households have no access to piped water 68% and 18% have piped water inside yard while 14% have access to piped water on community stand.


