

Falling prices: the good, the better, and the best



Happily for consumers, the data show that there are items for which prices have actually come down, if we compare figures from August 2017 with those recorded in January 2017.

For those of you that prefer your greens, it might come as some comfort to learn that vegetable prices fell by 3,6% in the first eight months of this year, after rising rapidly in the second half of 2015 to peak in early 2016.

Lettuce, tomatoes, pumpkins and potatoes in particular will provide some cash relief to your healthy lifestyle.



Which provinces lead in health spending?

Updated information in Stats SA's latest Financial statistics of provincial government sets the healthcare bill for provincial government at R150 billion for 2015/16.

This translates to R3 332 spent per person for the 45 million who do not have medical aid cover.

By province, the Northern Cape government comes out as the top healthcare spender, setting the bar at R4 082 per person in 2015/16. Western Cape takes second spot, followed by Free State and KwaZulu-Natal.
