



# Want to know how your taxes are spent?


Here is a breakdown of government spending for 2015/16. Did you know that more money was spent on servicing debt than on tertiary education, and more on defence than on environmental protection?

According to the latest *Financial statistics of consolidated general government* report, general services accounted for a quarter of government spending.

Within this, debt payments accounted for 9% (of the total) and executive, legislative and financial services accounted for 12%. The latter includes the funding of general government services provided by institutions such as SARS, the National Treasury and parliament.

Not surprisingly, big priorities for government are education and social protection (which includes the payment of social grants). Together these two items contributed 32% of total spending.




# Taking stock of eggs-orbitant prices

Fancy an omelette in the morning? The prices of eggs have been on the rise, with reported shortages across the country.

A tray of 18 eggs, for example, is 8,5% more expensive than it was a year ago, rising from an average price of R36,96 to R40,11.

Data from Stats SA's latest *Consumer Price Index (CPI)* release also shows that your frittata will cost you less in KwaZulu-Natal than other parts of the country. A tray of 18 eggs is cheapest in that province.
