




The tourism sector directly contributed 2,9% to the South African gross domestic product (GDP) in 2016, according to the latest release of Stats SA's *Tourism Satellite Account for South Africa* report.

This makes the tourism sector a larger contributor than agriculture, but smaller than other industries such as construction and mining.

Despite the challenges that tourism has endured over the last few years, it outperformed other key industries in terms of job creation, adding just over 40 000 net new jobs to the economy over the five-year period from 2012 to 2016.

This is higher than the number of jobs gained in industries such as trade and utilities (electricity, gas and water).

Where is economic activity concentrated?

South African agriculture activity occurs mostly in Western Cape and KwaZulu-Natal, according to provincial gross domestic product (GDP) figures released recently by Stats SA.

Notice how mining production is concentrated in the provinces of North West, Limpopo and Mpumalanga?

Gauteng shows its economic dominance. Eight of the ten industries are heavily concentrated in that province.
