



Stats SA's ability to publish official statistics will be impacted by the lockdown announced by President Ramaphosa.

As most businesses will be closed over that period, and movement will be restricted, data collection for both economic and household surveys will not be possible.

We will communicate in detail any data quality related issues as they arise. On the social statistics side, the current pandemic will not impact on the March to May releases as this fieldwork has already been completed.

Farmers sold over a billion chickens in 2017


This is one of many interesting facts to emerge from Stats SA's latest set of reports on the 2017 Census of Commercial Agriculture.

The beauty of the data that it allows researchers to drill down and explore patterns across districts and local municipalities.

For example, if a natural disaster happened in Gauteng's West Rand district, 31% of the nation's carrot crop would be at risk.

Also, the data show that sheep in the Pixley ka Seme district in Northern Cape outnumber people six-to-one!

Where do Millennials dominate?


Much has been discussed about Millennials, those belonging to the generation of individuals born between 1980 and 1999.

A recent report from Stats SA explores the labour and education outcomes of this generation.

Geographically, the province with the highest percentage of Millennials was Gauteng (39,7%), followed by Mpumalanga (35,8%), Western Cape (35,5%) and KwaZulu-Natal (35%).

Eastern Cape's population had the lowest proportion of Millennials.


