



Consumer inflation rises to four-month high


Annual CPI inflation quickened to 3,2% in July from 2,2% in June as lockdown restrictions continued to ease.

The monthly increase of 1,3% was driven largely by fuel prices and municipal tariffs. Motorists felt some pain as the price of inland 95-octane petrol climbed from R13,40 per litre in June to R15,12 per litre in July.

Municipalities increased tariffs and municipal rates. The increases, though, were lower than the increases recorded in July 2019.

Funeral expenses increased sharply in July, rising by 8,7% year-on-year. This is far higher than the 1,1% annual rise recorded in April. Prices for gravestones were up by 3,2% in July, higher than April's 0,3%.
