


Say hello to SA's National Natural Capital Accounting Strategy

Think of how, as a country, we keep account of the population and the economy. We conduct surveys to track social outcomes. We use a system of national (economic) accounts to track economic performance.

To manage our natural resources and ecosystems, we need to know how much of a particular resource we have (stock), and how quickly it is being used up (flow). Natural Capital Accounting (NCA) is a system that keeps track of a country's stocks and flows of environmental resources and assets.

Stats SA, in collaboration with the South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI) and other government departments, published a national strategy for the production of natural capital accounts.





Building plans: Western Cape leads


Western Cape tops the list as the province that recorded the highest value of building plans passed in 2020.

The province contributed 31,3% (R23,4 billion) to the national total of R74,8 billion, as shown in the chart. Gauteng was in second place, contributing 30,5%.

Stats SA's latest annual release of its Selected building statistics of the private sector report provides a detailed breakdown of building plans passed and buildings completed, as reported by metropolitan municipalities and large local municipalities.

On a municipal level, Cape Town leads, contributing 21% (R15,9 billion) to the national total.




