



Municipal dependence on national government funding


Municipalities generate or receive income from two main sources: they can either actively generate their own income or, alternatively, other institutions (such as national government) can fund municipal budgets.

A municipality that generates a high proportion of its own income can bode well for its financial sustainability. It can also free up financial resources that government can use elsewhere.

As a group, municipalities self-generated 71% of their income in 2020, a rise of one percentage point from 70% in 2017.

Blue colour-coded municipalities in the map are those that recorded a rise in the share of selfgenerated income. Red colour-coded municipalities recorded a fall in the share of selfgenerated income.



Gauteng has the most civil summonses issued for debt


Gauteng recorded the highest number of civil summonses issued for debt in May 2021, accounting for 30% of the national total.

The province, which is the country's economic hub, recorded 12 958 summonses issued for debt in May, down from 13 482 recorded in April.

Western Cape registered the second highest number in May (9 291), followed by KwaZulu-Natal (7 509) and Free State (3 535).

Stats SA's *Statistics of civil cases for debt* reports on data received from magistrates' offices on civil cases for debt recorded, civil summonses issued and civil judgements recorded. These data provide insight into the extent of unpaid debt in South Africa.


