


Five facts about the electricity, gas & water supply industry (2019)

- South Africa produced less electricity in 2019 than it did in 2010
- 2. The industry employs fewer people that it did in 2016
- 3. Coal is still a dominant source of energy despite a significant increase in renewable electricity
- 4. Municipalities are the biggest customers
- 5. The industry recorded a financial loss in 2019








