



Feature article

This is how much land is protected in South Africa

In 2020, protected land accounted for 112 807 km² of the South African mainland. This includes land covered by National Parks, Nature Reserves and other conservation areas. To provide some perspective of scale, this is about the same size as Cuba. It's also larger than countries such as Portugal, Denmark and Lesotho.

The protected area estate covers 9,2% of the size of mainland South Africa. In other words, for every 100 square metres of land across the country, just over 9 square metres are protected and managed for biodiversity conservation. Click here to read more.
















The growth of protected areas in each province (1900 to 2020)



The growth of the protected area estate by province over the period 1900 to 2020 is shown below, based on declaration dates in the South African Protected Area Database (SAPAD). 
