
Property prices: Cape Town surges ahead

Anecdotes about steep property price rises in the City of Cape Town are not without merit. Stats SA's new residential property price index (RPPI) compares how housing prices have increased since 2010 across the eight metropolitan municipalities and nine provinces.

Since 2010, residential property prices have grown by 141% in the City of Cape Town, outstripping other metropolitan municipalities, many of them located along the escarpment. Can you spot the city that recorded the slowest growth?

Measuring changes in residential property prices are important on a global scale. Stats SA partnered with the South African Reserve Bank in 2018 to begin the process of creating a local version of the index. The new index will be published on a monthly basis within five months of the reference period.

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

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Provincial snapshot

Grassroots political representation remains low


The data visualisation team at Stats SA is always up for trying something new. The beeswarm plot, a type of scatter plot, is the latest experiment. This example shows the level of gender representation on the x-axis for all 257 municipal councils (2020 data).

Mangaung appears on the right, recording the highest level of representation with 86% of council seats held by women. Way on the left, Oudtshoorn Local Municipality in Western Cape had no women serving on its council.

The size of each dot represents the total number of councillors. Unsurprisingly, the eight metropolitan municipalities (in green) have the largest councils.

There were 9 895 councillors serving nation-wide in 2020. Of these, 4 052 (41%) were women. In aggregate, women were least represented in municipal councils across KwaZulu-Natal and Western Cape.

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
