

The new inflation basket is here


Stats SA has adjusted the product weights in the inflation basket. A product's weight represents its contribution to total household expenditure. A larger weight has more impact on the determination of the inflation rate.

Housing & utilities has the highest weight in the basket. This category includes municipal services, levies for sectional title complexes, actual rent paid by tenants and owners' equivalent rent. The new weight is 24,1%, slightly down from 24,5% in the 2019 weights.

The weight for food & non-alcoholic beverages increases to 18,2% from 17,1%. This means that South Africans are spending proportionally more on food products than they did in 2019.






