

## GDP growth subdued in the first quarter


The economy kept its head above water in the first three months of the year, expanding by a marginal 0,1%. Four of the ten industries on the production side of the economy recorded positive gains.

Agriculture increased by 15,8%, adding 0,4 of a percentage point to gross domestic product (GDP) growth. Good rains contributed to the industry's fortunes, with horticulture benefitting the most. Animal products also fared well.

Transport, storage & communication was the second-largest positive contributor, with gains recorded in land transport, air transport and transport support services.

Mining and manufacturing were the biggest drags. Together, both industries shaved 0,4 of a percentage point off GDP growth.






### South Africa's economy expanded by **0,1%** in the first quarter of 2025






- Real GDP was R1 170 billion in Q1:2025
- 2 Real GDP grew by 0,1% in Q1:2025 compared with Q4: 2024
- Four industries grew in Q1:2025, with agriculture recording the highest increase
- **Agriculture** lifted the primary sector in O1:2025
- All secondary sector industries weakened in Q1:2025
- Trade, transport and finance kept the tertiary sector afloat in Q1:2025
- Finance is the largest industry in the South African economy, contributing 24% to total value added
- Imports, exports and household consumption increased in Q1:2025
- Households increased spending on most products in Q1:2025, except for communication and recreation



## Provincial snapshot



## Unemployment rate up in six provinces

The unemployment rate increased in six of the nine provinces in the first quarter of 2025 compared with the fourth quarter of 2024.

The largest increases were recorded in KwaZulu-Natal (28,6% to 32,3%) and Eastern Cape (36,6% to 39,3%). There was no change for Western Cape and Free State. North West was the only province to register a decline (41,3% to 40,4%).

The chart shows provincial unemployment rates in the first quarter. North West had the highest official unemployment rate, followed by Eastern Cape and Free State. Western Cape and Northern Cape had the lowest.

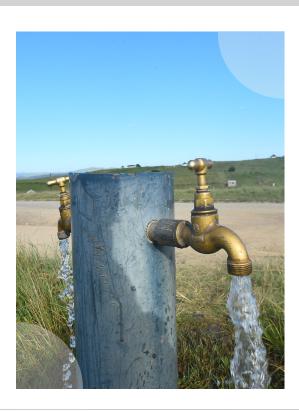


