Inflation for 2025 the lowest in 21 years

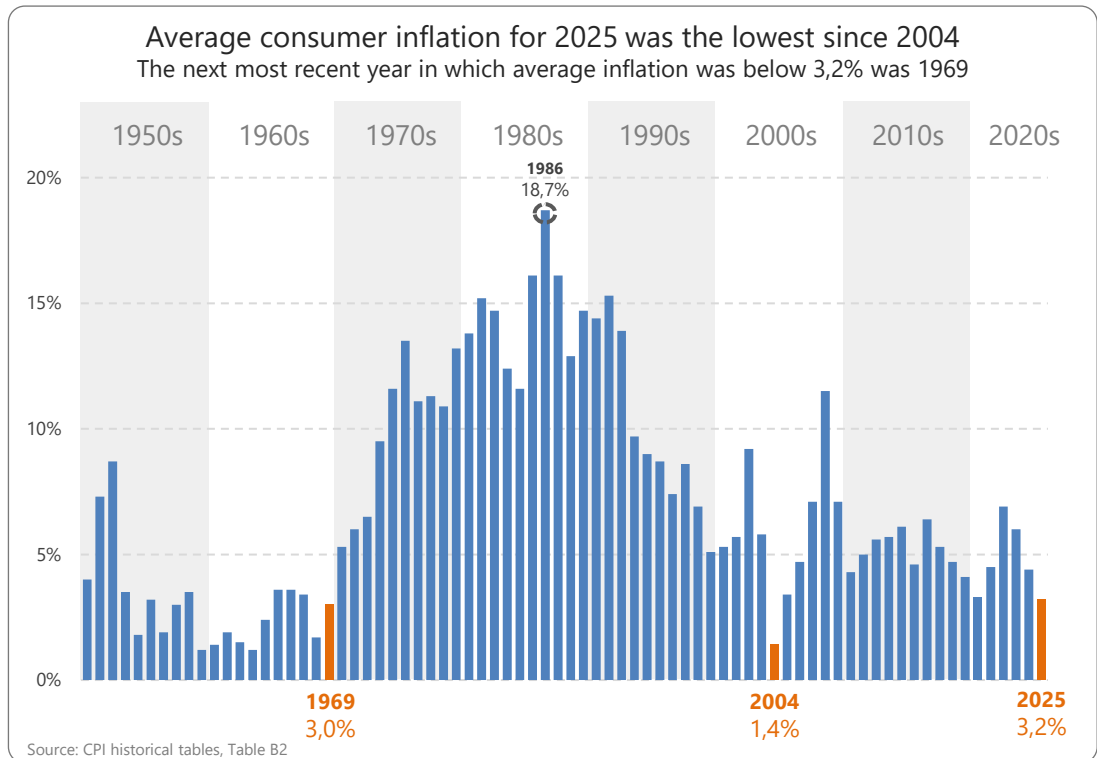
The December consumer price index (CPI) print concludes the results for the calendar year.

The average inflation rate for 2025 was 3,2%. This is the lowest rate in 21 years (since 2004) when it was 1,4%. The next most recent year that average inflation was lower than 3,2% was in 1969 (3,0%), 56 years ago.

Focusing on December, inflation for food and non-alcoholic beverages (NAB) was stable at 4,4%, unchanged from November

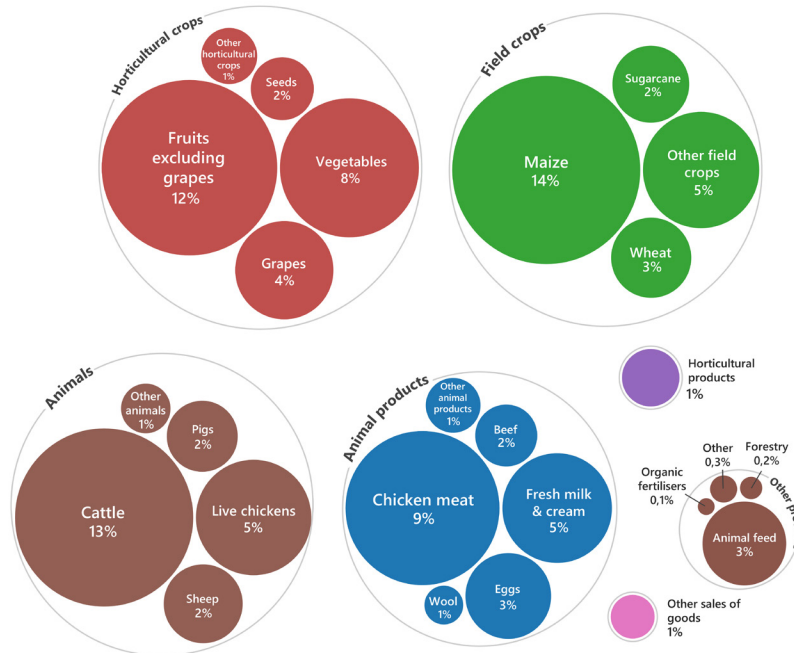
Meat inflation continued its upward trajectory, rising to 12,6% in December from 12,2% in November. The rate was -0,4% in December 2024, which shows how quickly meat inflation has accelerated over the year.

Tracing the roots of farming income

A healthy agricultural industry is vital to economic development, employment and food security. Stats SA's latest annual Agricultural Survey (2024) provides insight into the products that sustain the industry.

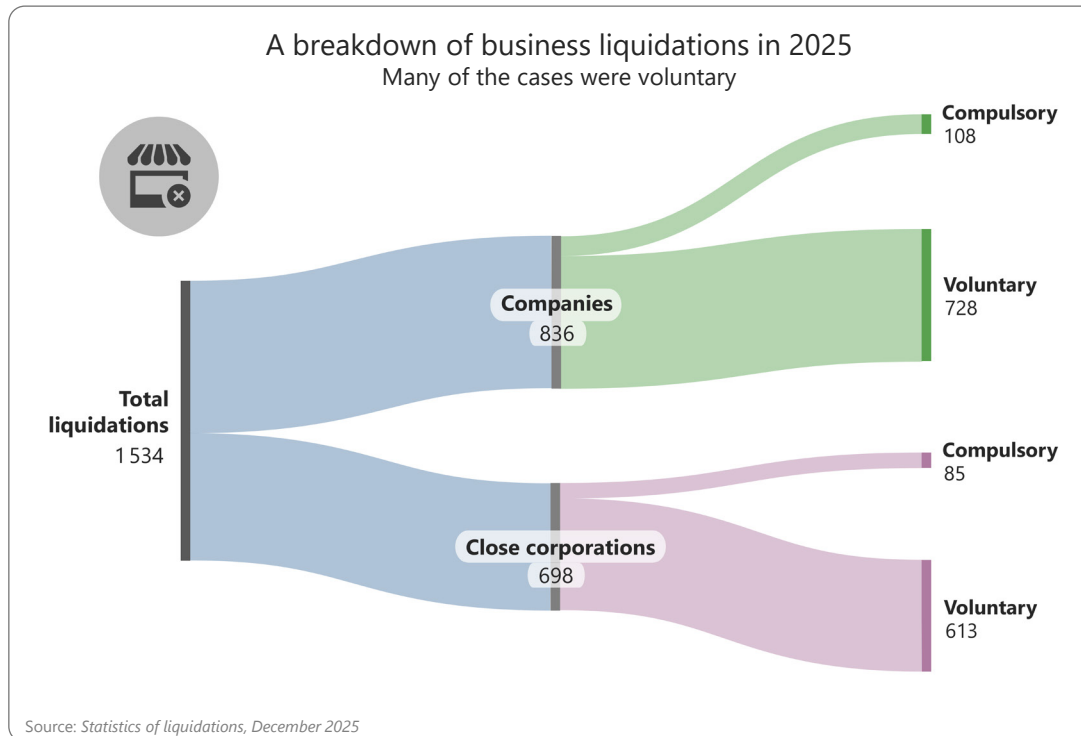
Horticultural crops accounted for the largest share of income from sales of goods in agriculture, at 27% of the total. The field crops category was the second most significant contributor (24%), followed by animals (23%) and animal products (20%).

The graphic shows the data at a more granular level, highlighting the most important products. Maize, cattle and fruits (excluding grapes) were the leading sources of income.

Vegetables were the second-leading horticultural crop, followed by grapes.

Liquidations decline in 2025

The latest data on business liquidations provides an overview of the calendar year. There were 1 534 liquidations in 2025, representing a decline of 17 cases compared with 2024.

Broken down by type of institution, 836 companies and 698 close corporations closed their doors in 2025.

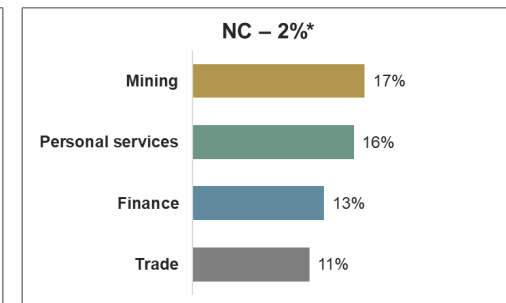
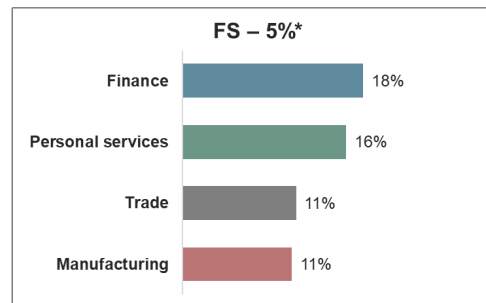
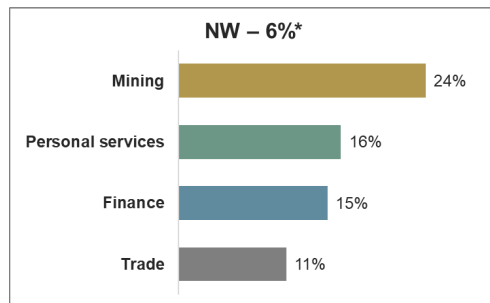
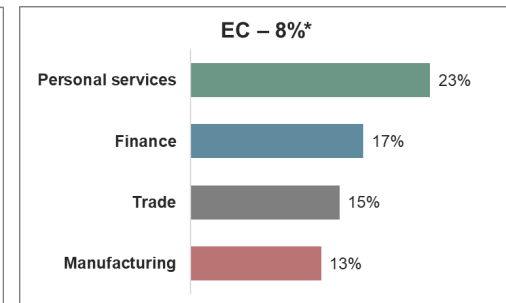
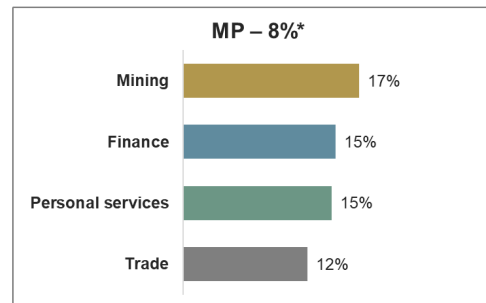
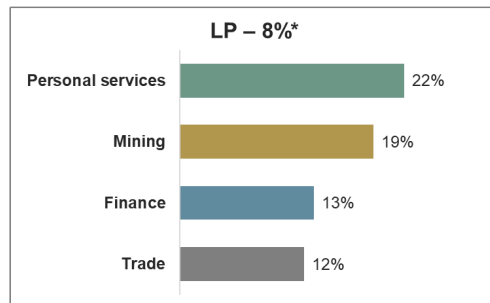
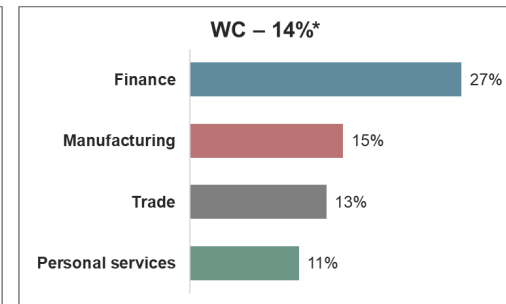
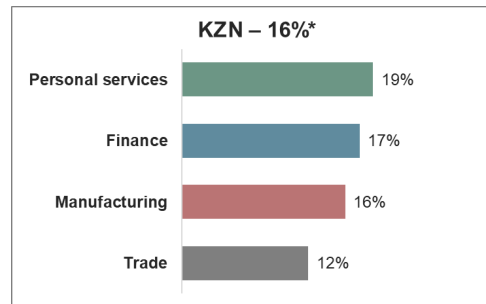
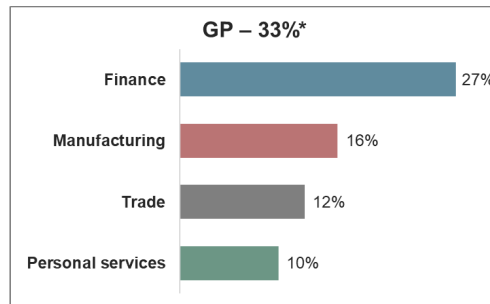
In total, there were 193 compulsory liquidations and 1 341 voluntary liquidations during the year.

The number of company closures declined by 15 cases in 2025 compared with 2024. The number of liquidations by close corporations declined by 2 cases over the same period.
